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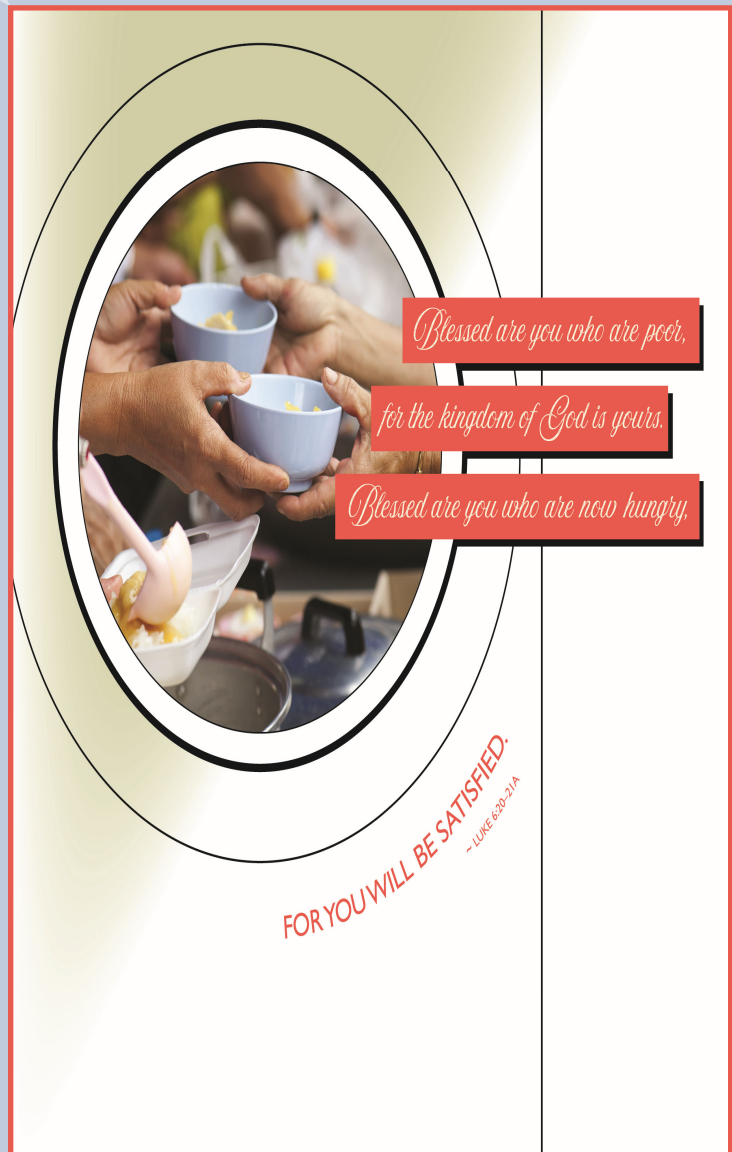

The Mysteries of the Rosary IV: The Sorrowful Mysteries

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I continue my series on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary today with the Sorrowful Mysteries. The Sorrowful mysteries provide us with a particularly wonderful view of God's love for us, and I think they are especially appropriate as we prepare for the beginning of Lent in just a couple of weeks.

Indeed, the Sorrowful Mysteries are "Lenten" mysteries. They tell us of the last moments of our Lord's life, as he prepared to offer himself as the supreme sacrifice on the altar of the Cross. There is no greater mercy: our God stands in our place to be judged, condemned and punished for our transgressions. He pays the price we could never pay, and opens the way for us to receive our inheritance of eternity.

The first Sorrowful Mystery is our Lord's agony in the garden. Jesus goes off by himself to pray, knowing the weight of what was to come. His agony is intense, and all alone, he offers himself to the Father's will for him. That will was one of mercy for us sinners.

The second Sorrowful Mystery is the scourging of our Lord at the pillar. As he prepares to offer himself for us, he is scourged like a common criminal. The thing is, we deserve that and so much more for our offenses against God, but nothing that we have done can overshadow God's mercy.

The third Sorrowful Mystery is the crowning of our Lord with thorns. Christ is our king, the Supreme Ruler of the universe. Yet our King gives himself willingly for us, taking the shame that we must feel for our many sins. In mercy, he wants us to be free of shame so that we can freely enter into glory with him.

The fourth Sorrowful Mystery is our Lord taking up his cross and walking to Calvary. His Way of the Cross mimics our own life of faith: sometimes we fall, sometimes we are encouraged, sometimes we are broken. In his mercy, he takes the weight of that cross all along the way so that we would not ever have to carry our burdens alone.

Finally, the fifth Sorrowful Mystery is the death of our Lord on the Cross. In this ultimate act of mercy, he pays the supreme price for our many sins. When we are tempted to make poor choices in our lives, may we remember that those lives were purchased at such a great price as this. Mercy will not let go of us, Mercy would rather die than live without us. Jesus is truly the face of the Father's mercy, and when we look on this mystery of the Rosary, we see how loving that face truly is.

Los Misterios del Rosario IV: Los Misterios Dolorosos

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

Continúo mi serie sobre los misterios del Santo Rosario hoy con los Misterios dolorosos. Los misterios Dolorosos nos brindan una visión particularmente maravillosa del amor de Dios por nosotros, y creo que son especialmente apropiados cuando nos preparamos para el inicio de la Cuaresma en solo un par de semanas.

De hecho, los Misterios Dolorosos son misterios de "Cuaresma". Nos hablan de los últimos momentos de la vida de nuestro Señor, mientras se preparaba para ofrecerse como el sacrificio supremo en el altar de la Cruz. No hay mayor misericordia: nuestro Dios está en nuestro lugar para ser juzgado, condenado y castigado por nuestras transgresiones. Él paga el precio que nunca podríamos pagar, y nos abre el camino para que recibamos nuestra herencia de la eternidad.

El primer Misterio Doloroso es la agonía de nuestro Señor en el jardín. Jesús se va solo a orar, sabiendo el peso de lo que vendrá. Su agonía es intensa y, solo se ofrece a la voluntad del Padre para él. Esa voluntad fue de misericordia para nosotros los pecadores.

El segundo Misterio Doloroso es el azote de nuestro Señor en el pilar. Mientras se prepara para ofrecerse por nosotros, es azotado

como un criminal común. Nosotros nos merecemos eso y mucho más por nuestras ofensas contra Dios, pero nada de lo que hemos hecho puede eclipsar la misericordia de Dios.

El tercer Misterio Doloroso es la coronación de nuestro Señor con espinas. Cristo es nuestro rey, el Gobernante Supremo del universo. Sin embargo, nuestro Rey se entrega voluntariamente por nosotros, llevando la vergüenza que nosotros deberíamos sentir por nuestros muchos pecados. En Su misericordia, quiere que estemos libres de vergüenza para que podamos entrar libremente en la gloria con él.

El cuarto Misterio Doloroso es que nuestro Señor toma su cruz y camina hacia el Calvario. Su Viacrucis imita nuestra propia vida de fe: a veces caemos, a veces somos motivados, a veces nos quebrantamos. En su misericordia, él toma el peso de esa cruz a lo largo del camino para que nunca tengamos que llevar nuestras cargas solo.

Finalmente, el quinto Misterio Doloroso es la muerte de nuestro Señor en la Cruz. En este último acto de misericordia, Él paga el precio supremo por nuestros muchos pecados. Cuando estemos tentados a tomar malas decisiones en nuestras vidas, recordemos que esas vidas fueron compradas a un precio tan alto como este. La misericordia no nos dejará ir, la misericordia preferiría morir antes que vivir sin nosotros. Jesús es verdaderamente el rostro de la misericordia del Padre, y cuando miramos este misterio del Rosario, vemos cuán verdadero es ese rostro.

Tajemnice Różańca IV: Tajemnice Bolesne

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Kontynuuję serię rozważań Różańca Świętego; dzisiaj Tajemnice Bolesne. Tajemnice te dostarczają nam szczególnie cudownego obrazu Bożej miłości do nas i myślę, że są one szczególnie odpowiednie gdy przygotowujemy się do zbliżającego się Wielkiego Postu.

Rzeczywiście, Bolesne Tajemnice są tajemnicami "Wielkiego Postu". Opowiadają nam o ostatnich chwilach życia naszego Pana, kiedy przygotowywał się do złożenia siebie jako najwyższej ofiary na ołtarzu Krzyża. Nie ma większego miłosierdzia: nasz Bóg stoi na naszym miejscu, aby zostać osądzonym, potępionym i ukaranym za nasze występki. Płaci cenę, której nigdy nie zapłacimy, i otwiera nam drogę do otrzymania naszego dziedzictwa w wieczności.

Pierwsza Tajemnica Bolesna jest męką naszego Pana w Ogrójcu. Jezus odchodzi sam aby się modlić, znając ciężar tego, co ma nadejść. Jego agonia jest intensywna i sam, ofiarowuje się woli Ojca Swego.

Druga Tajemnica Bolesna to biczowanie naszego Pana na filarze. Kiedy przygotowuje się do ofiarowania siebie za nas, jest biczowany jak zwykły przestępca. Chodzi o to, że zasługujemy na to i o wiele więcej za nasze obrazy przeciwko Bogu, ale nic co zrobiliśmy nie może przyćmić Bożego miłosierdzia.

Trzecia Tajemnica Bolesna to Ukoronowanie naszego Pana cierniami. Chrystus jest naszym Królem, Najwyższym Władcą wszechświata. Jednak nasz Król chętnie udziela nam siebie, przyjmując wstyd, który musimy odczuwać za nasze liczne grzechy. W miłosierdziu chce abyśmy byli wolni od wstydu, abyśmy mogli z Nim swobodnie wstąpić do Jego chwały.

W Czwartej bolesnej tajemnicy nasz Pan podejmuje krzyż i idzie na Kalwarię. Jego Droga Krzyżowa naśladuje nasze własne życie wiary: czasami upadamy, czasami jesteśmy zachęceni, czasami jesteśmy załamani. W swoim miłosierdziu bierze ciężar tego krzyża na całą drogę, abyśmy nigdy nie musieli nosić naszych ciężarów sami.

Wreszcie piątą Tajemnicą Bolesną jest śmierć naszego Pana na Krzyżu. W tym ostatecznym akcie miłosierdzia płaci On najwyższą cenę za nasze liczne grzechy. Kiedy jesteśmy kuszeni, aby dokonywać złych wyborów, musimy pamiętać, że nasze życie zostało odkupione za wielką cenę Krzyża. Miłosierdzie nie pozwoli nam odejść, Miłosierdzie wołałoby umrzeć, niż żyć bez nas. Jezus jest prawdziwym obliczem miłosierdzia Ojca i kiedy patrzymy na tę tajemnicę różańca, widzimy jak prawdziwie kochająca jest ta twarz.
