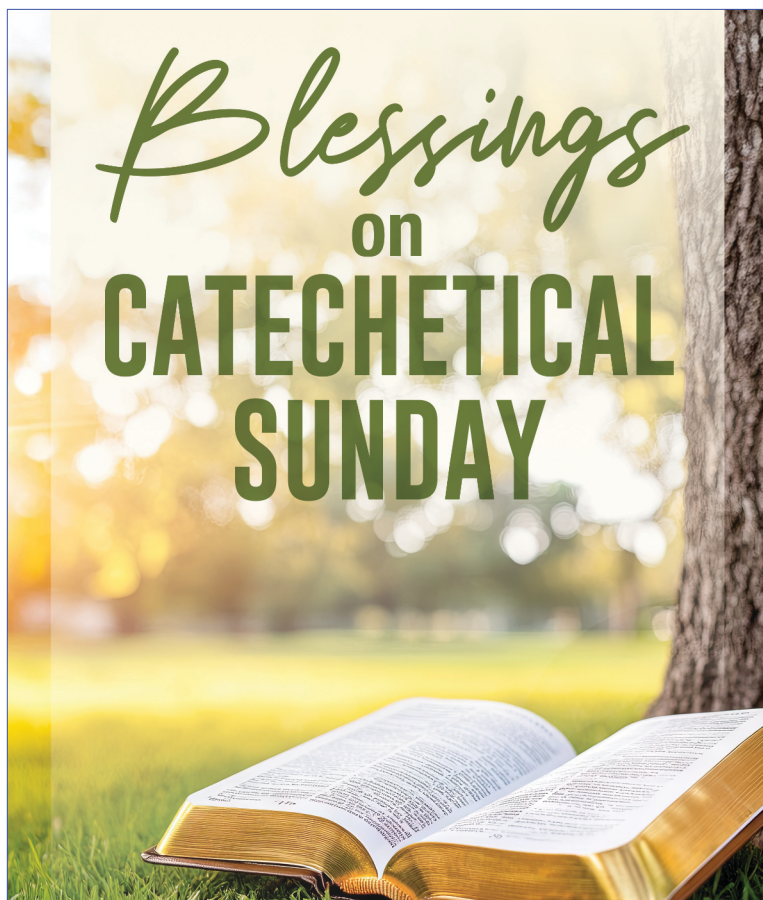

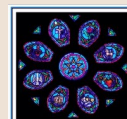

Sacraments of Healing: The Anointing of the Sick

Grace, Strength, and Peace in Times of Illness

Two of the Seven Sacraments are sacraments of healing: the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** (also called Confession or Penance) and the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**. Although at one time it was called and practiced as “extreme unction” (the final anointing) when a person was near death, the Second Vatican Council in its reforms restored the Sacrament of Anointing to its original purpose, that of healing. No longer merely a preparation for death, it is a gift of Christ for those facing serious weakness or illness. Through the prayer of the Church and anointing with blessed oil, Christ provides grace, strength, peace, and courage to the person whose health is seriously compromised. The sacrament unites the sick person more closely to Christ’s Passion, offers forgiveness of sins when sacramental confession is not possible, and always provides healing in some way, though not always physical healing. Emotional and mental healing can come through the sacrament, the healing of acceptance and serenity in the face of serious or chronic illness, and sometimes even healing in relationships with estranged family or friends can occur.

Scriptural Roots

The sacrament is rooted in Jesus’ ministry of compassion and healing. The Gospels repeatedly show him drawing near to the sick, touching them, forgiving sins, and restoring them to life within the community. Jesus also sent the Twelve to share in this ministry: “They anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them” (Mark 6:13). The clearest New Testament witness appears in the Letter of James: “Are any among you sick? They should call for the presbyters of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord” (James 5:14–15).

Who May Receive the Sacrament?

Any baptized Catholic who has reached the age of reason may receive the sacrament and need not be at the point of death. In fact, family members and caregivers are encouraged to call for the sacrament early in the illness, ideally while the person receiving it is still conscious and may participate and find comfort in the prayers and anointing. In my experience, when family members, not wishing to “alarm” or “scare” their loved one, wait until the illness has progressed to a point where the person may no longer be conscious and able to participate in the prayers, they do a great disservice to the sick person. Not only is the sick person deprived of the comfort the sacrament offers, but if they had desired to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and now are no longer able to speak, they may not gain the peace that Reconciliation might have brought them in the face of death. The other danger in waiting, is that with fewer priests, a priest may not be available to come right away to offer the sacrament in time prior to a person’s passing.

Whenever seriously ill (physically or mentally), experiencing long-term or chronic illness, facing the weakness that may come from aging, or preparing for surgery, the sacrament may be requested and received. It may be received again if the person recovers and later becomes seriously ill, or if the same illness worsens. Children may also receive it provided they have sufficient understanding to be comforted and strengthened by the sacrament. It should not however be received “routinely” if one is not seriously ill, nor is it administered to someone who is certainly dead. Instead, the priest offers the prayers after death for the deceased.

How the Sacrament is Administered

Only a bishop or priest may validly administer the Anointing of the Sick using the Oil of the Sick that has been blessed by the bishop at the Chrism Mass. (If for some reason, this oil is not available, the ritual provides a blessing the priest/bishop may use over any available oil). The priest lays hands on the sick person in silence, prays in faith, and anoints the forehead and hands while saying the Church’s sacramental formula, asking the Lord through his loving mercy to help the person with the grace of the Holy Spirit, free the person from sin, save them, and raise them up. In necessity, a single anointing on the forehead or another suitable part of the body is sufficient, with the complete formula.

The sacrament may be celebrated at home, in a hospital or care facility, or in church, either for one person or communally for several eligible persons. When circumstances permit, it is preceded by the Sacrament of Reconciliation and followed by Holy Communion; for the dying, Communion received as *Viaticum* is the final sacrament of Christian passage. Whatever the setting, the Church does not promise a miraculous cure. Rather, she entrusts the sick person to the crucified and risen Lord, confident that no suffering is faced alone and that Christ’s grace can bring forgiveness, endurance, hope, and peace.

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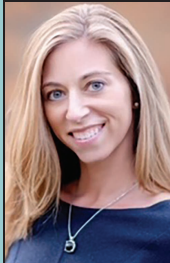


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
