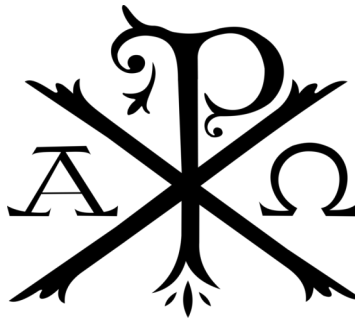

WELCOME, FATHER PHILIP!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am grateful to God for the opportunity to serve Holy Child parish. As I begin this new assignment, I would like to share a little about my vocation and journey of faith.

My vocation to the priesthood began when I was 18 years old. I entered the minor seminary in Chennai, India, where I spent one year discerning God's call. I then continued my religious formation in the Kingston Jamaica, West Indies. After two years, I returned to India to recruit young men for our religious order. This ministry required careful discernment, and by God's grace, many of those candidates faithfully answered His call. Today, some serve as religious brothers and others as priests. I was also privileged to assist in the formation of candidates preparing for religious life and the priesthood.

During this time, I participated in building homes for the poor in the ghettos of Kingston, Jamaica also caring for dying destitutes. The work often placed us in dangerous situations where our lives were at risk, yet I experienced God's constant protection and providence.

Later, I was sent back to India to establish our religious order's first mission there alongside another West Indian priest. Because I was familiar with the language and culture, I was entrusted with leading the mission during its early years.

Eventually, my superiors discerned that God was calling me not to remain a religious brother but to continue

toward the priesthood. I began my priestly formation in Kingston, Jamaica, and completed my theological studies in Ottawa, Canada. I was ordained to the priesthood on March 28, 1998.

My first priestly assignment was in Cap-Haïtien, Haiti. There, with the grace of God and the support of many generous people, we renewed the mission by improving roads, providing clean water, introducing solar electricity, establishing a reliable food supply with assistance from organizations abroad, including the United States, and expanding educational opportunities for children.

From Haiti, I was sent to Kampala, Uganda, where I established a new formation house for religious brothers and helped build two homes for the dying destitute. By God's grace, the funding needed for these projects was secured, allowing this ministry of compassion to become a reality.

Through these years of missionary service, I gradually realized that God was calling me to dedicate myself more fully to the ministry of administering the sacraments and caring for God's people. While many important works can be carried out by others, the priest has the unique privilege and responsibility of celebrating the Eucharist, celebrating the sacrament of penance, anointing the sick, and accompanying people throughout every stage of life.

For the past 24 years, I have been blessed to serve in the United States in several parish assignments in the Diocese of Scranton. Along the way, I have experienced the joys and challenges of parish life, including parish consolidations and the changing needs of the Church. My years in the missions and in parish ministry have left me with many blessings, valuable experiences, and a few scars that have strengthened my faith and deepened my trust in God's providence.

As I begin this new assignment, I humbly ask for your prayers, understanding, and support. Together, let us join hands in building a vibrant parish community rooted in faith, hope, and love. May we work together as one family in Christ so that God's will may be accomplished among us.

I look forward to getting to know each of you and walking with you on our journey of faith.

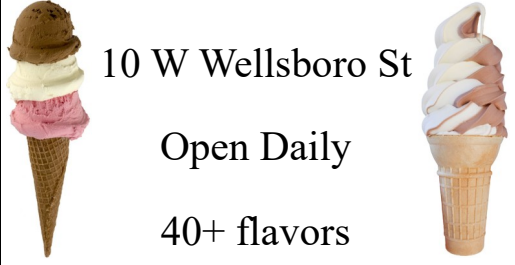
