The Word from Fr. Pat / La Palabra del Padre Pat / Słowo od Ojca Pat

*Jesus said to Simon Peter,
“Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?”
Simon Peter answered him, “Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.”
Jesus said to him, “Feed my lambs...”
John 21:15*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Sometimes the pain of our sin and the knowledge that we have let our Lord down yet again is itself a penalty for that sin. That had to be how Peter was feeling in today's Gospel. He knew he had denied his friend and Lord three times, even though he protested on that Holy Thursday night that no such thing would ever happen. But our Lord knows how we are, and he certainly knew that Peter would fall. In Luke's Gospel, just as the cock crows, there is the wonderful little detail, "And Jesus turned and looked at Peter" (Luke 22:61). What was that look like? What was in Jesus eyes? What was in Peter's eyes?

Now as poignant as that moment was, it could well have crushed Peter. If his failure had never been addressed, maybe that would have been the defining moment of a Peter that never accomplished anything for the Kingdom, and perhaps the beginning of the end of a fledgling Church. That couldn't happen, so Jesus takes a little time after breakfast to address the matter, and just as he denied his Lord three times, so he professes three times that he loves him. It had to be a difficult conversation for Peter, but it was the only process by which his fallenness could be addressed and overcome.

We all have moments like this in our families. When everyone knows the elephant in the room, when everyone knows the fallenness of one or more of the family's members, well that could be the defining moment of a failing family. If we agree to "never speak of it again," the problem is that the sin is always there, looking us all right in the face, and it makes us weaker and weaker and weaker.

That's why reconciliation is so important, Brothers and Sisters. That's why we have to address that elephant in the room when it's there. If one of us has fallen, we have to give him or her the opportunity to get back up. We have to have the difficult conversation, cry the necessary tears, ask for pardon and profess that our love for one another is unchanged.

Is there a moment like this in your family now? If so, have that conversation, go to Confession, even get some counseling help if that's what's needed. God deeply wants to pour out his mercy on hurting families. We work with some wonderful counselors, and if you or your family has a need, we can make a referral. Just get in touch with someone on staff. But whatever it is, whatever is needed, please have the conversation so that the family can be saved and the sheep can be fed.

The Word from Fr. Pat / La Palabra del Padre Pat / Słowo od Ojca Pat

*Jesús dijo a Simón Pedro:
"Simón, hijo de Juan, ¿me amas más que estos?"
Simón Pedro le respondió: "Sí, Señor, tú sabes que te amo".
Jesús le dijo: "Apacienta mis corderos ..."
Juan 21:15*

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

A veces, el dolor de nuestro pecado y el conocimiento de que hemos decepcionado a nuestro Señor una vez más es en sí mismo un castigo por ese pecado. Así debió ser como se sintió Pedro en el Evangelio de hoy. Sabía que había negado a su amigo y al Señor tres veces, a pesar de que protestó en la noche del Jueves Santo de qué tal cosa nunca sucedería. Pero nuestro Señor sabe cómo somos, y ciertamente sabía que Pedro caería. En el Evangelio de Lucas, al igual que el gallo canta, hay un pequeño detalle maravilloso: "Y Jesús se volvió y miró a Pedro" (Lucas 22:61). ¿Cómo creen que fue esa mirada? ¿Qué había en los ojos de Jesús? ¿Qué había en los ojos de Peter?

Aunque, ese fue un momento conmovedor, bien pudo haber abatido a Pedro. Si nunca se hubiera abordado su fracaso, tal vez ese hubiera sido el momento que hubiera definido a un Pedro que nunca logró nada para el Reino, y tal vez el principio del fin de una Iglesia incipiente. Eso no podría suceder, por lo que Jesús se toma un poco de tiempo después del desayuno para abordar el asunto, y tal como negó a su Señor tres veces, así mismo profesa tres veces que lo ama. Tenía que ser una conversación difícil para Pedro, sin embargo, era el único proceso mediante el cual se podía abordar y superar su caída.

Todos tenemos momentos como este en nuestras familias. Cuando todos conocen al elefante en la habitación, cuando todos conocen la caída de uno o más de los miembros de la familia, así mismo, ese podría ser el momento que podría definir el fracaso de una familia. Si estamos de acuerdo en "no volver a hablar de ello", el problema es que el pecado siempre está ahí, nos mira a la cara de frente y solo logra hacernos más y más débiles.

Por eso la reconciliación es tan importante, hermanos y hermanas. Es por eso que tenemos que dirigirnos a ese elefante en la habitación cuando está allí. Si uno de nosotros se ha caído, tenemos que darle la oportunidad de levantarse. Tenemos que tener la conversación difícil, llorar las lágrimas necesarias, pedir perdón y profesar que nuestro amor por los demás no ha cambiado.

¿Hay un momento como este en tu familia ahora? Si es así, mantén esa conversación, ve a Confesión, incluso obtén ayuda de consejería si eso es lo que necesitas. Dios quiere profundamente derramar su misericordia sobre las familias heridas. Trabajamos con algunos asesores maravillosos, y si usted o su familia tienen una necesidad, podemos hacer una referencia. Simplemente póngase en contacto con alguien en el personal. Sea lo que sea, lo que sea necesario, tenga la conversación para poder salvar a la familia y alimentar a las ovejas.

Szymon Piotr odpowiedział mu: „Tak, Panie, Ty wiesz, że Cię kocham”.
Rzekł mu Jezus: „Paś baranki moje ...”
Jan 21:15*

Drodzy bracia i siostry w Chrystusie,

Czasami ból naszego grzechu i wiedza, że pozwoliliśmy naszemu Panu odsunąć się na bok, sama w sobie jest karą za ten grzech. Tak właśnie musiał się czuć Piotr w dzisiejszej Ewangelii. Wiedział, że trzy razy zaparł się swojego przyjaciela i Pana, chociaż protestował w tę wielką noc czwartkową że nic takiego się nie wydarzy. Ale nasz Pan wie, kim jesteśmy, i na pewno wiedział, że Piotr upadnie. W Ewangelii św. Łukasza, gdy kogut pieje, pojawia się cudowny szczegół: „A Jezus odwrócił się i spojrzał na Piotra” (Ew. Łukasza 22:61). Jak to wyglądało? Co było w oczach Jezusa? Co było w oczach Piotra?

Tak przejmujący moment mógł równie dobrze zmiażdżyć Piotra. Gdyby jego porażka nigdy nie została rozwiązana, być może byłby to decydujący moment Piotra i ten nigdy nie dokonałby niczego dla Królestwa a być może byłby to początek końca raczkującego Kościoła. To nie mogło się wydarzyć, więc Jezus poświęca trochę czasu na śniadanie, aby zająć się tą sprawą. Piotr tak jak trzy razy zaparł się swego Pana, teraz trzykrotnie wyznaje, że go kocha. To musiała być trudna rozmowa dla Piotra, ale był to jedyny proces, dzięki któremu jego upadek mógł zostać rozwiązany i przezwyciężony.

Wszyscy mamy takie chwile w naszych rodzinach. Kiedy wszyscy znają słońca w pokoju, kiedy wszyscy znają upadek jednego lub więcej członków rodziny, to może być decydujący moment upadającej rodziny. Jeśli zgodzimy się „nigdy więcej o tym nie mówić”, to może być początek końca. Grzech jest zawsze obecny, patrząc nam prosto w twarz czyni nas słabszymi, słabszymi i słabszymi.

Dlatego tak ważne jest pojednanie, bracia i siostry. Dlatego musimy zająć się tym słońcem w pokoju, kiedy tam jest. Jeśli któryś z nas upadł, musimy dać mu szansę na powrót. Musimy przeprowadzić trudną rozmowę, wypłakać niezbędne łzy, prosić o przebaczenie i wyznawać, że nasza wzajemna miłość do siebie pozostaje niezmieniona.

Czy w twojej rodzinie jest teraz taki moment? Jeśli tak, przeprowadź tę rozmowę, pójź do spowiedzi, a nawet skorzystaj z pomocy psychologa czy kierownika duchowego, jeśli tego potrzebujesz. Bóg głęboko chce wylać swoje miłosierdzie na rany rodzin. Współpracujemy z kilkoma wspaniałymi psychologami i kierownikami duchowymi, a jeśli ty lub twoja rodzina ma potrzebę, możemy Cię skierować. Skontaktuj się z kimś z personelu. Ale cokolwiek to jest, cokolwiek jest potrzebne, poproś o rozmowę, aby można było uratować rodzinę i nakarmić owce.

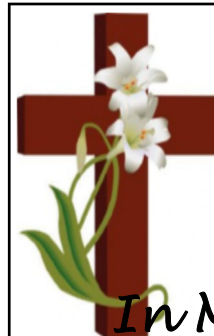

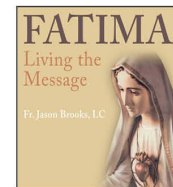

Suggested Daily Prayer:

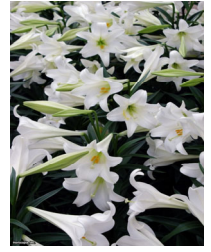
