A Message From Fr Nate

Welcome to the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time!

Today's second reading from Romans Chapter 5 is another reading from scripture breaking open the Good News of the Gospel, also known as the Kerygma. This scripture is a shortened version of the Good News message as compared to the four key words from the Rescue Project, by Fr. John Riccard; CREATED, CAPTURED, RESCUED, and RESPONSE.

The beginning word, CREATED and the ending word, RESPONSE are skipped over in this reading. How God CREATED the world and of all that He created, you and I are His most loved creatures. Then what is our RESPONSE to God sending Jesus taking on all our sin, saving us from death, opening heaven for us to live forever with God as a His Son or Daughter? Our response is of thanksgiving and joy for God's gift of Jesus Christ.

The reading directs us specifically towards CAPTURED and RESCUED.

Captured is that moment when Satan, as a serpent deceived Adam and Eve in the Garden to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil by placing doubt in their minds that God is not giving them everything. This is the one tree God prohibited Adam and Eve to eat from.

We are Rescued with the coming of Jesus. Jesus, also God, is sent by God the Father, through the Holy Spirit in flesh, born of a woman to save/rescue us, God's most loved creature, from the grasp of Satan since the sin of Adam and Eve.

A couple of verses in the reading to reflect on the gift that Jesus is for us:

"Through one man sin entered the world, and through sin, death, and thus death came to all men, inasmuch as all sinned... even over those who did not sin. But the gift is not like the transgression... how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many."

Key words, "even over those who did not sin," experienced death after the sin of Adam. Jesus rescued those that were faithful to God to restore their relationship with God.

"But the gift is not like the transgression..." The gift is not held back by God due to the degree of our individual sin, "God's grace through the gracious gift of one man, Jesus Christ overflow for the many." The final catch word here is at the end: many. This verse does not say "all," because we need to have a repentant heart from our sin. Having relationship with the Love of God and Love of neighbor without the barrier of sin. I know this is hard at times, yet God desires for you to be with Him in heaven. Seek God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, prayer, reflection or meditation, begin with scriptures from one of the Gospels, then listen for God during a time of reflection or meditation to lead you. In other words, begin your RESPONSE to the gift God sent into the world through Mother Mary... Jesus.
