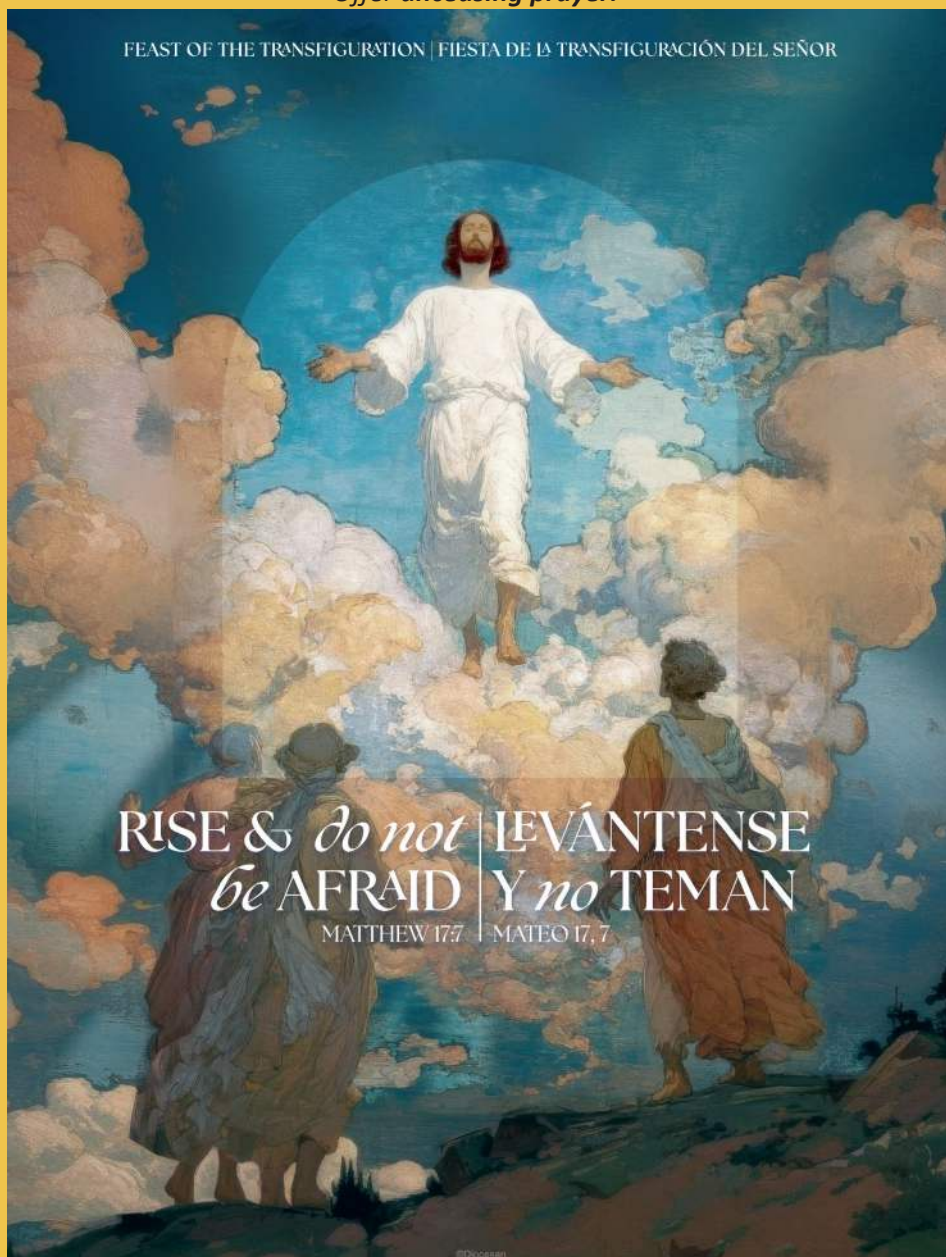

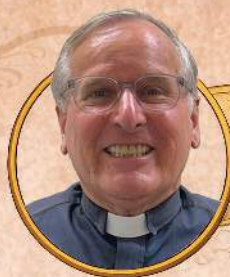

Pruned to Flourish

Have you ever felt stuck? Grown stagnant, even complacent?

It's during those "dry" seasons that I've discovered how impatient I can become, how my moods can shift, and how both can affect those around me—especially the ones I love. During those seasons of drought, I learned that simply asking the Lord to take away my impatience and moodiness wasn't enough. Instead, my conversations with Him began to focus on what He was calling me to do. Those conversations have never been easy, but they have always been necessary.

When Jorge and I bought our home, we inherited lush, fragrant rose bushes. I gladly embraced the responsibility of caring for them, wanting them to continue flourishing. I remember our first spring when Jorge hesitated to prune them. Even as he watched me carefully examine each branch before making a single snip, he worried I was doing more harm than good. To be honest, I shared some of his concern. *Did I really know what I was doing?*

But I also knew that pruning is essential for healthy growth. So, with care and courage (and gloved hands to protect against the unavoidable prickly thorns!), I lovingly pruned each bush. Before long, we watched them flourish with abundant blooms.



Jesus tells us, *"I am the vine; you are the branches"* (John 15). Just as those rose bushes needed pruning to thrive, so do we.

Every day, in every moment, we are given a choice. We can remain comfortable and complacent, or we can allow the Lord to trim away the parts of our lives that hinder our growth. Maybe it's an unhealthy habit. Sometimes it's pride, fear, bitterness, or the temptation to say, "Just one more time." It might even be a relationship that no longer draws us closer to Christ. Some things in our lives have simply become stale. They no longer bear good fruit and may even be stifling the growth God desires for us.

Like pruning a rose bush, spiritual pruning requires care, courage, and patience. ...and lots of REST (Retreat, Enter into the presence of the Lord, Sanctify that time with Him and for Him, and Trust in His guidance). During REST, we can ask the Lord to cultivate the soil of our hearts, to strengthen what should remain, and to lovingly prune what should not.

When we truly REST in the Lord, we deepen our relationship with Him through continual conversation. We begin to seek Him in every circumstance, and as we do, we recognize His voice more clearly. He reveals what needs to be nourished, what needs to be surrendered, and what needs to be cut away so that new life can take root.

Pruning isn't about punishment; it's about preparation. The Gardener never cuts without purpose. Every trim is made with the hope of greater fruitfulness.

Pruning takes courage, trust, and patience. Most of all, it requires a willingness to let go and let God. So today, let go... and let God.

Podados para florecer

¿Alguna vez te has sentido estancado? ¿Has sentido que te has quedado paralizado o incluso que has caído en la autocomplacencia?

Es durante esas temporadas de «sequía» cuando he descubierto lo impaciente que puedo llegar a ser, cómo cambia mi estado de ánimo y cómo ambas cosas afectan a quienes me rodean, especialmente a mis seres queridos. En esos tiempos de aridez, aprendí que no bastaba con pedirle al Señor que me quitara la impaciencia y el mal humor. En cambio, mis conversaciones con Él empezaron a centrarse en aquello a lo que Él me llamaba. Esas conversaciones nunca han sido fáciles, pero siempre han sido necesarias.

Cuando Jorge y mi esposo y yo compramos nuestra casa, heredamos unos rosales frondosos y fragantes. Asumí con gusto la responsabilidad de cuidarlos, deseando que siguieran floreciendo. Recuerdo nuestra primera primavera, cuando Jorge dudaba a la hora de podarlos. Aunque me veía examinar cuidadosamente cada rama antes de hacer el primer corte, le preocupaba que estuviera causando más daño que bien. Para ser sincera, yo compartía parte de su inquietud. *¿Realmente sabía lo que estaba haciendo?*

Pero también sabía que la poda es esencial para un crecimiento saludable. Así que, con cuidado y valentía (¡y con guantes para protegerme de las inevitables espinas!), podé con amor cada arbusto. Al poco tiempo, los vimos florecer con abundantes rosas.

Jesús nos dice: *"Yo soy la vid; ustedes son las ramas"* (Juan 15). Al igual que aquellos rosales necesitaban la poda para prosperar, nosotros también la necesitamos.

Cada día, en cada momento, se nos presenta una elección. Podemos permanecer cómodos y autocomplacientes, o podemos permitir que el Señor pade aquellas partes de nuestra vida que obstaculizan nuestro crecimiento. Tal vez sea un hábito poco saludable. A veces es el orgullo, el miedo, el resentimiento o la tentación de decir: "Solo una vez más". Podría tratarse incluso de una relación que ya no nos acerca a Cristo. Algunas cosas en nuestra vida simplemente se han vuelto estancadas. Ya no dan buen fruto e incluso pueden estar sofocando el crecimiento que Dios desea para nosotros.

Al igual que la poda de un rosal, la poda espiritual requiere cuidado, valentía y paciencia... y mucho DESCANSO (Retirarse, Entrar en la presencia del Señor, Santificar ese tiempo con Él y para Él, y Confiar en Su guía). Durante el descanso, podemos pedirle al Señor que cultive la tierra de nuestros corazones, que fortalezca lo que debe permanecer y que pade con amor aquello que no debe seguir ahí.

Cuando verdaderamente descansamos en el Señor, profundizamos nuestra relación con Él a través de una conversación constante. Comenzamos a buscarle en cada circunstancia y, al hacerlo, reconocemos Su voz con mayor claridad. Él nos revela qué necesita ser nutrido, qué debe ser entregado y qué debe ser podado para que una nueva vida pueda echar raíces.

La poda no es un castigo; es una preparación. El Jardinero nunca corta sin un propósito. Cada corte se realiza con la esperanza de una mayor fecundidad.

Podar requiere valentía, confianza y paciencia. Sobre todo, requiere la disposición de soltar y dejar que Dios actúe. Así que hoy, suelta... y deja que Dios actúe.
