Statement of Bishop R. Daniel Conlon, Diocese of Joliet Regarding Passage of Illinois Senate Bill 25

The misnamed “Reproductive Health Act”, Senate Bill 25, is a horrific piece of legislation that will lead to more children dying through the violent act of abortion, even at a point when they are able to survive outside the womb. Science indicates that life begins at conception, and to deny the life of certain human beings at young ages is an attack on human rights. No person’s life should be in jeopardy simply based upon his or her age. Only in the womb do our laws allow some humans to be accorded the full rights of personhood and some not.

Additionally, this legislation is not in the best interest of women as it removes abortion clinics from regulations for serious medical procedures. The Church is committed to upholding the dignity of women but does not believe that abortion is a solution when challenging situations arise. Rather, working towards a society where both mother and child are cared for is the true path of justice and compassion.

I am aware that some of the legislators who voted in favor of this legislation believe that it violates their own conscience. Yet, for them party loyalty, even on such a weighty moral issue, has seemingly trumped conscience.

Abortion is an illogical and inconsistent policy for anyone who stands for human rights. To allow one person to decide whether another person lives or dies is even more capricious than the death penalty or war.

Ironically, as Illinois expands the legal and even constitutional right to abortion, many of its neighboring states have moved to restrict abortion. Clearly, we are a divided society on this issue. The Catholic Church stakes its position on the ultimate belief that God creates every human person and endows each of them with the right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

What is the RCIA?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pentecost is one of my favorite feasts of the whole year. I have always had a great love for the Holy Spirit. My first Mass as a priest was celebrated on Pentecost in 2006, which was a great delight to me. Pentecost reminds us of our call to go forth and continue the Church's mission to bring all people to salvation. Here at Saint Mary's we are blessed to have the program "Catholics Returning Home," led by Deacon Tom O'Connell, and this is often followed up by the RCIA, the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

I love the RCIA. I think it is such an important ministry of the Church. It's one of the ways that the Church responds to Jesus' command in the Gospel: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20a) It's the Church's most important mission: to baptize and confirm people in the faith so that we can all go together to eternal life (cf. Rule of Saint Benedict, 72).

I think there may be a lack of understanding of what the RCIA is and of the process of "becoming Catholic." If you've never gone through it or known someone who has gone through it, you just don't get exposed to it that much. Basically, the RCIA is the Church's process of "initiation" which, like other initiations, helps the candidate to understand the Church and Christ and helps them be part of both. It's not a set schedule of "classes to become Catholic," or at least it's not supposed to be. The idea of the RCIA is that everyone is at a different place on their faith journey, and the process should be (and at Saint Mary's, is) tailored to the individual.

The RCIA comprises the three Sacraments of Initiation, which are, of course, Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. If one has never been baptized before, that person receives all three sacraments, usually at the Easter Vigil. But if one has been previously baptized, in most Christian denominations, one does not get baptized a second time. "[There is] one Lord, one faith, *one baptism*, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all." (Ephesians 4:5-6) Thus these candidates do not need to wait for an upcoming Easter Vigil, because that celebration is for Baptism. We can receive them into full communion with the Church, imparting the sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist, at any Solemnity of the Lord.

The Holy Church rejoices when a soul is claimed for the Lord, and when a person is added to the Church. It makes our community that much stronger, it brings the fullness of God's kingdom closer to fruition, it shows the Holy Spirit's activity in the world, renewing the face of the earth.

So, three requests this week: First, pray that the Holy Spirit would work in the hearts of those who need to be received into the Church. Second, invite someone you know who is not Catholic to join our community of faith. Third, consider joining our team. We are in special need of people to sit down with people and have a conversation with them to help us determine what their RCIA path needs to be. If you or someone you know wants to have more information about becoming Catholic, please give us a call at the parish office.

De este modo, los tres sacramentos de la iniciación cristiana se combinan estrechamente para llevarnos a nosotros, los fieles de Cristo, a su plena estatura y permitirnos llevar a cabo la misión de todo el pueblo de Dios en la Iglesia y en el mundo.

¿Qué es el Programa RICA?

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

Pentecostés es una de mis fiestas favoritas de todo el año. Siempre he tenido un gran amor por el Espíritu Santo. Mi primera misa como sacerdote se celebró en Pentecostés en el 2006, lo cual fue un gran placer para mí. Pentecostés nos recuerda nuestro llamado a seguir adelante y continuar la misión de la Iglesia de llevar a todas las personas a la salvación. Aquí, en Santa María, tenemos la bendición de tener el programa "Los católicos vuelven a casa", dirigido por el diácono Tom O'Connell, y esto es seguido a menudo por el programa de RICA, el Rito de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos.

Me encanta el programa de RICA. Creo que es un ministerio tan importante de la Iglesia. Es una de las formas en que la Iglesia responde al mandato de Jesús en el Evangelio: "Id, pues, y haced discípulos a todas las naciones, bautizándolos en el nombre del Padre y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo y enséñenles a cumplir todo lo que yo les he encomendado a ustedes"(Mateo 28: 19-20a) Es la misión más importante de la Iglesia: bautizar y confirmar a las personas en la fe para que todos podamos ir juntos a la vida eterna (cf. Regla de San Benedicto, 72).

Creo que hay una falta de comprensión de lo que es el programa RICA y del proceso de "volverse católico". Si nunca has pasado por el programa o no has conocido a alguien que lo ha hecho, simplemente te has expuesto a él. Básicamente, RICA es el proceso de "iniciación" de la Iglesia que, al igual que otras iniciaciones, ayuda al candidato a comprender a la Iglesia y a Cristo y los ayuda a ser parte de ambos. No es un horario fijo de "clases para convertirse en católico", o al menos no se supone que sea. La idea de RICA es que todos están en un lugar diferente en su jornada de fe, y el proceso debe ser (y en el de Santa María, es) adaptado al individuo.

RICA comprende los tres Sacramentos de Iniciación, que son, por supuesto, el Bautismo, la Confirmación y la Eucaristía. Si uno nunca ha sido bautizado antes, esa persona recibe los tres sacramentos, generalmente en la Vigilia Pascual. Pero si uno ha sido bautizado previamente, en la mayoría de las denominaciones cristianas, uno no se bautiza por segunda vez. "[Hay] un solo Señor, una sola fe, un solo bautismo, un solo Dios y Padre de todos, que está sobre todos y por todos y en todos" (Efesios 4: 5-6). Por lo tanto, estos candidatos no necesitan esperar a la próxima Vigilia Pascual, porque esa celebración es para el Bautismo. Podemos recibirlos en plena comunión con la Iglesia, impartiendo los sacramentos de la Confirmación y la Primera Eucaristía, en cualquier solemnidad del Señor.

La Santa Iglesia se regocija cuando se reclama un alma por el Señor, y cuando una persona se agrega a la Iglesia. Hace que nuestra comunidad sea mucho más fuerte, hace que la plenitud del reino de Dios se haga más fructífera, muestra la actividad del Espíritu Santo en el mundo, renovando la faz de la tierra.

Entonces, quiero pedirles tres cosas esta semana: primero, oren para que el Espíritu Santo obre en los corazones de aquellos que necesitan ser recibidos en la Iglesia. Y segundo, invite a alguien que sepa que no sea católico a unirse a nuestra comunidad de fe. Tercero, considera unirse a nuestro equipo. Tenemos una necesidad especial de personas que se sienten con personas y conversen con ellos para ayudarnos a determinar cuál debe ser su ruta a RICA. Si usted o alguien que conoce desean obtener más información sobre cómo convertirse en católico, llámenos a la oficina parroquial.

Zatem trzy sakramenty wtajemniczenia chrześcijańskiego ściśle łączą się, aby doprowadzić nas, wiernych Chrystusa, do jego pełnego wzrostu i umożliwić nam pełnienie misji całego ludu Bożego w Kościele i na świecie.

Czym jest RCIA?

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Zesłanie Ducha Świętego jest jednym z moich ulubionych świąt całego roku. Zawsze miałem wielką miłość do Ducha Świętego. Moja pierwsza Msza jako kapłana była obchodzona w dniu Pięćdziesiątnicy w 2006 r., Co było dla mnie wielką radością. Zesłanie Ducha Świętego przypomina nam o naszym wezwaniu do kontynuowania misji Kościoła, aby doprowadzić wszystkich ludzi do zbawienia. W Saint Mary's jesteśmy błogosławieni tym, że mamy program „Katolicy przychodzą do domu”, prowadzony przez Deacona Toma O'Connell, a często jest to kontynuowane przez RCIA, Rytuał chrześcijańskiej inicjacji dorosłych.

Kocham RCIA. Myślę, że jest to tak ważna posługa Kościoła. Jest to jeden ze sposobów, w jaki Kościół odpowiada na polecenie Jezusa w Ewangelii: „Idźcie więc i nauczajcie wszystkie narody, chrzcząc je w imię Ojca i Syna, i Ducha Świętego, nauczając aby przestrzegali wszystkiego, co wam przykazałem ”(Mateusza 28: 19-20a). To najważniejsza misja Kościoła: chrzczyć i potwierdzać ludzi w wierze, abyśmy wszyscy mogli iść razem do życia wiecznego (por. Reguła Świętego Benedykt, 72).

Myślę, że może brakować zrozumienia tego, czym jest RCIA i procesu „stawania się katolikiem”. Jeśli nigdy tego nie doświadczyłeś lub nie znasz kogoś, kto przez to przeszedł, po prostu nie narażasz się na to tak dużo. Zasadniczo, RCIA jest procesem „inicjacji” Kościoła, który, podobnie jak inne inicjacje, pomaga kandydatowi zrozumieć Kościół i Chrystusa i pomaga im być częścią obu. To nie jest ustalony harmonogram „zajęć, które mają stać się katolikami”, a przynajmniej nie powinny być. Ideą RCIA jest to, że każdy jest w innym miejscu na swojej drodze wiary, a proces powinien być (i na Świętej Maryi) dostosowany do indywidualnej osoby.

RCIA obejmuje trzy sakramenty inicjacji, które są oczywiście chrztem, bierzmowaniem i eucharystią. Jeśli ktoś nigdy wcześniej nie został ochrzczony, otrzymuje wszystkie trzy sakramenty, zwykle w Wigilię Paschalną. Ale jeśli ktoś został wcześniej ochrzczony, w większości chrześcijańskich wyznań chrześcijańskich, nie zostaje ochrzczony po raz drugi. „Jest jeden Pan, jedna wiara, jeden chrzest, jeden Bóg i Ojciec wszystkich, który jest ponad wszystkimi i przez wszystkich i we wszystkich” (Efezjan 4: 5-6). Zatem ci kandydaci nie muszą czekać na nadchodzącą Wigilię Paschalną, ponieważ to święto jest przeznaczone na chrzest. Możemy przyjąć ich w pełnej komunii z Kościołem, udzielając sakramentów bierzmowania i pierwszej Eucharystii, w każdą uroczystość Pana.

Kościół Święty raduje się, gdy dusza jest żądana dla Pana i kiedy do Kościoła dodaje się osobę. To sprawia, że nasza społeczność jest o wiele silniejsza, przybliża pełnię królestwa Bożego, pokazuje działanie Ducha Świętego na świecie, odnawiając oblicze ziemi.

Tak więc trzy prośby w tym tygodniu: Po pierwsze, módlcie się, aby Duch Święty działał w sercach tych, którzy muszą zostać przyjęci do Kościoła. Po drugie, zaproś kogoś, kogo znasz, który nie jest katolikiem, aby przyłączył się do naszej wspólnoty wiary. Po trzecie, rozważ dołączenie do naszego zespołu. Szczególnie potrzebujemy ludzi, aby usiedli z ludźmi i rozmawiali z nimi, aby pomóc nam określić, jaką ścieżką musi być ich RCIA. Jeśli Ty lub ktoś, kogo znasz, chce uzyskać więcej informacji na temat zostania katolikiem, zadzwoń do nas do biura parafialnego.

Donating appreciated securities offers considerable tax advantages. Donors can deduct the current market value of a stock donation on the date of the gift and do not have to recognize the income from any related appreciation of the securities. To make a stock donation, instruct your broker to transfer the shares you wish to contribute to the Diocese of Joliet's account with Stofan, Agazzi and Co., Inc. Your broker will need to know the Diocese's DTC #0141 and the Diocesan Account #2496-9663. Donors are strongly encouraged to notify the diocese by calling 815-221-6192 on or around the date of such a gift and provide your name, the company name of the stock and the number of shares to be transferred so that the donation can be quickly processed and properly credited to St. Mary Immaculate Parish.

IRA Charitable Rollover

For donors 70-1/2 or older, a charitable gift of up to \$100,000 (\$200,000 for married couples) can be made from your IRA account tax free for federal income tax purposes. The gift must come from a traditional or Roth IRA and be transferred directly from your IRA to St. Mary Immaculate Parish in order to be tax-free. The amount donated will count toward your minimum required distribution and does not increase your taxable income.

Bequest Intentions

Donors who wish to leave some portion of their estate to support St. Mary Immaculate Parish are encouraged to have their attorney or estate planning professional include specific language in their will that identifies the charitable beneficiary as St. Mary Immaculate Parish.
