Wednesday: 6:00 pm, St. Michael's Church following 5:30 pm Mass, Benediction at 7:00 pm

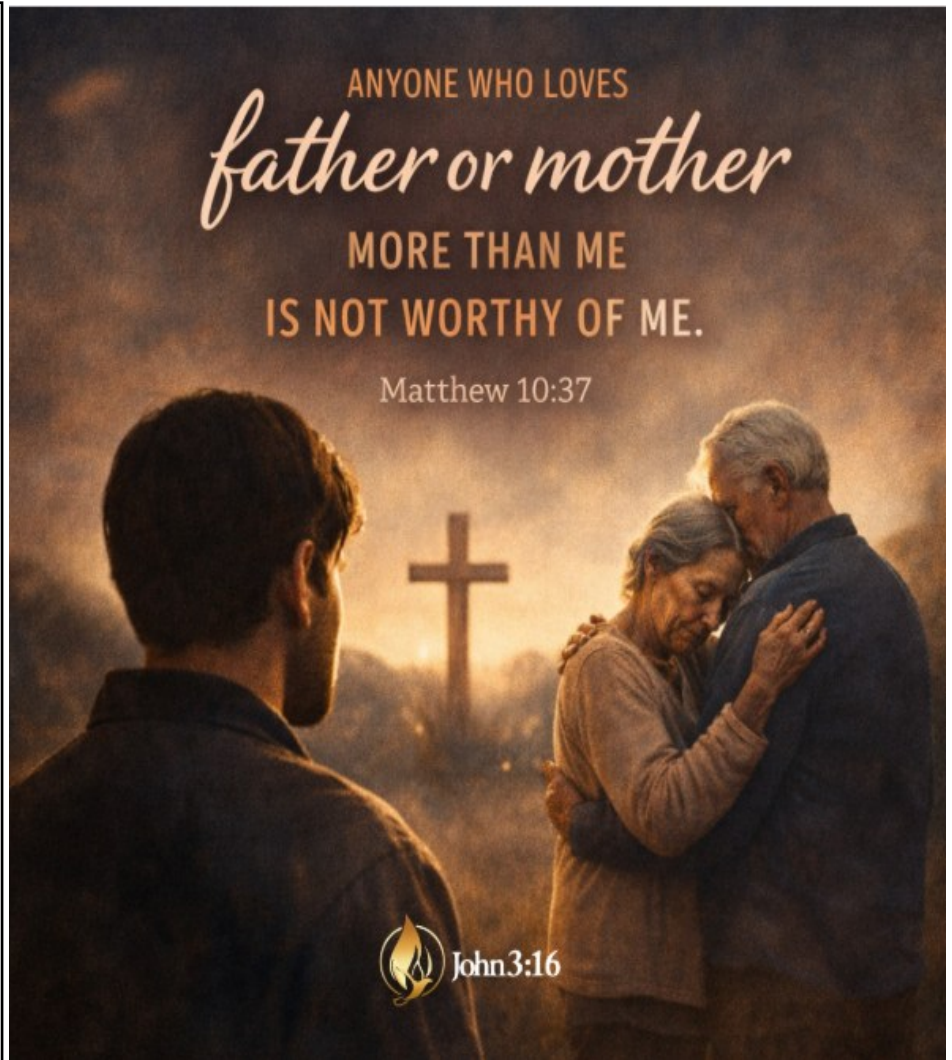


We really appreciate your kindness in supporting our Diocese of Kottapuram, which was established in 1987 and comprises 25000 families, which means 100,000 catholic faithful. We would like to request your prayers and support in these areas:

- **Formation of Our Seminarians.** Our diocese is blessed with good vocations. Currently, we have 113 priests in our diocese who are serving in and around the world. We have 23 major seminarians who are studying philosophy and theology and 13 minor seminarians. Our major expenses are for the formation of the seminarians, which come to almost \$1200 for each seminarian per year, and these huge expenses are met with the generous help which is rendered by people like you.
- **Support to the Retired Clergy:** We appreciate our elderly clergy who dedicated their life and efforts for the proclamation of the gospel. The diocese takes care of their primary necessities like lodging and medical bills. We are trying to build a house for the retired clergy where they can peacefully spend their remaining days in prayer.
- **Social Service Department.** Our mission is mainly carried out through our Social Service Department since our geographical area is largely coastal, where people work in areas like fishing and other unorganized sectors like masonry, carpentry etc. They find it very difficult to meet their livelihood and education of their children.
- The major thrust area of our Social Service Department is the empowerment of women, children, the Differently Abled and the Elderly.
 - ✓ Women are empowered through training and income generation activities such as: Screw pine craft, Water Hyacinth Craft, Cage Fish Culture, Paper Bag Making Units, Star Making Units, Organic Farming etc.

- ✓ There are many projects directed toward the development of children and youth such as:
 1. “Poomottukal” (meaning “Flower Bud”), which are the Self-Help Groups for children and youth, where they perform mutual support and sharing to grow to become able citizens. The children from the 5th year till their Adolescence will be supported in giving proper orientation
 2. Vacation camps with Personality Development and Talent Search Programs
 3. Communicative English, Soft Skills, Meditative skills like Yoga and computer literacy classes
 4. Participatory health and hygiene campaigns
 5. Regular sponsorship for studious children from poor families
 6. Sponsorship of the education of children of cancer patients and those children affected by cancer
 7. Free entrance coaching classes to get into the medical and engineering fields
 - ✓ We have also started a project called SNEHAMRITHAM which means a gentle touch to cancer patients, since Cancer has become one of the leading causes of death at our place.
 - ✓ We have Elderly groups which we call SAYAM PRABHA and have found it to be very effective in improving their mental health.
 - ✓ Right now, we are giving training and employment to many Differently Aabled people, especially women and found that their self-esteem became very high when they were engaged in work.
- **Housing Projects.** Our diocese is made up of small islands and the principal occupation of our people is fishing. The income they receive from fishing hardly helps them to meet their livelihood and pay their bills. Many of them live in small huts and the fierce monsoon that usually lasts for five months makes their life miserable. So we have begun a project to build a house for those who are really poor and do not have a decent living.

We thank the Lord for the wealth of faith that our community is blessed with and join Him faithfully to spread his gospel of love and compassion. I request your prayerful support and financial assistance to continue all the good works we do.

Today, Catholic men find themselves enmeshed in a culture that is antithetical to Christ and his Church. Though many men recognize the threat the culture poses to their families, communities, and parishes, too few men know what to do about it. In J.R.R. Tolkien's masterful work, *The Lord of the Rings*, Gandalf informs Frodo Baggins about the awful reality of the ring which his uncle Bilbo had bequeathed to him, and Frodo says, "I wish it need not have happened in my time." Gandalf responds, "So do I, and so do all who live to see such times. But that is not for them to decide. All we have to decide is what to do with the time that is given us." The dire circumstances of our time are patently evident, but men need to remember that God has placed us in this place and at this time for a reason. How will the men of our generation respond?

A good way to get started is to attend The 11th Annual Be A Catholic Man Conference on October 10th at Holy Redeemer High School in Wilkes Barre. The theme is **Just Be Catholic Stand fast with the Church founded by Jesus Christ, Who "is the same yesterday, today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). Through the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, God calls men, not to be lukewarm, but to become strong in order to contend with a hostile world. Christus Vincit!**

What is a spiritual emergency? An example would be someone facing a life-threatening medical situation needing to be Anointed. Another would be if a first responder or member of the military has been called to a natural disaster or other emergency where they will be in grave danger and want the Sacrament of Reconciliation before they leave.

**NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING
SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR**

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska at (570-862-7551).

PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI: IF I DIDN'T HAVE LOVE

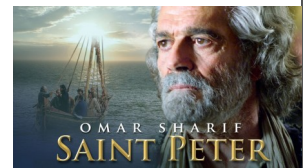

PAUL THE APOSTLE | THE BIBLE COLLECTION

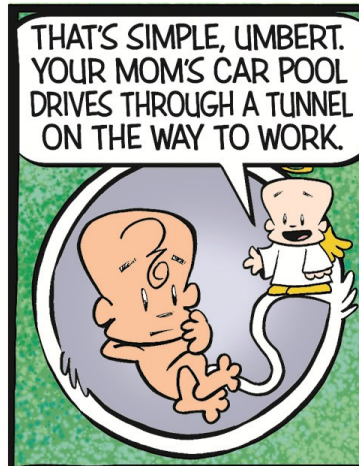
