

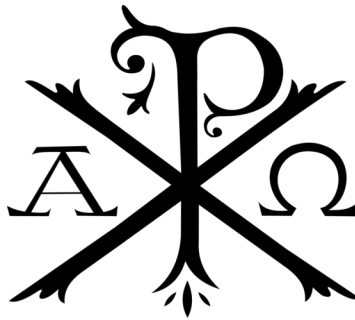

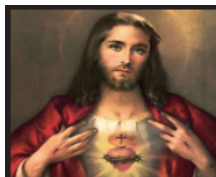

Core Themes of the Study

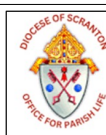
Innate Human Dignity: *Explores the truth that a person's worth

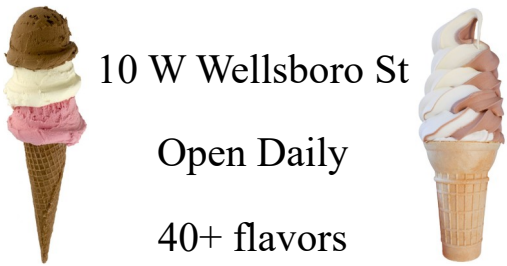
