"It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us..."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Discernment is one of the basic spiritual principles of the Christian life. Learning to be a good discerner is foundational to living the life that God has in store for us. And the truth is, it's not the easiest thing in the world to learn: indeed, it takes a lot of trial and error. Discerning basically means listening carefully for God's word, God's direction in our lives. The trouble is, we have to listen with ears that filter out all the other voices that are not God, telling us stuff that leads us away from God. We also have to approach discernment with hearts that are open to God's will for us. Discernment takes work.

For me as a pastor, I have always felt that discernment was the work of the community. Sure, the Holy Spirit speaks to me, but he also speaks to you. The wisdom of the community makes use of the gifts that the Holy Spirit pours out on us as individuals, using those gifts for the good of all. So that's why we have a parish pastoral council, a school board, a finance council, and commissions for Word, Worship, Witness, Community, and Administration. We work together, we discern together, and together we embrace the mission that God has given us. In the end, when we make a decision, we want to say with the Apostles in today's first reading, "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us..."

When I came here almost two years ago, one of the first things Bishop Conlon said to me was, "You know, they don't have a parish council." I did know that, and I gently reminded him that these things take time. But being the parish that Saint Mary's is, it took less time than I had anticipated: we actually got our council up and running this past January. I'm so grateful to everyone that has had a hand in it. At one of the Masses this past March, I commissioned the Council and they've been working hard ever since.

We meet one Monday each month (usually the first Monday, but sometimes the second). We begin with prayer, then we break up into the various commissions. After they work for about 45 minutes to an hour, we do closing prayer and those who are not part of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) are dismissed. Each Commission has a representative to the PPC, and they then meet along with the priests, and four at-large parishioner members. They usually meet for another 45 minutes to an hour. The meetings have been positive, with a lot of great energy of people who want to take what's great about our parish and make it even better. I am so grateful to all of them for being part of it.

Please keep our Parish Pastoral Council in your prayers as they continue to find their way, and get used to working together to do great things.

"Es la decisión del Espíritu Santo y de nosotros ..."

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

El discernimiento es uno de los principios espirituales básicos de la vida cristiana. Aprender a ser un buen discernidor es fundamental para vivir la vida que Dios tiene para nosotros. Y la verdad es que no es la cosa más fácil de aprender en el mundo: de hecho, requiere mucho ensayo y errores. Discernir básicamente significa escuchar cuidadosamente la palabra de Dios, la dirección de Dios en nuestras vidas. El problema es que tenemos que escuchar con oídos que filtran todas las otras voces que no son Dios, diciéndonos cosas que nos alejan de Dios. También tenemos que acercarnos al discernimiento con corazones que están abiertos a la voluntad de Dios para nosotros. El discernimiento cuesta trabajo.

Como párroco, siempre he sentido que el discernimiento es el trabajo de la comunidad. Claro, el Espíritu Santo me habla a mí, pero también les habla a ustedes. La sabiduría de la comunidad hace uso de los dones que el Espíritu Santo derrama sobre nosotros como individuos, usando esos dones para el bien de todos. Por eso es que tenemos un consejo pastoral parroquial, una junta escolar, un consejo de finanzas y comisiones para La Palabra, Adoración, Testigos, Comunidad, y Administración. Trabajamos juntos, discernimos juntos, y juntos abrazamos la misión que Dios nos ha dado. Al final, cuando tomamos una decisión, queremos decir junto a los Apóstoles en la primera lectura de hoy: "Es la decisión del Espíritu Santo y de nosotros ..."

Cuando vine aquí hace casi dos años, una de las primeras cosas que el Obispo Conlon me dijo fue: "¿Sabes que no tienen un consejo parroquial?". Lo sabía, y le recordé gentilmente que estas cosas llevan tiempo. Sin embargo, al ser la parroquia que es Santa María, me tomó menos tiempo de lo que había previsto: nuestro consejo comenzó a funcionar en enero pasado. Estoy muy agradecido con todos los que han puesto una mano en ello. En una de las Misas en marzo pasado, comisioné al Consejo y han estado trabajando arduamente desde entonces.

Nos reunimos un lunes cada mes (generalmente el primer lunes, pero a veces es el segundo). Comenzamos con oración, luego nos dividimos en varias comisiones. Después de que trabajan entre unos 45 minutos y una hora, hacemos la oración final y los que no forman parte del Consejo Pastoral Parroquial (PPC) se pueden marchar. Cada comisión tiene un representante en el PPC, y luego se reúnen con los sacerdotes y cuatro feligreses independientes. Por lo general, se reúnen durante otros 45 minutos a una hora. Las reuniones han sido positivas, con mucha y gran energía de personas que quieren tomar lo mejor de nuestra parroquia y hacerlo aún mejor. Estoy muy agradecido con todos ellos por ser parte de esto.

Por favor, mantenga el Consejo Pastoral Parroquial en sus oraciones mientras continúan encontrando su camino, y nos acostumbramos a trabajar juntos para hacer grandes cosas.

„To decyzja Ducha Świętego i nasza..”

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Rozeznanie jest jedną z podstawowych duchowych zasad życia chrześcijańskiego. Nauka bycia dobrym rozeznawcą jest podstawą do życia, które Bóg dla nas przygotował. A prawda jest taka, że nie jest to najłatwiejsza rzecz na świecie do nauki: w rzeczywistości wymaga to dużo prób i błędów. Rozeznanie w zasadzie oznacza uważne słuchanie Bożego słowa, Bożego kierownictwa w naszym życiu. Problem polega na tym, że musimy słuchać uszami, które odfiltrowują wszystkie inne głosy, które nie pochodzą od Boga a które odciągają nas od Boga. Musimy także podejść do rozeznania z sercami otwartymi na wolę Bożą względem nas. Rozeznanie wymaga pracy.

Dla mnie jako pastora zawsze uważałem, że rozeznanie jest dziełem wspólnoty. Wiadomo, Duch Święty przemawia do mnie, ale także mówi do ciebie. Mądrość wspólnoty wykorzystuje dary, które Duch Święty wylewa na nas jako jednostki, używając tych darów dla dobra wszystkich. Dlatego mamy parafialną radę duszpasterską, zarząd szkoły, radę finansową i komisje ds. Słów, kultu, świadków, społeczności i administracji. Pracujemy razem, rozpoznajemy razem i razem obejmujemy misję, którą dał nam Bóg. W końcu, kiedy podejmujemy decyzję, chcemy powiedzieć wraz z Apostołami w pierwszym czytaniu: „To jest decyzja Ducha Świętego i nas ...”

Kiedy przybyłem tu prawie dwa lata temu, jedną z pierwszych rzeczy, które powiedział mi biskup Conlon, było: „Wiesz, nie mają rady parafialnej”. Wiedziałem o tym i delikatnie przypomniałem mu, że te rzeczy wymagają czasu. Ale będąc parafią, w której znajduje się Święta Maryja, zajęło nam to mniej czasu, niż się spodziewałem: faktycznie otrzymaliśmy radę i działaliśmy w styczniu tego roku. Jestem bardzo wdzięczny wszystkim, którzy mieli w tym swój udział. Na jednej z Mszy św. w marcu, zleciłem Radę i od tamtej pory ciężko pracują.

Spotykamy się raz w miesiącu (zwykle w pierwszy poniedziałek, ale czasami drugi). Zaczynamy od modlitwy, a następnie dzielimy się na różne komisje. Po pracy przez około 45 minut do godziny, zamykamy modlitwą, a ci, którzy nie są częścią Parafialnej Rady Duszpasterskiej (PPC), zostają zwolnieni. Każda Komisja ma przedstawiciela w PPC, a następnie spotyka się z kapłanami i czterema dużymi członkami parafian. Zazwyczaj spotykają się przez kolejne 45 minut do godziny. Spotkania były pozytywne, z wielką energią ludzi, którzy chcą wziąć to, co wspaniałe w naszej parafii i uczynić ją jeszcze lepszą. Jestem im wszystkim bardzo wdzięczny za to.

Zachowajcie naszą parafialną Radę Duszpasterską w swoich modlitwach, gdy będą nadal szukać drogi i przyzwyczajając się do wspólnej pracy nad wielkimi rzeczami.

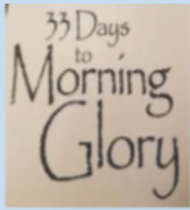
