Key Highlights: Discipleship, Outreach, Stewardship

I. Discipleship & Outreach

How We Lived Out Our Faith for God

- **Sacramental Life:**
 - » 45 baptisms
 - » 34 First Communions (including 2 at the Easter Vigil)
 - » 26 Confirmations (17 at the Cathedral, 9 at the Easter Vigil)
 - » 6 convalidations and 2 marriages
- **Funeral Ministry:** 61 funeral Masses, 12 funeral home services, and 18 graveside prayers—serving 91 grieving families.

How We Lived for Our Neighbors

- **Homebound & Nursing Home Ministry:**
 - » 265 homebound visits by Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion
 - » 99 phone calls to the homebound
 - » 40 nursing home visits and 23 rosary services led by the Legion of Mary
- **Community Meals & Fellowship:**
Kevin's Place, Dinner Club, and parish societies provided food, fellowship, and service to many in our community.

II. Stewardship

- **School Support:** Our parish contributed **\$34,042** to St. John Paul the Great Academy, helping sustain Catholic education in Torrington.
- **Parish Ministries:** The Holy Name Society, Holy Rosary Society, and others continued cherished traditions of service, fundraising, and community building.
- **Capital Repairs & Maintenance:** **\$65,549** invested in essential upkeep across church, rectory, parish center, and school facilities.
- **Safety & Security:** Continued investment in security staffing and systems to ensure our worship sites remain safe and welcoming.



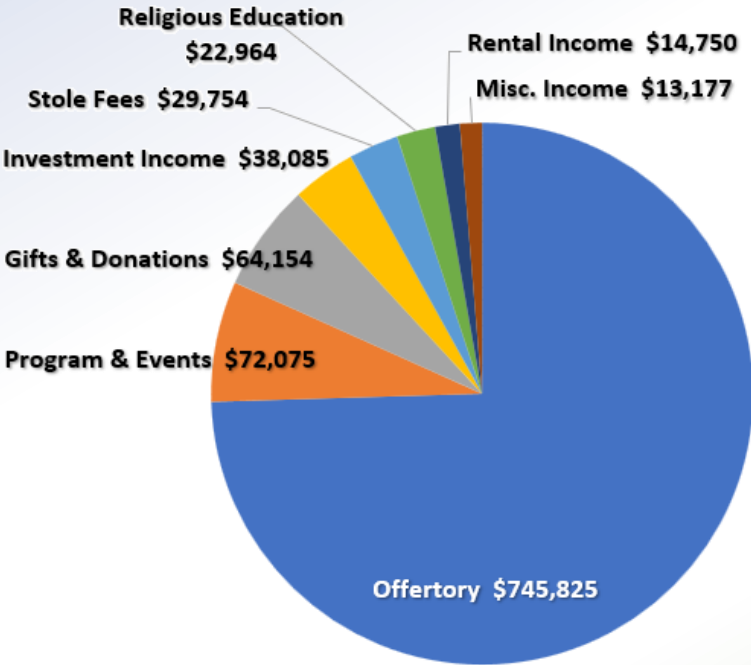
III. Financial Snapshot (FY 2024–2025)

- **Total Offertory:** **\$745,825** (above budget by \$39,125)
- **Operating Revenue:** **\$1,000,784** (slightly under plan)
- **Operating Expenses:** **\$1,128,975** (over budget by \$14,615)
- **Operating Result:** Deficit of **\$128,191** (budgeted deficit: \$108,035)
- **Final Net Revenue:** **+\$123,258** (helped by one-time state grant & investment gains—not sustainable for annual operations)
- **Parish Support to School:** **\$34,042**

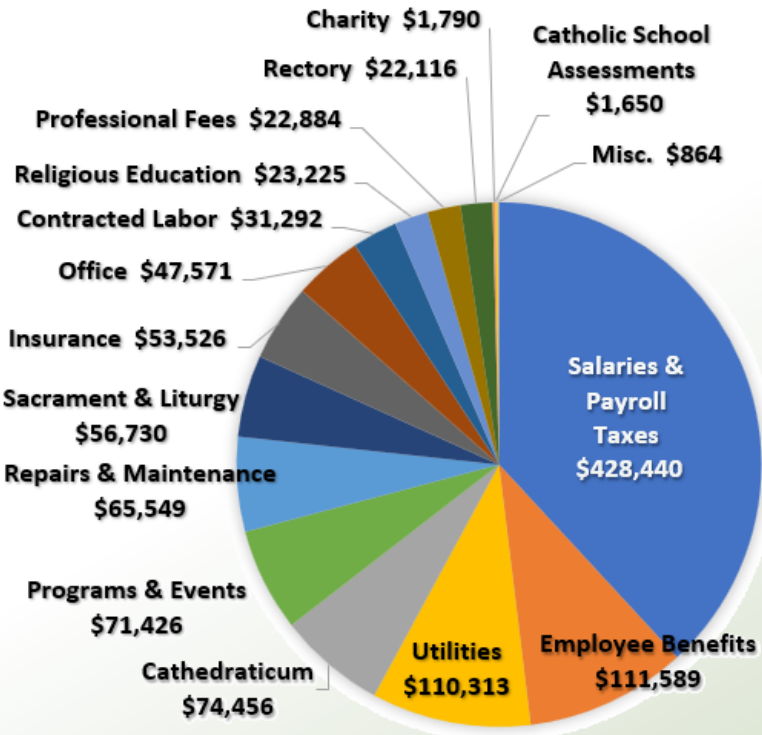
Fiscal Year 2025: July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025

IV. Current Challenges & Future Goals

Challenges:

- 1. **Loss of rental income** (\$50,000 shortfall) following departure of EdAdvance.
- 2. **Rising ministry and program costs**, especially in Religious Education.
- 3. **Engaging younger families** while serving our aging parishioner base.

Goals:

- 1. **Repurpose St. Peter School Space** or develop new sources of parish revenue.
- 2. **Expand youth and family ministry** to bring vitality to our parish life.
- 3. **Launch stewardship initiatives** encouraging recurring online giving and planned gifts.
- 4. **Continue capital upkeep** to ensure our buildings remain safe and welcoming.
- 5. **Capital Campaign for the 100th Anniversary of St. Peter's Church Building**
