WEEKLY REFLECTION

“Convert!”

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We're already on the third Sunday of Lent, halfway to Easter. That's why today's various readings revolve around the call to conversion. For example: **“If you do not convert, you will perish like them.”** On this Sunday, we also share in the suffering of our brothers and sisters who live their daily lives with illness. In this jubilee month dedicated to them, we want to associate them with Christ's suffering during those forty days in the desert. The call to conversion is for everyone.

Only one thing is certain: God is love. He is not a heartless avenger of justice.

We see this in the first reading: he has seen the misery of his people and calls upon Moses to free them. The same God sees all the misfortunes that afflict men, women and children today; and he continues to call on us to build a fairer, more fraternal world, a world open to sharing and welcoming others. Our God recognizes himself in the suffering, the hungry, the stranger, the sick. Through the poor, it is Jesus whom we welcome or reject: as he himself tells us: **“Whenever you did it to the least of these, you did it to me.” (Mt 25)**

It's an urgent call for us in this Lenten season. We must take Jesus' words very seriously: **“If you do not convert, you will perish like them.”** No, it's not a threat, it's not God who's going to make us perish; it's us who're going to our ruin. That's why Christ urges us not to put off our conversion until tomorrow. Death can happen unexpectedly.

Jesus develops his teaching by telling us the story of the fig tree that bears no fruit. For three years, the tree has not produced a single fig, and is in danger of being cut down. The winegrower asks for a year's delay so that he can give the fig tree the care it needs to produce fruit. Today, we are that fig tree, the pride and joy of our Master. ***Our God is impatient to give us the best of Himself, but He shows great patience when He awaits the return of His lost children.***

On March 9, we entered the season of Lent. The Lord has been eagerly awaiting this period. His only desire is to enter our hearts and reign there. We are going to allow him to do so by opening the door of our hearts to him. He wants it even more than we do. When men, women and children come back to God, when they rediscover prayer and the sacraments, when they begin to share with the most needy, Lent is a real moment of happiness for Him.

Blessed are you for your love, your patience, your mercy. May we hear your calls to convert and turn to you... Amen.

O Virgin Mary, Health of the sick you who accompanied Jesus on the way to Calvary and who remained at the foot of the cross where your Son died by participating intimately in his sufferings, welcome our sufferings and unite them with his so that the seeds sown during the Jubilee continue to produce abundant fruits during the coming years.

Very tender mother, we address You. Obtain us from your Son to be able to return to our occupations soon, after a complete recovery to make ourselves useful to others through our work. For now, stay with us at the time of the test and help us to repeat every day with You our yes, sure that God will know how to get a much greater out of trouble.

Immaculate Virgin, let the fruits of the Jubilee Year be for us and for those who are dear to us the pledge of a renewed momentum in our Christian life, so that we may find the abundance of God's mercy in the contemplation of the Face of the risen Christ, as well as the joy of a more total communion with the brothers, the beginnings of the endless joy of Heaven.

Sacrament of Infant Baptism: Infant Baptisms will take place on the **Fourth Sunday** of every month, parents and god-parents must attend two pre-baptismal classes prior to the Baptism. Please register your child.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Classes: RCIA is the journey of faith by which interested persons become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The program instructs adults to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. Catechesis

Question of the week: Why go to confession during Lent?

Lent is a privileged time to readjust our hearts to the Lord. In the sacrament of reconciliation, we acknowledge our sins and welcome his mercy. Lent is a time of conversion, during which the Lord wants to help us come to terms with the truth about our lives, the better to make ourselves available to God's saving love. We are therefore recommended to go to confession at least once before Easter.

What is the sacrament of reconciliation?

The sacrament of reconciliation is a sign of God's infinite love. God's forgiveness is always possible, if we make a truly sincere effort. By acknowledging that we are sinners, we believe that God's infinite love is always the strongest. Dialogue with a priest is an effective sign of reconciliation with God and with our brothers and sisters.

God's forgiveness is expressed in the words of the priest: "May God our Father show you his mercy; by the death and resurrection of his Son he reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins: through the ministry of the Church may he give you forgiveness and peace."

The forgiveness of our sins is not something we can give to ourselves. I can't say, 'I forgive myself my sins'. Forgiveness has to be asked, it has to be asked of someone else, and in confession we ask Jesus for his forgiveness. Forgiveness is not the fruit of our own efforts, but a gift from the Holy Spirit, who fills us in the regenerating bath of mercy and grace that flows unceasingly from the wide-open heart of the crucified and risen Christ.

The priests of our parish are available to welcome us for confession during this Lenten season, and even more so during the days scheduled for confession. Don't hesitate, God's grace is abundant.

CCC No 1428: Christ's call to conversion continues to resound in the lives of Christians. This second conversion is an uninterrupted task for the whole Church, which "encloses sinners in its own bosom" and is therefore "both holy and called to purify itself, constantly pursuing its effort of penance and renewal" (LG 8). This effort at conversion is not just a human endeavor. It is the movement of the "contrite heart" (Ps 51:19), drawn and moved by grace (cf. Jn 6:44; 12:32) to respond to the merciful love of God, who first loved us (cf. 1 Jn 4:10).

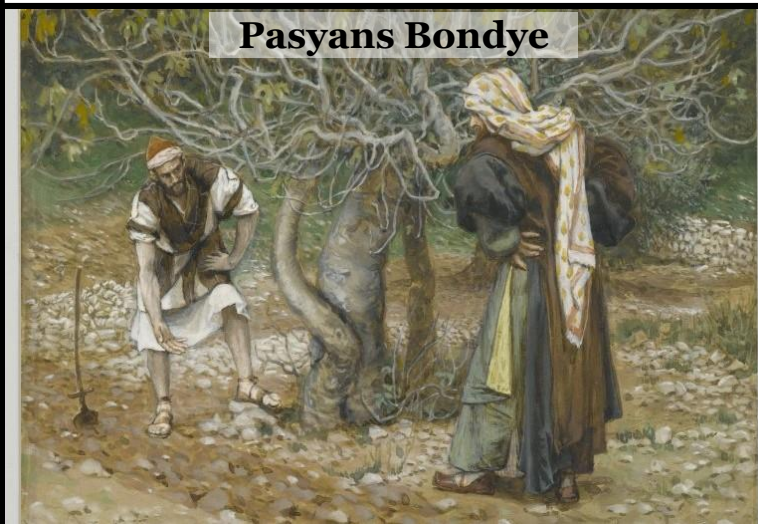
