

Confirmation 2027: Responsibilities of the Confirmation Sponsor

Congratulations! You have been chosen. Someone thinks you are significant. Someone sees you as a follower of Christ. Being a Confirmation Sponsor is not just a one-time thing; it is not just a ceremonial role. It is a significant, critical relationship in the life of this young person.

Candidates for Confirmation see you, and all sponsors, as friends (someone they can have a close relationship with; someone who is interested in them; someone they can freely talk with; someone they can share questions, doubts, and worries with), as witnesses (someone who has an active faith life; someone who participates in Mass and the Sacraments), and as guides (someone who will walk with them on their faith journey). *[taken from "Catholic Parent Know How: How to be a Confirmation Sponsor" published by Our Sunday Visitor, July 23, 2016]*

As a Confirmation Sponsor, we would like you to be aware of the following opportunities for you to help your candidate prepare to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Tuesday, September 22, 2026, 6:30-8:00pm: **Confirmation Parent/Candidate/Sponsor Meeting**

Saturday, October 3, 2026: **Parish Service Day**

A chance to participate in a service experience with your candidate.

Sunday, January 30, 2027, **Confirmation Retreat**

Parents and sponsors are invited to join the group for the **Vigil Mass** at 4:30pm in the church.

Sunday, May 2, 2027 at 2:00pm, **Confirmation Mass** in the church, reception to follow

Additionally, all Confirmation Candidates have been given a set of **conversational questions** they need to complete with the help of their sponsor. These questions are to be answered by the sponsor in the context of a conversation/interview with their candidate. These will be your answers, recorded or written down by the candidate. These questions are not homework for you; they are better viewed as conversation starters for the two of you.

Confirmation Sponsors and parents are also encouraged to write a **Letter of Hope** to be given to the candidate after the final Faith Night on April 25, 2027. A Letter of Hope is a sincere and heartfelt letter that encourages the Confirmation Candidate on their faith journey. It is a chance to let the candidate know that you are proud of them, and that you appreciate the work they have done in preparation for Confirmation. It may include a prayer, or something about your own faith experience that you want to share with them.
