Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

After living through so much tragedy near to home, and abroad, we can be people who get burdened with sadness. Everything in the news reminds us how fallen our world is. It seems like it's all so much "more of the same," so much more unpleasantness. What keeps us going through times like these?

We have to know, of course, that it is and always will be our faith that keeps us going. We people of faith know that God is constantly making "all things new," that the work of creation, feeble and frail as it may be, is always being renewed and brought into ever greater holiness.

Where we see nothing but pain and sadness, God sees an opportunity to help people in pain to know he is with them. He sees a time to wipe away tears and to renew faith. Not that he ever wills tragedy for the sake of what may come of it, but instead that he will never fail to bring good from evil circumstances. The Cross itself reminds us that sin and death never get the final word in our reality because love is so much more powerful.

And that is the take-away for us people of faith. We have to be people who share that love with all those in need. That is, in fact, how people will know of our discipleship, will know that Christ is Risen, will know that Jesus is Lord: by the way that we love one another and love those who are in need. The only Jesus some people can see right now is you and me. The task for us, then, is to reflect God's love in concrete ways, through our prayer, our words, and our acts of charity.

Love is more powerful than death, that much we know. There is no evil that is beyond the capacity of God's renewal, no tragedy that cannot give rise to peace. As Saint Paul reminds us, the greatest of all enduring things is love, and love is who God is. May we be those who are known to be icons of God's love to a world that needs so much of it in these days.

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Po oglądnięciu wiadomości z kraju i ze świata łatwo można popaść w depresję. Wszystko w wiadomościach przypomina nam jak upadły jest nasz świat. Wygląda na to, tragedie się mnożą w nieskończoność. Dlaczego żyjemy w takich czasach?

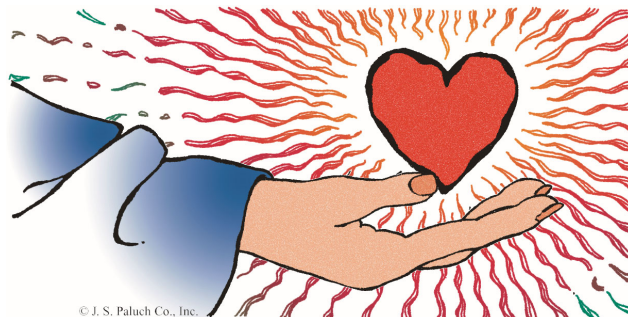
Musimy jednak pamiętać o naszej wierze, która nas trzyma i prowadzi do przodu. My, ludzie wiary wiemy, że Bóg nieustannie czyni „wszystko nowe”, że dzieło stworzenia, słabe i kruche, jakkolwiek może być, jest zawsze odnawiane i doprowadzane do coraz większej świętości.

Tam, gdzie widzimy tylko ból i smutek, Bóg widzi okazję, by pomóc ludziom cierpiącym, aby wiedzieli, że jest z nimi. Widzi możliwość aby otrzeć łzy i odnowić naszą wiarę. I nie oznacza to że nigdy nie będzie tragedii ale że nas nigdy nie zawiedzie, by przynieść dobro nawet w tych najtrudniejszych okolicznościach. Sam Krzyż przypomina nam, że grzech i śmierć nigdy nie mają ostatniego słowa w naszej rzeczywistości, ponieważ miłość jest o wiele potężniejsza.

A to jest dla nas ludzi wiary najważniejsze. Musimy być ludźmi, którzy dzielą się tą miłością ze wszystkimi potrzebującymi. W ten sposób inni będą wiedzieć o naszym uczniostwie, będą wiedzieć, że Chrystus zmartwychwstał, poznają, że Jezus jest Panem: przez sposób, w jaki kochamy się nawzajem i kochamy tych, którzy są w potrzebie. Jedyńm Jezusem, którego niektórzy ludzie mogą teraz zobaczyć to ty i ja. Zadaniem dla nas jest zatem odzwierciedlenie miłości Boga w konkretny sposób, poprzez naszą modlitwę, nasze słowa i nasze działania miłosierdzia.

Miłość jest potężniejsza niż śmierć, tyle wiemy. Nie ma zła, które jest poza możliwościami odnowy w Bogu, nie ma tragedii, która nie może doprowadzić do pokoju. Jak przypomina nam św. Paweł, największą ze wszystkich trwałych rzeczy jest miłość, a miłość jest tym, kim jest Bóg. Obyśmy byli tymi, o których wiadomo, że są ikonami Bożej miłości do świata, a świat rzeczywiście tak bardzo tego teraz potrzebuje.
