The Word from Fr. Pat / La Palabra del Padre Pat

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I've been talking in my homilies these days about the tools for discipleship that we find in the Gospel readings of summer Ordinary Time. These readings are a gold mine for us, because we are all called to discipleship, called to live out our baptism in the real world. But we may often be at a loss as to how to accomplish this. The readings of this season, I think, give us a blueprint, or better, a bit of a spiritual toolbox that shows how we are to live as followers of Christ.

In this week's Gospel we are instructed on what is perhaps the first thing we have to figure out in this quest. We are told that we need to live out the greatest of the laws which boils down to love of God and love of neighbor. Love of God and neighbor are inextricably linked, because as Saint John tells us, “If anyone says, ‘I love God,’ but hates his brother, he is a liar; for whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen.” (1 John 4:20)

So first things first when it comes to the journey of discipleship. Who even cares about being a disciple unless he or she has fallen head-over-heels in love with God? And as we're told, loving God means loving the people God gives us as though they themselves were God. So loving others leads us to loving God more perfectly, which always leads us to discipleship, in which we have the opportunity to do something with the love that we have, with the great love we have been given.

Love is that experience that we have that makes us most like God. God himself is love, and he cannot not love. He created all of us out of love, and loves us enough to respect our free will but continue to reach out to convert us. So when we authentically love another person, we participate in God in a way that is authentic and life-giving.

The laws of the Old Testament are daunting. Scripture scholars have counted well over 600 laws that the observant Jew was and is expected to follow. But Jesus boils it down for us today: love of God and love of neighbor are the first of the commandments, and for good reason. Putting this into practice is the great project of our lives, the opportunity that we have that brings us into communion with our God who made us out of love and made us to be one with him.

Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind and soul, and love your neighbor as yourself. These are the tenets that we could all memorize and practice that will make us one with him forever. We should pray the Act of Love every day:

O my God, I love you above all things, with my whole heart and soul, because you are all-good and worthy of all love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of you. I forgive all who have injured me, and I ask pardon of all whom I have injured.

The Word from Fr. Pat / La Palabra del Padre Pat

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

En estos días he estado hablando en mis homilias sobre las herramientas para el discipulado que encontramos en las lecturas del Evangelio del Tiempo Ordinario de verano. Estas lecturas son una mina de oro para nosotros, porque todos estamos llamados al discipulado, llamados a vivir nuestro bautismo en el mundo real. Pero a menudo podemos no saber cómo lograrlo. Las lecturas de esta temporada, creo que nos dan un plano, o mejor aún, una caja de herramientas espirituales que muestran cómo debemos vivir como seguidores de Cristo.

En el Evangelio de esta semana se nos instruye sobre lo que quizás sea lo primero que tenemos que resolver en esta búsqueda. Se nos dice que tenemos que cumplir la mayor de las leyes que se reduce al amor de Dios y al prójimo. El amor a Dios y al prójimo están inextricablemente vinculados, porque como dice San Juan: "Si alguien dice: 'Amo a Dios', pero odia a su hermano, es un mentiroso; porque el que no ama a un hermano que ha visto, no puede amar a Dios a quien no ha visto." (1 Juan 4:20)

Así que lo primero es lo primero cuando se trata del viaje del discipulado. ¿A quién le importa ser un discípulo a menos que se haya enamorado de Dios? Y como se nos dice, amar a Dios significa amar a la gente que Dios nos da como si ellos mismos fueran Dios. Así que amar a otros nos lleva a amar a Dios más perfectamente, lo que siempre nos lleva al discipulado, en el que tenemos la oportunidad de hacer algo con el amor que tenemos, con el gran amor que se nos ha dado.

El amor es esa experiencia que tenemos que nos hace más como Dios. Dios mismo es amor, y él no puede no amar a alguien. Él nos creó a todos por amor, y nos ama lo suficiente como para respetar nuestro libre albedrío, pero continúa esforzándonos para convertirnos. Entonces, cuando amamos auténticamente a otra persona, participamos en Dios de una manera que es auténtica y vivificante.

Las leyes del Antiguo Testamento son desalentadoras. Los eruditos de las Escrituras han contado más de 600 leyes que el judío debía observar y seguir. Pero Jesús nos lo confirma hoy: el amor de Dios y el amor al prójimo son los primeros mandamientos, y por una buena razón. Poner esto en práctica es el gran proyecto de nuestras vidas, la oportunidad que tenemos que nos lleva a la comunión con nuestro Dios que nos creó del amor y nos hizo ser uno con él.

Ama al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, mente y alma, y ama a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. Estos son los principios que todos podríamos memorizar y practicar que nos harán uno con él para siempre. Debemos rezar el Acto de Amor todos los días:

Oh, Dios mío, te amo sobre todas las cosas, con todo mi corazón y toda mi alma, porque Tu eres todo bondad y merecedor de todo mi amor. Amo a mi prójimo como a mí mismo por amor a ti. Perdono a todos los que me han injuriado, y pido perdón a quien he injuriado.
