Academic Eligibility Requirement for students living at BHSU Newman Center & Newman-Tulane apartment

In order to be considered eligible to reside at the BHSU Newman Center, a student must be officially registered as a student in good standing (minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA, and not on academic or disciplinary probation) during the year they live at the Center.

BHSU Newman Center Residence Life Responsibilities

To be able to offer a discounted housing rate compared to on-campus residence halls, the Newman Center asks residents to provide services to the building on a weekly basis to ensure general upkeep and cleanliness.

There are three main areas of responsibility: security, hospitality, & cleaning/maintenance

Security

- Ensuring doors are locked and unlocked at proper times
- Ensuring lights are turned off at night for energy conservation
- Ensuring all students utilizing the facility are following ground rules set for building use
- Ensuring that all students not residing in the building have left by midnight

Security Information

- Hours of operation for the center will be 7am to 10pm.
- At 7am, the two main hall doors & entry way doors should be unlocked.
- At 10pm the doors should be locked, and the only access will be through the key-coded alley entry door. Any person not residing in the building will need to leave by midnight.

Hospitality

- Assist with public events held in the Newman Center (not always JacketCatholic affiliated) if able
- A reliable presence in Newman Center events, activities, and liturgies.
- You will become a face of JacketCatholic leadership - held by your peers as an example of a student striving to live out their faith.
- Please keep this in mind, not just within the Newman Center, but in your example that you set anywhere on campus.

Maintenance and Cleaning (Differs depending on NC residency or Tulane residency)

Failure to complete weekly cleaning & maintenance responsibilities will result in a \$30/week fine. Repeat offenses will result in meeting with Newman leadership & potential loss of residency or increased housing fees.

Newman Center residents

*****You will have a weekly cleaning list that may include these tasks below (rotating assignments):**

- Take out trash
- Clean bathrooms
- Vacuum
- Sweep and Mop all hard floor surfaces
- Clean windows
- Dusting
- Maintaining cleanliness of public conference rooms & lounge areas
- Clean kitchen
- Clean chapel

Newman-Tulane extension Apartment

- LATE-FALL, WINTER: Snow removal & salting sidewalks around the Newman Center by 7:30am (when applicable)
- SPRING, SUMMER, EARLY FALL: Weekly lawn maintenance (mowing, raking leaves, etc)

Newman Center & Newman-Tulane Apartment Residency Costs

Newman Center Double Residency

Suite-style room with two occupants (same-sex) & an adjoining bathroom

- SUMMER 2026 TERM: \$450 + \$200 refundable deposit for summer (late May-early August)
- FALL 2026/SPRING 2027 TERM: \$600/semester + \$200 refundable deposit

Newman-Tulane Extension Apartment (MALE ONLY)

Three bed/2 bath apartment

- SUMMER, FALL 2026, SPRING 2027: \$425/month rent

Estimated Cost Breakdown:

\$10/hour for work done

Number of hours of work on chores estimated each week: 15 hours

Total pay \$150 per week or \$600 per month

The cost to live on campus in a residence hall is \$2475 per semester for a double similar to the ones available in the Newman Center, bringing the total to \$4950 per academic year. This comes out to about \$600 per MONTH to live in campus housing without chores. By working ~15 hours a week on Newman responsibilities in exchange for \$600 per SEMESTER housing fees, you will completely offset your housing costs.
