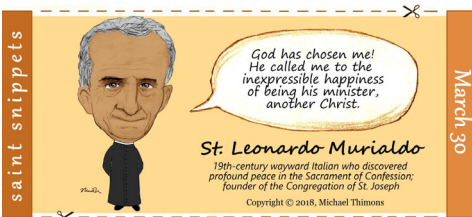

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER DAVIS

In his kindness and mercy, he was actually warning them about the risk of squandering their lives.

Not only were there some of the Pharisees and Scribes, but numerous people of Jesus' day who had a faulty outlook about the consequences of sin. There was a prevalent circle of thought at the time that suggested that when bad events and physical harm would happen to a person, it must have been triggered by the personal sin of that individual; in other words, they deserved the tragedy.

For example, as today's Gospel reading indicates, there were some who thought that, when the 18 people we killed when the Tower of Siloam fell on them, the catastrophe surely indicated that these people had committed some grievous sin; the tower falling on them was a sort of divine retribution or consequence for the sin committed. This sort of thinking would be akin to the claim that those who died in the recent bridge collapse or plane crashes somehow deserved this horrible tragedy as their punishment for personal sin. This, of course, is a preposterous way of thinking. Taken to the extreme, it may lead some to think that they must be "OK," because nothing bad has happened to them (yet)! An unfortunate spiritual arrogance or superiority complex could easily then be developed, leaving the one with such thoughts missing the whole point of life and of Jesus' teachings. They would be living in perpetual state of fear, waiting for the other shoe to drop, risking the squandering of their lives.

Today's Gospel passage challenges everyone to repent, forsake personal sin, and embrace a chosen change as evidence of spiritual health. We are not just mere victims of life and its circumstances. To think of life this way would be very superstitious, worrisome, and leading us to see life in frightful terms, always looking over our shoulders for something bad to happen. But Jesus announces another way to interpret

our lives. He reveals to us another way to live. He invites each of us to take personal responsibility for our decisions, our human effectiveness, and our spiritual health. He challenges his hearers, therefore, to repent, to individually choose to forsake personal sin. This is what conversion and salvation are all about. Stated colloquially, "don't be dead weight!" Either produce good fruit on the fig tree with the precious time you have been given, or risk the squandering of life. In short, today's Gospel should evoke in us a new resolve to do whatever is required to bear fruit that will endure. After all, why wouldn't we want to maximize our God-given potential? Why wouldn't we want to live in the freedom of the sons and daughters of God, rather than under the yoke of superstition and fear? A spiritual vision of life is, thus, needed this Lent. We are invited to live under the providential grace of the Lord, to be co-creators, architects of a fruitful life to the glory of God. Sitting around on our hands and waiting for the next bad thing to happen will only keep us in a perpetual depressed state. So much time would be wasted. Spiritual initiative is needed, lest we squander the precious gift of life.

I once read a poem whose truth has stuck with me for years. "We walk this path but once, so make of it what you will. Climb the mountains; see the coasts; live and be blessed. And do leave good footprints behind, for we only walk this path but once, my dear one."

Yes; the decision to repent and pursue holiness, and placing God at the center of our lives, helps us to do just that. It comes with the invitation to a relationship, the blessing of a covenant, of a land flowing with milk and honey, and promise of life. May this Lenten season help us to say "no" to the slothful inertia that will only squander the precious gift of life.



DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PADRE DAVIS

En su amabilidad y misericordia, en realidad les estaba advirtiendo sobre el riesgo de desperdiciar sus vidas.

No solo había algunos de los fariseos y escribas, sino también muchas personas en los días de Jesús que tenían una visión errónea de las consecuencias del pecado. Hubo una línea de pensamiento prevaleciente en ese momento que sugería que cuando los eventos adversos y los daños físicos le ocurrían a una persona, debían haber sido provocados por el pecado personal de ese individuo; en otras palabras, merecían la tragedia.

Por ejemplo, como lo indica la lectura del Evangelio de hoy, hubo algunos que pensaron que, cuando las 18 personas que se mataron cuando la Torre de Siloé cayó sobre ellos, la catástrofe seguramente indicó que estas personas habían cometido algún pecado grave; la torre que caía sobre ellos era una especie de retribución o consecuencia divina por el pecado cometido. Este tipo de pensamiento sería similar a la afirmación de que aquellos que murieron en el reciente colapso del puente o en los accidentes de aviones de alguna manera merecían esta horrible tragedia como su castigo por el pecado personal. Esto, por supuesto, es una forma absurda de pensar. Llevado al extremo, puede llevar a algunos a pensar que deben de estar "bien", ¡porque no les ha pasado nada malo (aún)! Desafortunadamente una arrogancia espiritual o un complejo de superioridad podrían entonces desarrollarse fácilmente, dejando a uno con tales pensamientos perdiendo todo el punto de la vida y las enseñanzas de Jesús. Estarían viviendo en un estado de miedo perpetuo, esperando que caiga el otro zapato, arriesgando el despilfarro de sus vidas.

El pasaje del Evangelio de hoy nos desafía a todos a arrepentirnos, a abandonar el pecado personal y a aceptar un cambio como evidencia de salud espiritual. No somos simples víctimas de la vida y sus circunstancias. Pensar de la vida de esta manera sería muy supersticioso, preocupante y nos llevaría a ver la vida en términos terribles, siempre mirando por encima de nuestros hombros a que algo malo suceda.

Pero Jesús anuncia otra manera de interpretar nuestras vidas. Nos revela otra forma de vivir. Él nos invita a cada uno de nosotros a asumir la responsabilidad personal de nuestras decisiones, nuestra efectividad humana y nuestra salud espiritual. Él desafía a sus oyentes, por lo tanto, a arrepentirse, a elegir individualmente a abandonar el pecado personal. De esto se trata la conversión y la salvación. Dicho coloquialmente, "¡no seas peso muerto!" O bien, produce buenos frutos en la higuera con el tiempo valioso que te han dado, o arriesga el despilfarro de la vida. En resumen, el Evangelio de hoy debe evocar en nosotros una determinación nueva de hacer todo lo necesario para dar frutos que perduren. Después de todo, ¿por qué no queremos maximizar nuestro potencial dado por Dios? ¿Por qué no queremos vivir en la libertad de los hijos e hijas de Dios, en lugar de estar bajo el yugo de la superstición y el miedo? Una visión espiritual de la vida es, pues, necesaria esta Cuaresma. Estamos invitados a vivir bajo la gracia providencial del Señor, a ser co-creadores, arquitectos de una vida fructífera para la gloria de Dios. Sentados sobre nuestras manos y esperando a que suceda la próxima cosa mala solo nos mantendrá en un estado de depresión perpetua. Se perdería tanto tiempo. La iniciativa espiritual es necesaria, para que no desperdiciemos el precioso don de la vida.

Una vez leí un poema cuya verdad se ha mantenido conmigo durante años. "Caminamos por este camino, solo una vez, así que hazlo como quieras. Sube a las montañas; mira las costas; vive y se bendecido. Y deja huellas buenas atrás, ya que solo recorreremos este camino, solo una vez, mi querido".

Sí; La decisión de arrepentirnos y buscar la santidad, y colocar a Dios en el centro de nuestras vidas, nos ayuda a hacer precisamente eso. Viene con la invitación a una relación, la bendición de un pacto, de una tierra que fluye leche y miel, y una promesa de vida. Que esta temporada de Cuaresma nos ayude a decir "no" a la inercia perezosa que solo desperdiciará el regalo precioso de la vida.

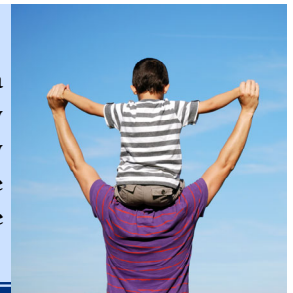
NEXT BUS TRIP AT CAPACITY!
