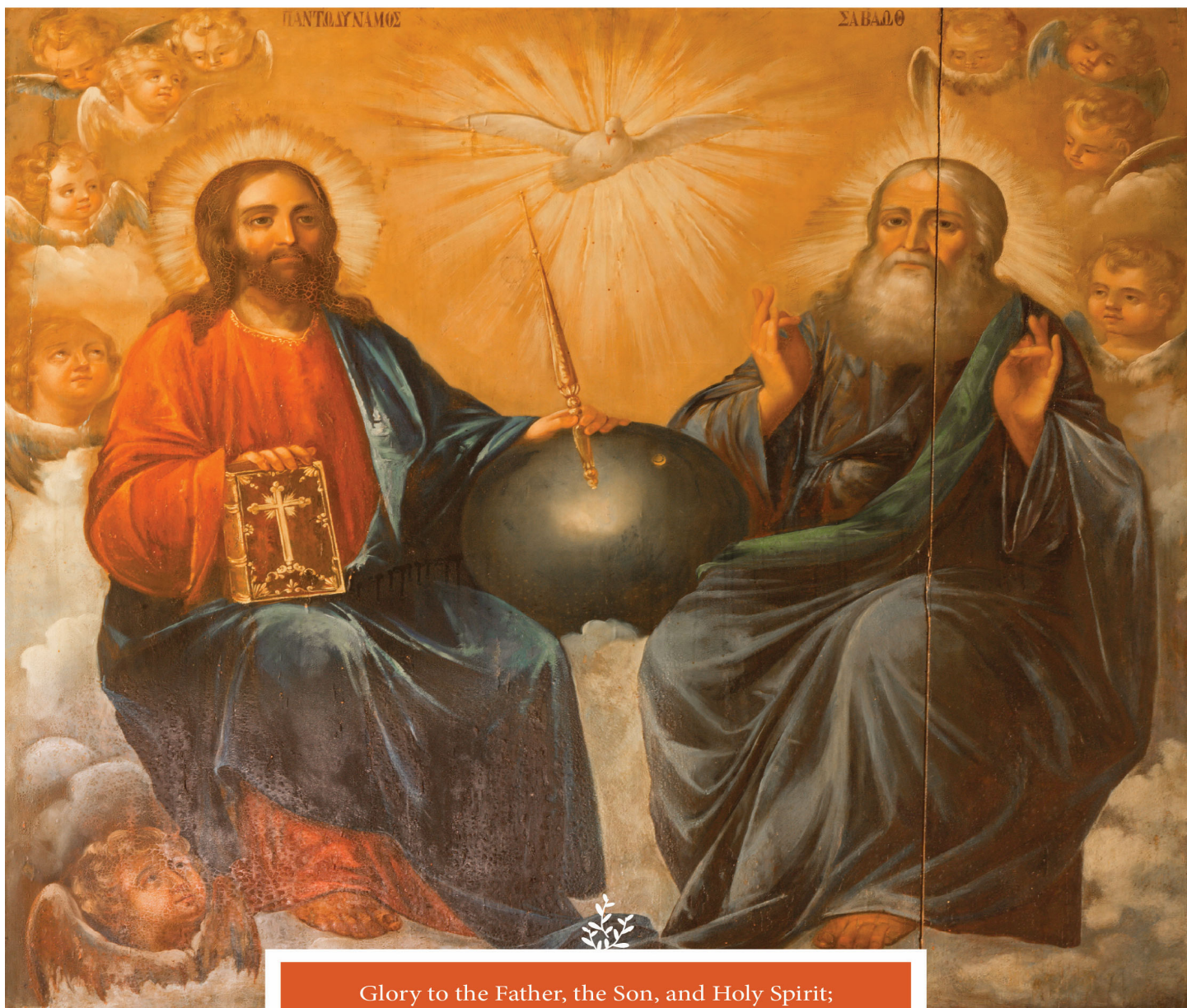

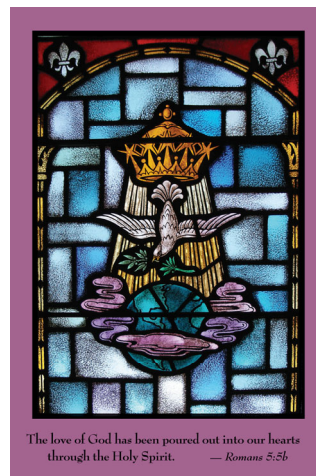

What is a Eucharistic Procession and Why Are We Doing It?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

One of the most distinctive parts of the Catholic faith is our belief in, and our reverence and love for, the Holy Eucharist. Our belief that Christ is present in our midst until the end of time (cf. Matthew 28:20) is one that has reality in the Eucharist. Christ gives himself to us: body, blood, soul and divinity in the appearance of bread and wine in order to nourish our bodies and spirits, to give us strength to make the journey to eternal life, and to give us the spiritual strength to live our vocations and accomplish the mission God has given us in life. We are never alone, never floundering on our own, never without the love and grace of God in Christ, if only we are open to it.

Given this strong belief, it is obvious that we would celebrate and worship the Blessed Sacrament, Christ present in the Eucharist, with all the joy the Church can stir up! That's why we have been observing our Year of the Eucharist as a parish this past year. That comes to a close next week, and we will mark that, as we did the opening of the year of the Eucharist last year, with the glorious feast of *Corpus Christi*, which we now call the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. On this feast, we as a Church give particular reverence to our celebration of the Eucharist. We celebrate Mass with great joy, we take time for worship of the Blessed Sacrament in Adoration, and we give public witness to our faith as we join in Eucharistic Procession.

Next week, we will come together as a community in Eucharistic Procession. We will begin that with a bilingual (English/Spanish) Mass at 12:15 in the Church, then process around the campus, pausing along the way, and ending back in Church. Along the way, we will sing Eucharistic Songs and pause at three altars for prayer and benediction. Following the procession, adoration will be available in Church until 5:45 pm, at which time we will have a final benediction, followed by the 6pm Mass.

All are welcome to join us as they are able. Knights of Columbus are encouraged to walk in their regalia, those who received First Holy Communion this year are encouraged to wear their First Communion dresses or suits (although with suitable walking shoes!), scouts (boy and girl!) can wear their uniforms, members of various ministries can wear their shirts, etc.

This is a joyful celebration of our Eucharistic faith; we are showing the great joy that we have that our Lord is present to us always in the Blessed Sacrament! Please don't miss this celebration of our community's faith!

Oh, and be sure to pray for nice weather. Not too hot, if possible: we have a lot of vestments to wear! I look forward to celebrating with you!

¿Qué es una procesión eucarística y por qué lo estamos haciendo?

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

Una de las partes más distintivas de la fe católica es nuestra creencia y nuestra reverencia y amor por la Sagrada Eucaristía. Nuestra creencia de que Cristo está presente entre nosotros hasta el fin de los tiempos (cf. Mateo 28:20) es algo que toma realidad en la Eucaristía. Cristo se entrega a nosotros mismos: cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad en la aparición del pan y el vino para alimentar nuestros cuerpos y espíritus, para darnos fuerzas para hacer el viaje a la vida eterna y para darnos la fuerza espiritual para vivir nuestras vocaciones y cumplir la misión que Dios nos ha dado en la vida. Nunca estamos solos, nunca luchamos solos, nunca sin el amor y la gracia de Dios en Cristo, pero únicamente si estamos abiertos a ello.

Dada esta fuerte creencia, es obvio que celebraríamos y adoraríamos al Santísimo Sacramento, Cristo presente en la Eucaristía, ¡con toda la alegría que la Iglesia puede despertar! Es por eso que durante el año pasado, juntos como parroquia hemos estado celebrando el Año de la Eucaristía. Esto concluirá la próxima semana y lo marcaremos, como lo hicimos en la apertura del año de la Eucaristía el año pasado, con la gloriosa fiesta de Corpus Christi, que ahora llamamos la Solemnidad del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. En esta fiesta, nosotros, como Iglesia, damos particular respeto a nuestra celebración de la Eucaristía. Celebramos la Misa con gran alegría, nos tomamos el tiempo para adorar al Santísimo Sacramento en Adoración y damos testimonio público de nuestra fe cuando nos

unimos en la Procesión Eucarística.

La próxima semana, nos uniremos como comunidad en la Procesión Eucarística. Comenzaremos con una misa bilingüe (inglés / español) a las 12:15 en la Iglesia, luego procesaremos alrededor del edificio, haciendo una pausa en el camino y terminando de nuevo en la Iglesia. En el camino, cantaremos canciones eucarísticas y nos detendremos en tres altares para la oración y la bendición. Después de la procesión, la adoración estará disponible en la Iglesia hasta las 5:45 pm, momento en el que tendremos una bendición final, seguida de la misa de las 6pm.

Todos los que puedan son bienvenidos a unirse a nosotros. Se alienta a los Caballeros de Colón a caminar con sus atuendos, a los que recibieron la Primera Comunión este año se les recomienda usar sus vestidos o trajes de Primera Comunión (¡aunque se les recomienda que usen zapatos adecuados para caminar!), Los scouts (¡niños y niñas!) pueden usar sus uniformes, los miembros de varios ministerios pueden usar sus camisas, etc.

Esta es una celebración gozosa de nuestra fe eucarística; ¡Estamos mostrando la gran alegría que tenemos de que nuestro Señor está presente para nosotros siempre en el Santísimo Sacramento! ¡No te pierdas esta celebración de la fe de nuestra comunidad!

Ah, y asegúrese de orar por buen clima. No demasiado caliente, si es posible ya que tenemos muchas prendas que ponernos! ¡Tengo deseos de celebrar este día con todos ustedes!

Czym jest procesja eucharystyczna i dlaczego to robimy?

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Jedną z najbardziej charakterystycznych części wiary katolickiej jest nasza wiara, cześć i miłość do Świętej Eucharystii. Nasze przekonanie, że Chrystus jest obecny pośród nas aż do końca czasów (por. Mt 28, 20), ma rzeczywistość w Eucharystii. Chrystus daje nam Swoje: ciało, krew, duszę i boskość w wyglądzie chleba i wina, aby karmić nasze ciało i ducha, daje nam siłę abyśmy mogli podążać do życia wiecznego wypełniając misję apostolską. Nigdy nie jesteśmy sami, nigdy nie brniemy na własną rękę, nigdy bez miłości i łaski Boga w Chrystusie, jeśli tylko jesteśmy otwarci na nią.

Biorąc pod uwagę tę silną wiarę, jest oczywiste, że będziemy świętować i czcić Najświętszy Sakrament, Chrystusa obecnego w Eucharystii, z całą radością jaką Kościół może wzbudzić! Dlatego właśnie tak ważny był Rok Eucharystii jaki świętowaliśmy w naszej parafii. W przyszłym tygodniu zakończymy obchody w ten sam sposób jak rozpoczęliśmy rok Eucharystii w ubiegłym roku, - tj. chwalebny świętem Bożego Ciała, które teraz nazywamy uroczystością Ciała i Krwi Chrystusa. W czasie tego święta, jako Kościół, darzymy szczególną czią naszą celebrację Eucharystii. Odprawiamy Mszę świętą z wielką radością, poświęcamy czas na uwielbienie Najświętszego Sakramentu w adoracji i dajemy publiczne świadectwo naszej wierze, gdy przystępujemy do procesji eucharystycznej.

W przyszłym tygodniu spotkamy się jako wspólnota w procesji eucharystycznej. Zaczniemy od dwujęzycznej (angielskiej / hiszpańskiej) mszy o 12:15 w Kościele, a następnie przetworzymy kampus, zatrzymując się po drodze i kończąc w Kościele. Po drodze będziemy śpiewać pieśni eucharystyczne i zatrzymywać się na trzech ołtarzach w modlitwie i błogosławieństwie. Po procesji adoracja będzie dostępna w Kościele do 17:45, kiedy to otrzymamy ostateczne błogosławieństwo, a następnie będzie odprawiona Msza święta (godz. 18:00)

Wszyscy są mile widziani, aby do nas dołączyć. Rycerze Kolumba są zachęceni do chodzenia w swoich regaliach, ci, którzy w tym roku otrzymali Pierwszą Komunię Świętą, są zachęceni do noszenia sukienek lub garniturów z Pierwszej Komunii Świętej (wygodne buty do chodzenia mogą się sprzydać), Skauci (chłopcy i dziewczęta) swoje mundurki a członkowie poszczególnych wspólnot swoje stroje. Zachęcamy wszystkich.

Poprzez to radosne celebrowanie naszej wiary eucharystycznej; pokazujemy wielką radość, że nasz Pan jest zawsze obecny w Najświętszym Sakramencie! Proszę nie przegap tego święta wiary naszej społeczności!

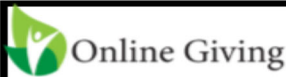

St Mary Immaculate Parish appreciates the generosity of its families. Beside the standard envelopes that could be mailed to you, we provide you three (3) different ways you can sign up to give automatically.

- 1) **Online Giving** program through Our Sunday Visitor. You set your own login and password and control what offertory collections you wish to contribute to and when. (box on the lower right details all our standard collections) You also have the ability to log-in anytime and change the dollar amount and dates.

- 2) **Credit Card Authorization Program** is controlled by the Parish Office. You select the amount and offertory collections you wish to give to and amounts are charged to your credit card on the 5th and or 20th of each month. Simply notify the Parish Office if you need to make a change.

- 3) **Automatic Withdrawal Program** is controlled by the Parish Office. You select the amount and offertory collections you wish to give to and amounts are deducted from your checking or savings account on the 5th and/or 20th of each month. Simply notify the Parish Office if you need to make a change.

These electronic giving options have been designed to help parishioners consistently support the offertory. If you choose option 2 or 3, please return this form to the parish office via the collection basket, mail or email.

Gifts of Appreciated Securities

Donating appreciated securities offers considerable tax advantages. Donors can deduct the current market value of a stock donation on the date of the gift and do not have to recognize the income from any related appreciation of the securities. To make a stock donation, instruct your broker to transfer the shares you wish to contribute to the Diocese of Joliet's account with Stofan, Agazzi and Co., Inc. Your broker will need to know the Diocese's DTC #0141 and the Diocesan Account #2496-9663. Donors are strongly encouraged to notify the diocese by calling 815-221-6192 on or around the date of such a gift and provide your name, the company name of the stock and the number of shares to be transferred so that the donation can be quickly processed and properly credited to St. Mary Immaculate Parish.

IRA Charitable Rollover

For donors 70-1/2 or older, a charitable gift of up to \$100,000 (\$200,000 for married couples) can be made from your IRA account tax free for federal income tax purposes. The gift must come from a traditional or Roth IRA and be transferred directly from your IRA to St. Mary Immaculate Parish in order to be tax-free. The amount donated will count toward your minimum required distribution and does not increase your taxable income.

Bequest Intentions

Donors who wish to leave some portion of their estate to support St. Mary Immaculate Parish are encouraged to have their attorney or estate planning professional include specific language in their will that identifies the charitable beneficiary as St. Mary Immaculate Parish. Donors choosing this philanthropic option are encouraged to notify the Pastor or the business office of their intention so that their generosity may be acknowledged.
