From your pastor: What we have achieved and what lies ahead

As we gather our reflections and accomplishments in this annual Parish Life Report, I am moved by the **profound sense of community and dedication** that permeates every aspect of our parish life. This past fiscal year, from July 2023 to June 2024, has been a **remarkable period** of growth, challenge, and deepened faith. In moments of sorrow, we have stood together at **89 funerals**, offering comfort and prayers for our departed brothers and sisters, affirming our hope in the resurrection.

This year also marked the **50th annual pasta dinner** hosted by the Holy Name Society, a cherished tradition that not only offers fellowship but also serves as a bridge connecting generations within our parish. Over **500 meals** were served, a testament to the enduring spirit of community and service that defines us.

As we navigated these and countless other moments, our **"Protect the Flock"** security initiative stood out by providing peace of mind, ensuring that our sacred spaces remain sanctuaries of peace and safety. Our engagement in the broader community through initiatives like **"Mass in the Neighborhood"** and substantial charitable efforts like **our food drives** and **Christmas Giving Trees** project have visibly extended our mission beyond the church walls, embodying the call to serve as Christ did.

Each number in this report tells a story of faith, hope, and love. They reflect your generous spirit and unwavering commitment to not only maintain



but grow the life of our parish in ways that honor God and serve our community.

HOW WE LIVED FOR OUR NEIGHBORS THROUGH SOCIAL OUTREACH:

- 1. Social Ministry Initiatives:** Our parish successfully collected over 1,400 lbs. of food, managed significant charitable drives like the Christmas Giving Trees, and supported local shelters with regular meal deliveries.
- 2. Holy Name Society Pasta Dinner:** Serving 500 meals both in-person and takeout, this event not only continued a cherished tradition but also supported our broader community engagement.

II. Stewardship

- 1. Protect the Flock Security Team:** We established a pioneering security program to ensure that our parish remains a safe space for worship and community activities.

2. Educational Achievements: Recognition at the HOPES Dinner celebrated our efforts in reversing the decline in academy enrollment, with Father Emmanuel honored for his leadership.

3. First Parish Dinner Club: Introduced this year, this event fostered deeper connections among parishioners through shared meals, music, and fellowship.

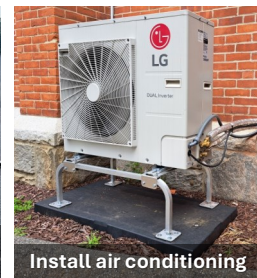
4. Capital Improvements: We enhanced our parish facilities by installing modern air conditioning systems in our churches, ensuring comfort and accessibility for all parishioners.

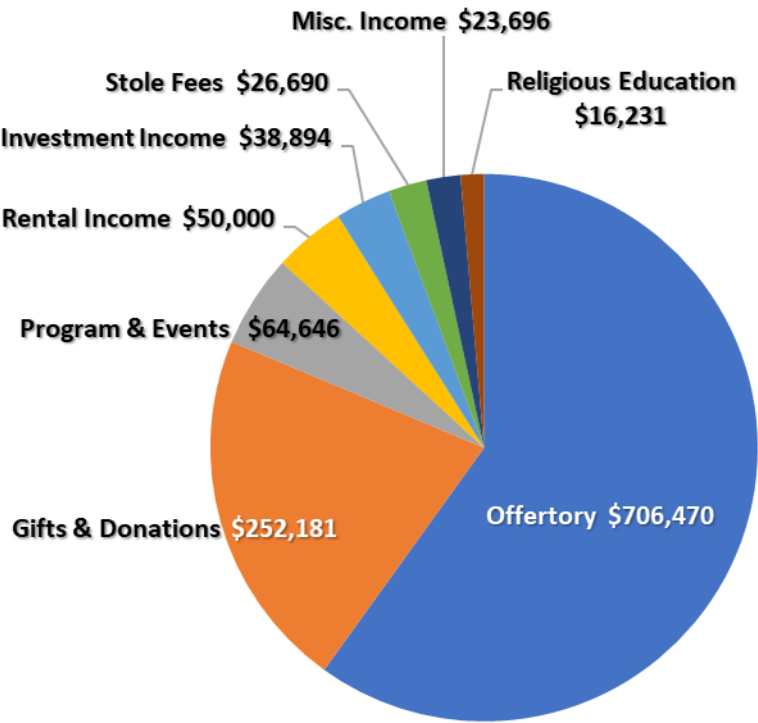

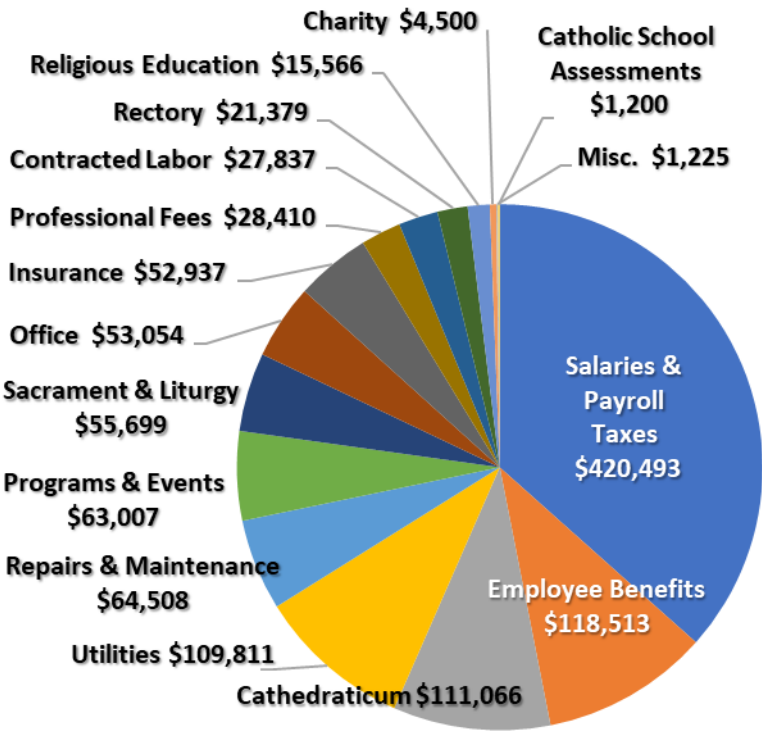
Fiscal Year 2024: July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024
