



Sue Ann (Roberts Wojczynski) Snyder, age 75 of Manistee, Michigan, died Wednesday evening, June 9, 2021 at Spectrum Health Butterworth Hospital in Grand Rapids, Michigan. She was born on October 10, 1945 in Grand Rapids, Michigan, the daughter of the late Joseph and Esther (Jaworski) Wojczynski.
