Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Becoming what we are meant to be is the great project of our lives. God has created us in love, and has a specific station in life, a specific vocation, for all of us. When we finally find ourselves where God wants us, that is when our relationship with God will lead us to the happiness that God wants us to have in this life. Getting there is no easy task; it takes openness to God's will and the willingness to let God have our lives instead of us desperately hanging on and wanting to be in complete control. Giving our lives to God like that is scary, but it is that necessary leap of faith that facilitates what needs to happen in our lives.

On this fourth Sunday of Easter, traditionally known as “Good Shepherd Sunday,” we are called on to pray for vocations, especially to the priesthood. I would like to suggest that we pray for all holy vocations: to the priesthood, consecrated life (men and women religious), permanent diaconate, and married life. When we are all “what we shall be” as Saint John says in the quote above, all of our vocations will support one another.

So please join me in praying for vocations every day. Pray that parents would fulfill the promises made on their wedding day and on the day of their child's baptism. Pray that priests would be faithful to prayer and administering the Sacraments and saving souls. Pray that seminarians would remain fervent in prayer and formation to become priests after God's own heart. Pray that permanent deacons would be faithful in married life and in service to the Church. Pray that men and women religious would be faithful witnesses to God's love and would fulfill their ministries to assist themselves and others on the way to salvation. Pray that God would grant all of us the grace to find our true vocation and to live it with joy every day of our lives.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

Convertirse en lo que estamos destinados a ser es el gran proyecto de nuestras vidas. Dios nos ha creado en el amor, y tiene una posición específica en la vida, una vocación específica, para todos nosotros. Cuando finalmente nos encontramos donde Dios nos quiere, es cuando nuestra relación con Dios nos llevará a la felicidad que Dios quiere que tengamos en esta vida. Llegar allí no es tarea fácil; requiere apertura a la voluntad de Dios y la voluntad de dejar que Dios tenga nuestras vidas en lugar de que estemos desesperadamente aferrados y deseando estar en completo control. Dar nuestras vidas a Dios de esa manera es aterrador, pero este salto de fe es necesario a fin de facilitar lo que debe suceder en nuestras vidas.

En este cuarto domingo de Pascua, tradicionalmente conocido como el "domingo del Buen Pastor", estamos llamados a orar por las vocaciones, especialmente por el sacerdocio. Me gustaría sugerir que oremos por todas las santas vocaciones: el sacerdocio, la vida consagrada (religiosos y religiosas), el diaconado permanente y la vida matrimonial. Cuando todos somos "lo que debemos ser" como dice San Juan en la cita arriba mencionada, todas nuestras vocaciones se apoyarán mutuamente.

Así que por favor únanse a mí en oración por las vocaciones todos los días. Oremos para que los padres cumplan las promesas hechas el día de su boda y el día del bautismo de su hijo. Oremos para que los sacerdotes sean fieles a la oración y administrando los Sacramentos y salvando almas. Oremos para que los seminaristas permanezcan fervientes en oración y formación para convertirse en sacerdotes según el corazón de Dios. Oremos para que los diáconos permanentes sean fieles en la vida matrimonial y en el servicio a la Iglesia. Oremos para que los hombres y las mujeres religiosas sean testigos fieles del amor de Dios y cumplan con sus ministerios para ayudarse a sí mismos y a otros en el camino de la salvación. Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Stawanie się tym, kim powinniśmy być, jest wspaniałym projektem naszego życia. Bóg stworzył nas w miłości i ma specyficzne stanowisko w życiu, szczególnie powołanie dla nas wszystkich. Kiedy w końcu znajdziemy się tam, gdzie Bóg chce nas, to wtedy nasza relacja z Bogiem doprowadzi nas do szczęścia, które Bóg chce, abyśmy mieli w tym życiu. Dotarcie tam nie jest łatwym zadaniem; wymaga otwartości na Bożą wolę i chęci, by Bóg miał nasze życie, zamiast nas rozpaczliwie róbować mieć pełną kontrolę. Dawanie życia Bogu w ten sposób jest przerażające, ale jest to konieczny skok wiary, który ułatwia to, co musi się wydarzyć w naszym życiu.

W tę czwartą niedzielę Wielkanocy, tradycyjnie znaną jako „Niedziela Dobrego Pasterza”, jesteśmy wezwani do modlitwy o powołania, zwłaszcza do kapłaństwa. Chciałbym zasugerować, abyśmy modlili się za wszystkie święte powołania: do kapłaństwa, życia konsekrowanego (zakonników i zakonnic), stałego diakonatu i życia małżeńskiego. Kiedy wszyscy jesteśmy „tym, kim będziemy”, jak mówi św. Jan w powyższym cytacie, wszystkie nasze powołania będą się wzajemnie wspierać.

Więc proszę dołączyć do mnie w modlitwie o powołania każdego dnia. Módlcie się, aby rodzice spełnili obietnice złożone w dniu ślubu i w dniu chrztu dziecka. Módlcie się, aby kapłani byli wierni modlitwie i udzielaniu sakramentów oraz ratowaniu dusz. Módlcie się, aby seminarzyści pozostali gorliwi w modlitwie i formacji, stając się kapłanami według własnego serca. Módlcie się, aby stali diakoni byli wierni w życiu małżeńskim i służbie Kościołowi. Módlcie się, aby zakonnicy i zakonnice byli wiernymi świadkami miłości Boga i wypełniali swoje posługi, aby pomagali sobie i innym na drodze do zbawienia. Módlcie się, aby Bóg dał nam wszystkim łaskę znalezienia naszego prawdziwego powołania i przeżywania go z radością każdego dnia naszego życia.

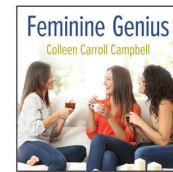

Purchase 2 eight-piece candelabras for special liturgical celebrations. \$2,500 each

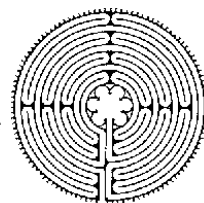

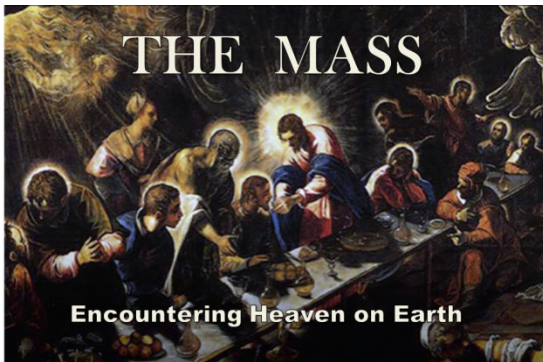

HOW TO LOVE THE EUCHARIST AND APPRECIATE THE MASS

Tuesdays, May 14, 21, and 28 – 7:00 - 8:30 PM

Parents have the responsibility of helping their children and families learn how to love the Eucharist and appreciate the Mass. But before they can pass that on to their children, many parents need help themselves with how to appreciate what happens at Mass and how to love the Eucharist.

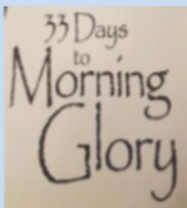

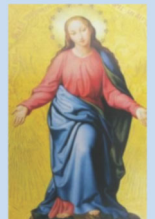

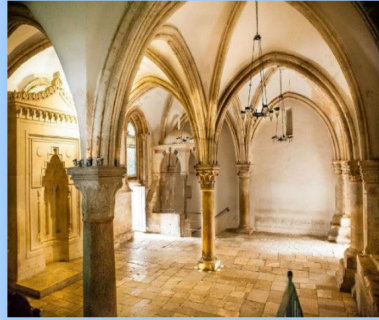
