CLASSROOM PROJECT REACHING FINAL PHASE

Through the generosity of Cathedral School alumni, we have been able to renovate fourteen classrooms over the past few years! Each classroom is equipped with new lighting, flooring, countertops, cabinet facing, paint, and SMART Boards or SMART Projectors.

This school year we are working on updating the lighting in the remaining Middle School Classrooms in order to utilize a Focus on Energy Grant. We are working with our contractors to purchase the countertops for the remaining classrooms and install as their schedule will allow.

Going forward we will be increasing access points for our 1:1 technology, upgrading technology where needed throughout the school, and continuing to work on the infrastructure. The needs of a 70 year old school are always present!

THIRD GRADE, SAINTS IN THE MAKING!



One of the most beloved Cathedral School traditions is the Third Grade Saints who lead our All Saints Day Mass. In class, the students learn about what makes a saint. They research and write a paper about their saint, then dress as that saint for Mass. The students do a beautiful job as lectors at Mass!

Cathedral School Endowment Fund

This is an Endowment Fund. The purpose of the Cathedral School Endowment Fund is restricted to the long term financial support of the Cathedral School's operational needs. Monies from this Fund may be withdrawn through the Cathedral School's annual process or as determined by the Rector with the advice and input from the Principal and the Finance Council.

Cathedral School: Tuition Assistance Fund

The purpose of this Tuition Assistance Fund is to offer financial relief to families who desire to send their children to Cathedral School and require assistance with the cost of tuition. This Fund is specifically restricted to tuition assistance, and is expended at the discretion of the Principal of Cathedral School with the prior consent of the Rector.

Cathedral School: Technology Fund

The purpose of the Technology Fund is restricted to support the technology resources utilized at Cathedral School. This includes technology infrastructure and updating resources such as computers, laptops, tablets, smart boards, and interactive digital technology. Monies from this Fund are authorized by the Principal and can be expended through the annual budget process or by the Rector.
