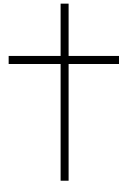

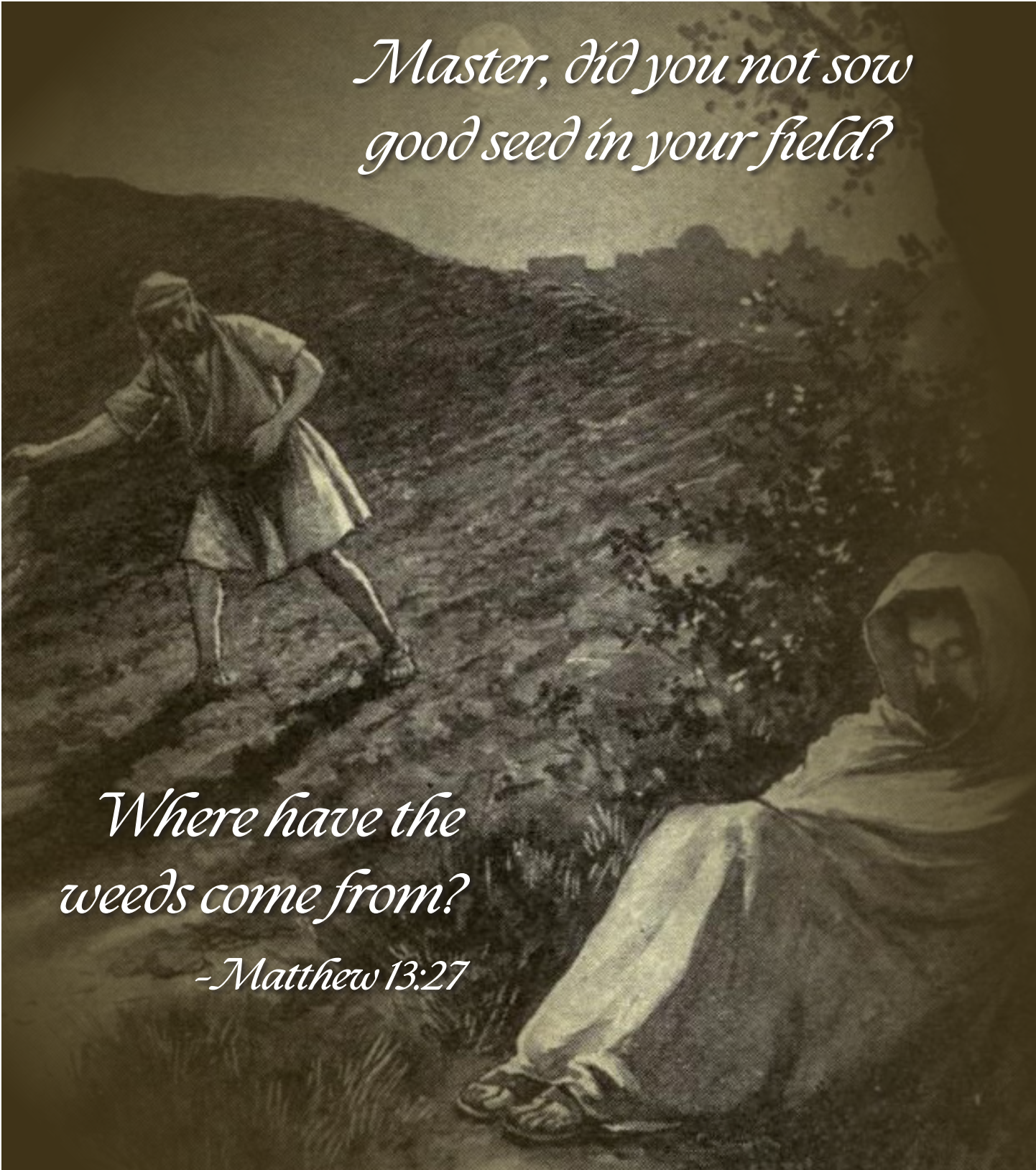

A Good Infection

The Kingdom Keeps Growing

Dear Friends:

When it comes to the sayings of Jesus, the more words He speaks, the fewer words we need to speak. This Sunday's Gospel contains one of His longest parables, and we do not have to guess at its meaning because Jesus explains it Himself. The good seed represents the children of the Kingdom. The weeds represent the children of the Evil One. The enemy who sowed them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age.

Many people today find this uncomfortable.

We live in a culture that often speaks of evil as if it were merely ignorance, bad systems, or unfortunate circumstances. Jesus certainly understood that people can be wounded, confused, and influenced by their environment. Yet He also speaks of something more. **He speaks of a real spiritual battle. He speaks of good and evil, truth and falsehood, God and the Evil One.**

That may sound old-fashioned to modern ears, but it actually explains the world better than many alternatives. Why do we see such incredible goodness and such shocking cruelty existing side by side? Why do we find generosity and selfishness, heroism and corruption, sometimes even within the same person? Jesus' answer is simple: wheat and weeds are growing together until the final harvest.

But notice that Jesus doesn't leave us focused on the weeds.

Immediately afterward, He tells the parable of the mustard seed. The Kingdom of God begins as something small and seemingly insignificant, yet it grows into something large enough for the birds of the sky to make their nests in its branches.

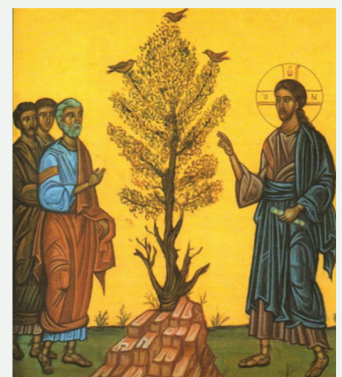
The great Christian writer C.S. Lewis once compared Christianity to a "good infection." It is an unusual image, but it captures something important. Christianity is not merely a set of ideas or an ideology. It is a living relationship with a living Person. It is something alive, and living things spread. That is a helpful analogy because it teaches us, as Peter Kreeft points out, several things.

First, Christianity is real and concrete. It is not merely a philosophy to be discussed or an opinion to be debated. At its heart is an encounter with the risen Jesus Christ.

Second, like a virus, Christianity is invisible to the naked eye. We cannot see grace, faith, hope, or charity, but we can certainly see their effects.

Third, Christianity is highly infectious. It spreads by contact—all kinds of contact: physical contact in deeds, mental contact in words, emotional contact in empathy, moral contact in good example, and aesthetic contact through beauty, art, literature, and music. Ideas are taught, but faith is often caught.

Fourth, Christianity grows because it is alive. What began with a handful of disciples in a remote corner of the Roman Empire has spread across the globe. From a tiny mustard seed has grown a vast tree.

Fifth, Christianity changes every part of your life. Nothing is safe from it. It is wild, not tame. It is a lion, not a kitten. It is dangerous to our comfort zones.

Sixth, Christianity has no limits. It expands wherever room is made for it. Like a fire, it spreads warmth and light far beyond its point of origin.

Jesus begins with weeds, but He ends with a mustard seed. He acknowledges the reality of evil, but He wants us to focus on something greater: the unstoppable growth of God's Kingdom. The weeds are real, but they do not have the final word. God's grace does. The mustard seed is still growing. The fire is still spreading. And every one of us is invited to become part of it.
