\_\_\_\_\_ God's free gift of divine life in us, which was won for us by Jesus and which we receive especially through the sacraments. Like spiritual electricity for our souls, it empowers us to live out virtues.

\_\_\_\_\_ A strong habit of doing what is not good. Vices enslave us to sin and rob us of the power to love. Even small vices lead to other vices.

\_\_\_\_\_ Sacraments are visible signs of invisible realities that bring grace to our souls. Sacraments are administered through the Church.

\_\_\_\_\_ A strong habit of doing what is good. Virtue empowers us to love God and others freely. Virtues are expressed by how we live in our visible bodies.

\_\_\_\_\_ Also called Holy Communion, the Eucharist is the greatest sacrament because it is literally Jesus himself—Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. When the priest prays the Consecration at Mass, the bread and wine look the same but they become Jesus himself.

\_\_\_\_\_ Cardinal means "hinge," so the cardinal virtues—prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance—are like hinges that open the door to other natural virtues as well.

\_\_\_\_\_ The theological virtues are faith, hope, and love. "Theological" means these virtues are given to us by God and lead us to him.

\_\_\_\_\_ An action repeated so often that it becomes a natural part of a person's character.

\_\_\_\_\_ Also called Confession, the Sacrament of Reconciliation allows us to repent for our sins and have our souls wiped clean. Jesus is the one who absolves our sins; priests are his instruments in Confession. When we confess our sins to a priest, it is like talking directly to Jesus himself.
