The Word from Fr. Pat / La Palabra del Padre Pat / Słowo od Ojca Pat

Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

So it begins. Palm Sunday has us experiencing the exultation of Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, only to be immediately confronted by the despair of those who have lost hope and turned him over to be crucified. It's a lot to take in in just one Mass! But we now find ourselves in the midst of Holy Week, when we keep watch for the events that mark the unfolding of our salvation. God himself, who created us for the express purpose of sharing his glory, sent his only begotten Son to become one of us. Out of love for us, Jesus Christ gave himself into our hands and was nailed to a cross. Freely laying down his life, he paid the price for our many sins and made possible the salvation of the whole world, and the promise of us having eternal life in heaven.

Each year, because of this great grace, we carefully commemorate these events and celebrate the hope they have in store for us. We must never lose sight of the great price that was paid for our salvation, and it is our privilege each year to mark these days with holy reflection and solemn worship.

On the evening of Holy Thursday, at 7pm, we gather to receive the sacred oils that were consecrated and blessed to anoint the sick, to prepare catechumens, and to signify the presence of the Holy Spirit in those confirmed in the faith and baptized into the Church. We wash the feet of twelve people to commemorate our Lord's washing of the feet of his twelve disciples. This ritual reminds us that Christ has given us an example of service to others, which we are to live out in our own lives. That evening we also celebrate the institution of the Priesthood and most especially the giving of the Holy Eucharist, by which Christ's presence in the Church was secured until the end of time. The night continues with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until midnight, the pilgrimage to seven churches during the night, and reposing the Blessed Sacrament, pausing first for night prayer at 11:45pm.

On the afternoon of Good Friday, at the Mercy Hour of 3pm, we gather to hear the story of our salvation. We recall Christ's passion and death and meditate on his way of the Cross. We pray for all people, living and dead, we venerate the holy Cross on which our Savior died, and we receive Holy Communion to remember his presence among us and to be strengthened to keep the Paschal Fast.

On the night of Holy Saturday, at 8pm, we gather outdoors, outside the church, for the great Easter Vigil in the Holy Night. We keep watch through the night for the dawning of our salvation, the redemption gained by Christ's glorious resurrection from the dead. We light the new fire and dedicate the Paschal candle, we hear the stories of God's saving action throughout human history, and when the story of the Resurrection unfolds, the lights in the church are all put on, to recognize the radiance of new life in which we can now share. On this most holy night we recall our baptism, by which we died and rose to new life in Christ. We will baptize eleven people into Christ and his Church, as they yearn for the salvation promised to all who know and follow the Lord.

These three days are called the Sacred Paschal Triduum (or "three days"). These three liturgies are considered to be one continuous liturgy. Basically, it's all just one wonderful story, played out gloriously over the course of these three days. On these days, it is customary to keep the Paschal fast. From the Holy Thursday Evening Mass to the Easter Vigil, we eat and drink less, we refrain from useless chatter and joking around, we give up the things that distract us from our relationship with Christ. If we've been lax during Lent, we "crank it up a notch" on these days, because the celebration of our salvation is very near at hand.

No Catholic should miss the celebration of these mysteries. And if we are travelling, we should find a place to celebrate them. We cannot begin to understand our faith until we celebrate the solemnity of these days. **So please bring your families to** each of these celebrations, let the children hear how much God loves us, and be reminded yourselves of how incredibly precious you are to God. Nothing – not even death – could stand in the way of his love for us. Let nothing stand in the way of our love for him.

The Word from Fr. Pat / La Palabra del Padre Pat / Słowo od Ojca Pat

Jesús, acuérdate de mí cuando entres en tu reino.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

Así comienza. El Domingo de Ramos nos hace experimentar la exaltación de la entrada triunfal de Cristo en Jerusalén, solo para enfrentarnos de inmediato a la desesperación de quienes perdieron la esperanza y lo entregaron para que lo crucificaran. ¡Es mucho para ver en una sola misa! Pero ahora nos encontramos en medio de la Semana Santa, cuando estamos atentos a los acontecimientos que marcan el desarrollo de nuestra salvación. Dios mismo, quien nos creó con el propósito expreso de compartir su gloria, envió a su Hijo unigénito para que se convirtiera en uno de nosotros. Por amor a nosotros, Jesucristo se entregó a nuestras manos y fue clavado en una cruz. Rindiendo libremente su vida, pagó el precio por nuestros muchos pecados e hizo posible la salvación de todo el mundo y la promesa de que tengamos vida eterna en el cielo.

Cada año, debido a esta gran gracia, conmemoramos cuidadosamente estos eventos y celebramos la esperanza que nos esperan. Nunca debemos perder de vista el gran precio que se pagó por nuestra salvación, y es nuestro privilegio cada año marcar estos días con la santa reflexión y la solemne adoración.

En la tarde del Jueves Santo, a las 7 pm, nos reunimos para recibir los aceites sagrados que fueron consagrados y bendecidos para ungir a los enfermos, para preparar a los catecúmenos y para significar la presencia del Espíritu Santo en aquellos confirmados en la fe y bautizados en la Iglesia. Lavamos los pies de doce personas para conmemorar el lavado de los pies de nuestros doce discípulos por parte de nuestro Señor. Este ritual nos recuerda que Cristo nos ha dado un ejemplo de servicio a los demás, que debemos vivir en nuestras propias vidas. Esa noche también celebramos la institución del sacerdocio y, más especialmente, la entrega de la Sagrada Eucaristía, mediante la cual se aseguró la presencia de Cristo en la Iglesia hasta el fin de los tiempos. La noche continúa con la adoración del Santísimo Sacramento hasta la medianoche, la peregrinación a siete iglesias durante la noche y el Reposo del Santísimo Sacramento, deteniéndose primero para la oración nocturna a las 11:45 pm.

En la tarde del Viernes Santo, en la Hora de la Misericordia de las 3pm, nos reuniremos para escuchar la historia de nuestra salvación. Recordaremos la pasión y muerte de Cristo y meditaremos en su camino a la Cruz. Oraremos por todas las personas, vivas y muertas, veneraremos la Santa Cruz en la que murió nuestro Salvador, y recibiremos la Sagrada Comunión para recordar su presencia entre nosotros y ser fortalecidos para mantener el ayuno pascual.

En la noche del Sábado Santo, a las 8 pm, nos reunimos afuera de la iglesia, para la gran Vigilia de Pascua en la Noche Santa. Vigilaremos durante toda la noche el amanecer de nuestra salvación, la redención obtenida por la gloriosa resurrección de los muertos de Cristo. Encenderemos el nuevo fuego y dedicaremos la vela pascual, escucharemos las historias de la acción salvadora de Dios a lo largo de la historia humana, y como se desarrolla la historia de la Resurrección, se encenderán las luces de la iglesia para reconocer el resplandor de la vida nueva que ahora podemos compartir. En esta noche tan santa recordaremos nuestro bautismo, por el cual morimos y resucitamos a una nueva vida en Cristo. Bautizaremos a once personas en Cristo y su Iglesia, ya que anhelan la salvación prometida a todos los que conocen y siguen al Señor.

Estos tres días se llaman Triduo Pascual Sagrado (o "tres días"). Estas tres liturgias se consideran una liturgia continua. Básicamente, es solo una historia maravillosa, que se desarrolla gloriosamente a lo largo de estos tres días. En estos días, es costumbre mantener el ayuno pascual. Desde la misa del Jueves Santo en la noche hasta la Vigilia de Pascua, comemos y bebemos menos, nos abstenemos de charlas y bromas inútiles, renunciamos a las cosas que nos distraen de nuestra relación con Cristo. Si nos hemos relajado durante la Cuaresma, lo "aumentamos un poco" en estos días, porque la celebración de nuestra salvación está muy cerca.

Ningún católico debería perderse la celebración de estos misterios. Y si estamos viajando, deberíamos encontrar un lugar para celebrarlos. No podemos comenzar a entender nuestra fe hasta que celebramos la solemnidad de estos días. **Así que, por favor,** lleve a sus familias a cada una de estas celebraciones, permitan que los niños escuchen cuánto nos ama Dios y recuerden lo increíblemente preciosas que son para Dios. Nada, ni siquiera la muerte, podría interponerse en el camino de su amor por nosotros. No dejen que nada se interponga en el camino de nuestro amor por él.

The Word from Fr. Pat / La Palabra del Padre Pat / Słowo od Ojca Pat

Jezu, pamiętaj o mnie, kiedy przyjdiesz do swojego królestwa.

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Tak więc zaczęło się. W Niedzielę Palmową doświadczamy uniesienia triumfalnego wjazdu Chrystusa do Jerozolimy, aby natychmiast stawić czoła rozpaczliwym, którzy stracili nadzieję i obrócili w ukrzyżowanie. W jednej mszy tak wiele się dzieje! Ale teraz znajdujemy się w środku Wielkiego Tygodnia, kiedy obserwujemy wydarzenia, które wyznaczają rozwój naszego zbawienia. Sam Bóg, który stworzył nas w wyraźnym celu dzielenia się Jego chwałą, posłał swego Jednorodzonego Syna, aby stał się jednym z nas. Z miłości do nas Jezus Chrystus oddał się w nasze ręce i został przybity do krzyża. Swobodnie oddając swoje życie, zapłacił cenę za nasze grzechy i umożliwił zbawienie całego świata oraz obietnicę, że będziemy mieli życie wieczne w niebie.

W każdym roku z powodu tej wielkiej łaski uważnie upamiętniamy te wydarzenia i świętujemy nadzieję, jaką nam przynoszą. Nigdy nie wolno nam stracić z oczu wielkiej ceny, jaką zapłacono za nasze zbawienie, a naszym przywilejem każdego roku jest zaznaczanie tych dni świętą refleksją i uroczystym uwielbieniem.

Wieczorem Wielkiego Czwartku, o godz. 19.00, gromadzimy się, aby przyjąć święte oleje, które zostały poświęcone i pobłogosławione aby namaścić chorych, przygotować katechumenów i oznaczać obecność Ducha Świętego w tych, którzy zostali potwierdzeni w wierze i ochrzczeni w Kościele. Myjemy stopy dwunastu aby upamiętnić mycie stóp przez Jego dwunastu uczniów. Ten rytuał przypomina nam, że Chrystus dał nam przykład służby innym co mamy przeżyć w naszym życiu. Tego wieczoru obchodzimy także instytucję kapłaństwa, a zwłaszcza sprawowanie Najświętszej Eucharystii, dzięki której obecność Chrystusa w Kościele była zabezpieczona aż do końca czasów. Noc trwa z adoracją Najświętszego Sakramentu do północy, pielgrzymką do siedmiu kościołów w nocy i odprawieniem Najświętszego Sakramentu, zatrzymując się najpierw na nocną modlitwę o 23:45.

Po południu Wielkiego Piątku, w Godzinie Miłosierdzia o godz. 15.00, gromadzimy się, aby usłyszeć historię naszego zbawienia. Pamiętamy mękę i śmierć Chrystusa i medytujemy Jego drogę krzyżową. Modlimy się za wszystkich ludzi, żyjących i umarłych, czcimy święty krzyż, na którym umarł nasz Zbawiciel, i przyjmujemy Komunię świętą, aby pamiętać o Jego obecności wśród nas i abyśmy byli wzmocnieni, aby utrzymać Paschalny post.

W noc Wielkiej Soboty o 20.00 zbieramy się na zewnątrz, poza kościołem, na wielką Wigilię Paschalną w Świętą Noc. Przez całą noc czuwamy aż do świtu naszego zbawienia, odkupienia zdobytego przez chwalebne zmartwychwstanie Chrystusa. Zapalamy nowy ogień i poświęcamy świecę paschalną, słyszymy opowieści o zbawczym działaniu Boga w całej historii ludzkości, a kiedy historia zmartwychwstania się rozwija, wszystkie światła w kościele zostają zapalone, aby rozpoznać blask nowego życia w które możemy teraz udostępnić. W tę najświętszą noc wspominamy nasz chrzest, przez który umarliśmy i powstaliśmy w nowym życiu w Chrystusie. Chrzczymy jedenaście osób w Chrystusie i Jego Kościele, tęskniąc za zbawieniem obiecany wszystkim, którzy znają i podążają za Panem.

Te trzy dni nazywane są Świętym Triduum Paschalnym (lub „trzy dni”). Te trzy liturgie uważane są za jedną ciągłą liturgię. Zasadniczo, to tylko jedna wspaniała historia, która została rozegrana wspaniale w ciągu tych trzech dni. W tych dniach zwyczajem jest utrzymywanie paschalnego postu. Od Mszy Wieczornej Wielkiego Czwartku do Wigilii Paschalnej mniej jemy i pijemy, powstrzymujemy się od bezużytecznych rozmów i żartów, porzucamy rzeczy, które odwracają naszą uwagę od relacji z Chrystusem. Jeśli w czasie Wielkiego Postu byliśmy rozluźnieni, w tych dniach „podkreślamy to”, ponieważ celebrowanie naszego zbawienia jest bardzo bliska.

Żaden katolik nie powinien przegapić celebrowania tych tajemnic. A jeśli podróżujemy, powinniśmy znaleźć miejsce, aby je uczcić. Nie możemy zacząć rozumieć naszej wiary, dopóki nie będziemy świętować uroczystości tych dni. **Więc** proszę, przyprowadźcie swoje rodziny na każdą z tych uroczystości, pozwólcie dzieciom usłyszeć, jak bardzo Bóg nas kocha, i przypomnijcie sobie, jak niesamowicie cenny jesteście dla Boga. Nic - nawet śmierć - nie stanie na drodze jego miłości do nas. Niech nic nie stoi na przeszkodzie naszej miłości do Niego.

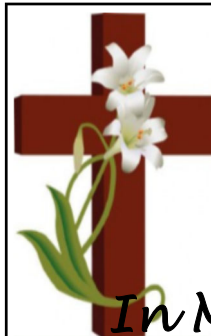

Memorial Naming Opportunities

As a way to keep our dearly departed loved ones ever present to us, St. Mary Immaculate offers different memorials that can be purchased in their name as a celebration of their life.



Life sized statue of Immaculate Conception

This statue is approximately 54" tall and would be placed on a pedestal outside of the church on the lawn between the north door and the main church entrance facing west. Plans are to include appropriate landscaping and possibly a kneeler and bench as a new meditation area. \$8,000

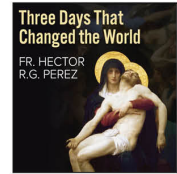

Jesus is truly present in the Holy Eucharist! This month's Exhibit shares photographic, historically and scientifically documented Eucharistic miracles from the countries of Poland, Spain, Holland, Peru, and India.

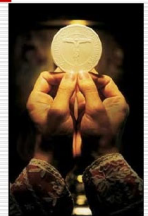
Miracles from 2008 & 2013 in Poland have scientific studies that establish the consecrated Hosts' substance as human heart tissue.

Here is a sampling of the incredible miracles you can read about: consecrated hosts that have bled, Hosts emitting bright lights, cows bow to Host hidden in a field, stolen Hosts recovered by 3 fish, Hosts imprinted with the face of Christ and one Host imprinted with the infant Jesus, Hosts that remain incorrupt from over 100 years ago, and how wine turned into blood. By viewing these 35 posters on display it becomes evident that Christ physically remains with us in His Body and Blood received during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. *Spanish translations will be available.*



Miracle in Sokółka.

- In October in 2008 in the church of St. Anthony in Sokółka an amazing phenomenon happened. When the host fell, it transformed later into a piece of human heart. No one could find traces of human assistance in the phenomenon.



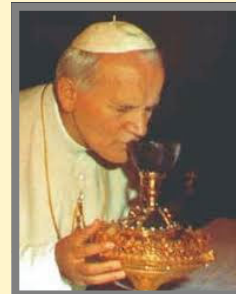
Christ crowned with thorns is visible in this host in India in 2001.



To this day, the consecrated Host remains intact 182 years later in Onil, Spain.

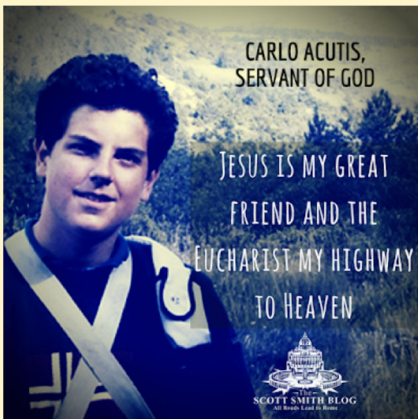

At age 11, he became fascinated with and began visiting all the Eucharistic Miracles. Exceptionally gifted in working with computers, Acutis developed a website which catalogued Eucharistic miracles. This website was the genesis of The Eucharistic Miracles of the World, an international exhibition which highlights such occurrences (these are the ones we have on display). This past January, in accordance with Canon law in researching the lives of saints, the mortal remains of Venerable Carlos Acutis were exhumed and found to be incorrupt! Carlos died from leukemia at the age of 15 in 2006 and is destined for Sainthood soon.

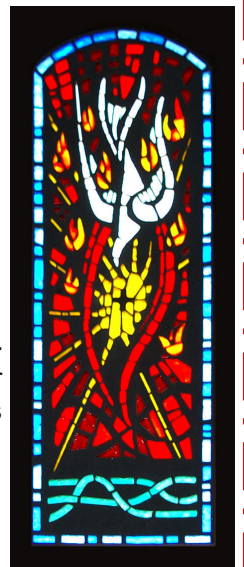

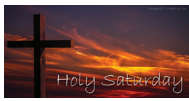

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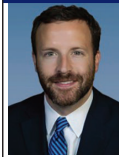


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
