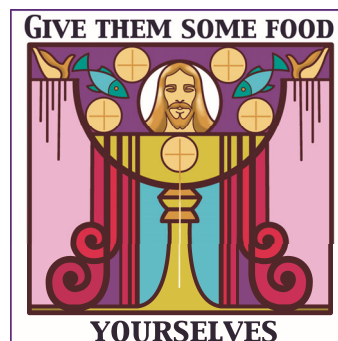

"Give them some food yourselves."
Luke 9:13a

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's Gospel, Jesus manifests his desire that all be fed in his feeding of the multitudes. When the disciples begin to worry about mob action as the day wears on, fearing they aren't prepared to feed such a large crowd, they urge Jesus to cut the homily short and send the crowds home so they can eat. But Jesus isn't having any of that: "Give them some food yourselves," he tells them. And this sets up the crisis that is the backdrop for this wonderful miracle, which essentially foreshadows the giving of the Eucharist.

So as we are miraculously fed beyond our wildest dreams on the Eucharistic bread and wine, become the Body and Blood of our Savior, we too are given the command to feed others: "Give them some food yourselves." What a daunting directive! How can the little that we have to give become anything truly worthy of feeding and caring for so many people, such great need?

And this is the train of thought that creates a kind of crisis of stewardship that we as a Church are currently experiencing. Those who have served the Church so well for so long have grown tired and are due for a break; many have even gone home to the Lord. The problem is that there is no one to take their place these days.

That's behind our vocations crisis, right? It's not that God has stopped calling. It's not that Jesus stopped saying "Give them some food yourselves." It's just that we haven't listened as well as we should, or maybe don't even hear the call. There are so many other competing voices out there, calling people away from their faith: it is indeed hard to hear the call when we're distracted. And it's easy to be distracted by big problems these days, most especially the abuse crisis. But the call is still out there, if we have the faith and love to hear it.

So though we had the ordination of three priests last month, we still need many more than three. And we need permanent deacons, religious brothers and sisters, and so many more. And that's just the tip of the iceberg. We also need liturgical musicians, religious educators, and a whole host of professional people in our parishes. And that is to say nothing of the volunteer ministries here at Saint Mary Immaculate. We can't ignore the call anymore.

If we do ignore the call, it may be a crisis of faith, and it's the same crisis of faith that the disciples grappled with in today's Gospel reading. How can the little that I am able to do or to give be enough to respond to so great a need? And to be honest, I grappled with that for a long time in my vocational discernment. I really didn't want to get on a sinking ship – to face years of hard work alone, just churning out sacraments.

But I came to realize that in thinking that way, I was discounting what God would do in me. I am learning to trust God to accomplish what needs to be done, doing what I can do, as best I can do it, for as long as I can do it. That's all God asks of any of us, and he has indeed blessed that attitude in ways I could never have imagined.

So in these days, I challenge you all to consider what you can do. Can you give an hour or two a week or a month? Can you let that be enough and trust God to use that little bit of time to make great things happen in the Church and in the world? Or maybe, especially you young people, are you being called to do something really important, really wonderful with your life? Will you give them some food yourselves?

"Denles ustedes mismos algo de comer."

Lucas 9: 13a

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús manifiesta su deseo que todos sean alimentados durante la alimentación de las multitudes. Cuando los discípulos comienzan a preocuparse por la acción de la muchedumbre a medida que avanza el día, temiendo que no estén preparados para alimentar a una multitud tan numerosa, animan a Jesús a que interrumpa la homilía y envíe a la multitud a casa para que puedan comer. Pero Jesús no hace nada de eso: "Denles ustedes mismos algo de comer", les dice. Y esto crea la crisis que es el telón de fondo de este maravilloso milagro, que esencialmente presagia la entrega de la Eucaristía.

Entonces, mientras nos alimentamos milagrosamente más allá de nuestros sueños más salvajes de el pan y el vino eucarísticos, nos convertimos en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de nuestro Salvador, a nosotros también se nos da la orden de alimentar a otros: "Denles ustedes mismos algo de comer". ¡Qué directiva tan abrumadora! ¿Cómo puede ser que lo poco que tenemos que dar se convierta en algo verdaderamente digno de alimentar y cuidar a tanta gente, una necesidad tan grande?

Y esta es la línea de pensamiento que crea una especie de crisis de administración que nosotros, como Iglesia, estamos experimentando actualmente. Aquellos que han servido tan bien a la Iglesia durante tanto tiempo se han cansado y deben descansar; muchos incluso han ido a casa del Señor. El problema es que en estos días no hay nadie que tome su lugar.

Eso está detrás de nuestra crisis de vocaciones, ¿verdad? No es que Dios haya dejado de llamar. No es que Jesús dejó de decir "Denles ustedes mismos algo de comer". Es solo que no hemos escuchado tan bien como deberíamos, o tal vez ni siquiera escuchamos la llamada. Hay muchas otras voces que compiten entre sí, que hacen que las personas se alejen de su fe: es realmente difícil escuchar la llamada cuando estamos distraídos. Y es fácil distraerse con grandes problemas en estos días, especialmente con la crisis de abuso. Pero el llamado todavía está ahí, si tenemos la fe y el amor para escucharlo.

De esta manera, aunque tuvimos la ordenación de tres sacerdotes el mes pasado, todavía necesitamos muchos más que tres. Y necesitamos diáconos permanentes, hermanos y hermanas religiosos, y muchos más. Y eso es sólo la punta del iceberg. También necesitamos músicos litúrgicos, educadores religiosos y una gran cantidad de profesionales en nuestras parroquias. Y eso no quiere decir nada de los ministerios voluntarios aquí en Santa María Inmaculada. No podemos ignorar más la llamada.

Si ignoramos el llamado, puede ser una crisis de fe, y es la misma crisis de fe con la que lucharon los discípulos en la lectura del Evangelio de hoy. ¿Cómo es que lo poco que puedo hacer o dar ser suficiente para responder a una necesidad tan grande? Y para ser honesto, lidié con eso durante mucho tiempo en mi discernimiento vocacional. Realmente no quería subirme a un barco que se estaba hundiendo, para enfrentar años de arduo trabajo solo, simplemente realizando sacramentos.

Pero me di cuenta de que al pensar de esa manera, estaba descartando lo que Dios haría en mí. Estoy aprendiendo a confiar en Dios para lograr lo que se necesita hacer, hacer lo que puedo hacer, lo mejor que puedo hacerlo, mientras pueda hacerlo. Eso es todo lo que Dios nos pide a cualquiera de nosotros, y de hecho él ha bendecido esa actitud de una forma que nunca podría haber imaginado.

Así que en estos días, los desafío a todos a considerar lo que pueden hacer. ¿Puede usted dar una hora o dos a la semana o al mes? ¿Puede permitir que eso sea suficiente y confiar en que Dios usará ese poco de tiempo para hacer que sucedan grandes cosas en la Iglesia y en el mundo? O quizás, especialmente ustedes, jóvenes, ¿están siendo llamados a hacer algo realmente importante, realmente maravilloso con su vida? ¿Les darían ustedes mismos algo de comer?

„Dajcie im jeść”.
Łukasz 9: 13a

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

W dzisiejszej Ewangelii Jezus manifestuje swoje pragnienie, aby wszyscy byli nakarmieni. Kiedy uczniowie zaczynają się martwić, że nie są przygotowani na nakarmienie tak dużego tłumu, wzywają Jezusa aby skrócił homilię i wysłał ludzi do domu. Ale Jezus ma inny plan: „Dajcie im trochę jedzenia”, powiada. I w ten sposób wykorzystuje kryzys do wykonania wielkiego cudu, który zasadniczo zapowiada ustanowienie Eucharystii.

Tak więc, kiedy jesteśmy cudownie karmieni chlebem i winem eucharystycznym to jednocześnie stajemy się Ciałem i Krwią naszego Zbawiciela. My również otrzymaliśmy polecenie nakarmienia innych: „Dajcie im trochę jedzenia”. Co za trudna dyrektywa! Jak można nakarmić rzeszę szczególnie wobec tak wielkiej potrzeby?

I to jest ciąg myśli pewnego kryzysu, którego obecnie doświadczamy jako Kościół. Ci, którzy tak długo służyli Kościołowi, zmęczeni się; wielu odeszło do domu Pana. Problem polega na tym, że obecnie nie ma wystarczająco tych, którzy zajęliby ich miejsce.

Czyżby zapanował kryzys powołań? Nie chodzi o to, że Bóg przestał wzywać. To nie jest tak, że Jezus przestał mówić: „Dajcie im trochę jedzenia”. Po prostu nie słuchamy tak dobrze, jak powinniśmy, a może nawet wogóle nic nie słyszymy. Jest tak wiele innych konkurencyjnych głosów, które wzywają ludzi do odejścia od wiary: naprawdę trudno jest usłyszeć Pana Jezusa, gdy jesteśmy zajęci innymi sprawami. W dzisiejszych czasach łatwo jest słyszeć inne głosy, zwłaszcza teraz w dobie kryzysu nadużyć przez duchownych. Ale Boże wezwanie wciąż istnieje, jeśli tylko mamy wiarę i miłość, aby je usłyszeć.

Tak więc, pomimo wyświęceń trzech nowych księży w naszej diecezji, wciąż potrzebujemy ich więcej. Potrzebujemy stałych diakonów, braci i siostr zakonnych i wielu innych posługujących Panu. A to tylko wierzchołek góry lodowej. Potrzebujemy także muzyków liturgicznych, wychowawców religijnych i całego grona profesjonalistów w naszych parafiach. Nie mówiąc już o służbie wolontariuszy w Saint Mary Imacualate. Nie możemy już dłużej ignorować naszego powołania w służbie naszemu Zbawicielowi.

Jeśli zignorujemy to wezwanie, to może to oznaczać kryzys wiary i ten sam kryzys wiary, z którym zmagali się uczniowie podczas dzisiejszej Ewangelii. Jak niewiele jest wymagane aby odpowiedzieć na tak wielką potrzebę. I szczerze mówiąc, sam zmagam się z tym przez długi czas w moim rozeznawaniu powołaniowym. Naprawdę nie chciałem wsiąść na tonący statek - stawieć czoła latom ciężkiej pracy w pojedynkę żeby “jedynie” wydawać sakramenty.

Ale zdałem sobie sprawę, że myśląc w ten sposób, obniżam wartość Bożej Łaski i tego co Bóg we mnie uczyni. Uczę się ufać Bogu, robiąc to, co mogę, najlepiej jak potrafię, tak długo, jak mogę to robić. To wszystko, o co Bóg prosi każdego z nas, a on rzeczywiście pobłogosławił moją działalność w sposób, jakiego nigdy wcześniej nie mogłem sobie wyobrazić.

W tych dniach wzywam was wszystkich do zastanowienia się, co możecie zrobić. Czy możesz ofiarować godzinę lub dwie w tygodniu lub miesiącu? Czy możesz pozwolić, aby to wystarczyło i zaufać Bogu, że wykorzysta ten mały czas, aby wielkie rzeczy wydarzyły się w Kościele i na świecie? A może, zwłaszcza wy, młodzi ludzie, jesteście wezwani do zrobienia czegoś naprawdę ważnego, naprawdę cudownego w swoim życiu? Dasz im trochę jedzenia?

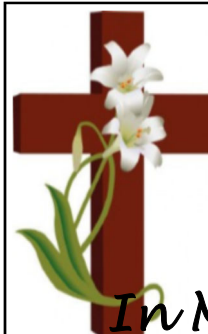

Eucharistic Adoration at SMIP

This year's Feast of Corpus Christi also marks the 17th anniversary of our Eucharistic Adoration Ministry, where more than 100,000 hours of prayer have been offered since 2002. Pope Francis stated that Eucharistic Adoration is "the secret to knowing the love of Jesus Christ."

The SMIP Adoration Chapel is open with exposition continuously from 7 p.m. Sundays through 9 p.m. Fridays, which is possible due to the volunteers who come for regular weekly Holy Hours. There are currently a number of open hours at various times of the day and night needing a regular adorer—substitute volunteers are always appreciated, too, since the ministry finds a substitute for you whenever you can't make it. Do you have one hour per week to spend with Jesus?
