With everything we got: Today's Gospel presents an invitation from Jesus: to place Him at the center of our lives. The words Jesus chooses in this gospel passage sound challenging—"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me"—but they reveal a **profound** truth. Christ calls us to love Him above all else, not because He wishes to diminish or downplay our relationships, but because only **in Him** do we learn how to love others fully and faithfully.

Jesus also speaks of taking up our cross and following Him. Discipleship is not always easy. It requires sacrifice, courage, and trust. In a world that often encourages comfort and self-interest, Christ invites us to embrace a life of self-giving love. When we surrender ourselves to God's will, we discover a deeper joy and purpose than the world can offer. St. John Paul II used the words, "self-knowledge, self-acceptance, and self-gift" to describe human formation as disciples of Jesus Christ. It is important for us to know who we are, to accept the gifts and challenges of ourselves, and to use these at the service of others. This is a model of authenticity and discipleship.

The Gospel concludes with a beautiful reminder about hospitality and kindness. Even the smallest act of love—a cup of cold water given in Christ's name—has great value in God's eyes. No act of charity is too small when it is done with faith and love. The small things matter; do not underestimate one small action!

As we celebrate the Eucharist this weekend, let us renew our commitment to follow Jesus wholeheartedly. May we place Him first in our lives, carry our crosses with faith, and recognize opportunities each day to serve Him through acts of kindness and generosity toward others.




