What Do I Do When My Kids Won't Go to Church?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I think the question I get most often as a pastor is the one in the title above: What do I do when my kids won't go to Church? It's probably not much comfort, but I'll tell you, I ask the same thing about some of my family members. It's a problem that touches all of us, I think. If it's not your children, it's your grandchildren, or someone else quite close to you.

You probably did everything right, or at least the best you could. You raised them going to church, you took them with you on Sunday and every Holy Day, you visited churches for Mass when you were travelling. You may have sent them to a Catholic school, or to religious education. Clearly, you took seriously the promise made at your child's baptism: "You have asked to have your child baptized. In doing so, you are accepting the responsibility of training him in the practice of the faith. It will be your duty to bring them up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbor. Do you clearly understand what you are undertaking?"

But we know the lay of the land here. Our prevailing culture is not just apathetic to faith, but actually antagonistic toward it. It's hard for young people to live the faith because they are judged for doing so. And, although it's a disaster, it seems for many people to make sense to live with a morality that tests everything by how it makes them feel. "It seems right for me," they say, which is a standard so much easier to live by than to accept that some things are right and others are not. Striving for moral excellence has been beaten down to being a "basically nice person." And a life devoted to Our Lord has taken a back seat to being "spiritual but not religious."

Add to that the very real failures of our Church: the scandal of clergy sexual abuse, misuse of funds, and in many cases a failure to welcome. People look at the Church and judge her by the actions of her members. It's understandable, in many cases, that they walk away.

So what do we do now? We can't just abandon them; we dare not do so. I don't have an easy answer for you; I sure wish I did. But here is some advice that I would give. First, it's not your fault. If you've done everything you can, but they still have gone away, recognize that you're not the only influence on your child, and that she or he has a mind of their own. In some ways, they need to accept the faith on their own. You've done your best to give it to them, now they have to respond to that.

Second, keep praying. Saint Monica prayed for her son Augustine for years and with many tears. He not only accepted the faith eventually, but also became a great saint that brought many others back to the faith. Saint Monica is a wonderful intercessor for you in your sadness.

And third, keep that door open. Urge but don't force. Invite but don't argue. You can't lose the relationship with them over this: you may be their only connection (however tenuous they have made it) with Jesus right now. Something is better than nothing.

Finally, keep the faith yourself. Keep growing in your own faith so that you can be a more effective witness to them and others every day. Attend a bible study, go to an adult faith formation event, devote yourself to prayer of all kinds, reach out to the poor and needy. Authentic, lived faith is contagious.

And know that I'm praying for you in all of this. May we all go together one day to everlasting life.

¿Qué puedo hacer si mis hijos no van a la iglesia?

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

Creo que la pregunta que más me hacen como pastor es la del título anterior: ¿Qué puedo hacer si mis hijos no van a la Iglesia? Probablemente no sea mucho consuelo, pero les diré que les pregunto lo mismo a algunos de los miembros de mi familia. Creo que es un problema que nos afecta a todos. Si no son los hijos, son los nietos o alguien más cercano a usted.

Probablemente usted hizo todo bien, o al menos lo mejor que pudo. Los criaron yendo a la iglesia, los llevaron con ustedes a Misa los domingos y cada día festivo, visitaron iglesias al ir a misa cuando viajaron. Es posible que los hayan enviado a una escuela católica o al catecismo. Claramente, usted tomó en serio la promesa hecha en el bautismo de su hijo: "Usted pide que su hijo sea bautizado. Al hacerlo, acepta la responsabilidad de educarlo en la práctica de la fe. Es su deber criarlo para guardar los mandamientos de Dios como Cristo nos enseñó, amando a Dios y al prójimo. ¿Entiende claramente lo que está emprendiendo?

Sin embargo, nosotros sabemos la realidad que vivimos. Nuestra cultura prevaleciente no es solo apática a la fe, sino en realidad antagónica hacia ella. Es difícil para los jóvenes vivir la fe porque son juzgados por hacerlo. Y, aunque es un desastre, a muchas personas les parece lógico vivir con una moralidad que pone a prueba todo por cómo los hace sentir. "Me parece que está bien", dicen, este es un estándar mucho más fácil de cumplir que aceptar que algunas cosas están bien y otras no. La lucha por la excelencia moral se ha convertido simplemente en ser una "persona básicamente agradable". Y una vida dedicada a Nuestro Señor ha pasado a ser "espiritual pero no religiosa".

Agregue a eso los verdaderos fracasos de nuestra Iglesia: el escándalo del abuso sexual por parte del clero, el mal uso de los fondos y, en muchos casos, la falta de bienvenida. La gente mira a la Iglesia y la juzga por las acciones de sus miembros. En muchos casos, es comprensible, que se vayan.

Entonces, ¿qué hacemos ahora? No podemos simplemente abandonarlos; no nos atreveríamos a hacerlo. No tengo una respuesta fácil para ustedes; seguro que me encantaría. Sin embargo, aquí hay algunos consejos que les puedo dar. Primero, no es su culpa. Si ha hecho todo lo que puede, pero aún se han ido, reconozca que no es la única influencia sobre su hijo y que él o ella tienen una mente propia. De alguna manera, necesitan aceptar la fe por sí mismos. Ha hecho todo lo posible para dárselo, ahora tienen que responder a eso.

Segundo, continúe orando. Santa Mónica rezó por su hijo Agustín durante años y con muchas lágrimas. Con el tiempo no solo aceptó la fe, sino que también se convirtió en un gran santo que trajo a muchos otros a la fe. Santa Mónica es una intercesora maravillosa para usted en su tristeza.

Y tercero, mantenga esa puerta abierta. Anime pero no fuerce. Invite pero no discuta. No puede perder la relación con ellos por esto: puede ser su única conexión (por muy tenue que la hayan hecho) con Jesús en este momento. Algo es mejor que nada.

Finalmente, mantenga la fe usted mismo. Siga creciendo en su propia fe para que pueda ser un testigo más efectivo de ellos y de los demás todos los días. Asista a un estudio bíblico, asista a un evento de formación de adultos en la fe, dedíquese a la oración de todo tipo, comuníquese con los pobres y necesitados. La fe auténtica y vivida es contagiosa.

Y sepa que estoy orando por usted para que todos podamos ir juntos un día a la vida eterna.

Co mam zrobić, gdy moje dzieci nie chodzą do kościoła?

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Myszę, że pytanie, które najczęściej otrzymuję jako pastor, to pytanie zamieszczone w powyższym tytule: Co mam robić, gdy moje dzieci nie chcą iść do kościoła? Prawdopodobnie nie pomoże zbyt wiele, ale ja sam zadaję to pytanie do niektórych członków mojej rodziny. To problem, który dotyka każdego z nas. Jeśli nie chodzi o twoje dzieci, to twoje wnuki lub kogoś z bliskich.

Prawdopodobnie zrobiłeś wszystko dobrze, a przynajmniej najlepiej jak potrafiłeś. Wychowałeś ich, prowadząc do kościoła, zabierając je ze sobą w niedzielę i każdy dzień świąty, chodziliście razem na Mszę św. Być może wysłałeś je do szkoły katolickiej lub na naukę religii. Najwyraźniej poważnie potraktowaliście obietnicę złożoną podczas chrztu waszego dziecka: „Prosiliście o ochrzcenie dziecka. Czyniąc to, akceptowaliście odpowiedzialność za szkolenie swego dziecka w praktykowaniu wiary. Twoim obowiązkiem było wychowanie ich do przestrzegania przykazań Bożych, tak jak Chrystus nas nauczał, kochając Boga i bliźniego. Czy wyraźnie rozumiesz, czego się podjąłeś?”

Ale my znamy ukształtowanie terenu tutaj. Nasza dominująca kultura jest nie tylko apatyczna wobec wiary, ale wręcz przeciwna jej. Młodemu ludziom trudno jest żyć wiarą, ponieważ są osądzeni za to. I chociaż jest to katastrofa, wielu ludzi wydaje się, że ma sens taka moralność, która testuje wszystko według własnego widzimisie. Dążenie do doskonałości moralnej zostało zbite na bycie „w gruncie rzeczy miłym człowiekiem”. Życie poświęcone naszemu Panu zajęło tylne miejsce, będąc „duchowym, ale nie religijnym”.

Dodajmy do tego bardzo realne porażki naszego Kościoła: skandal związany z seksualnym wykorzystywaniem przez duchownych, niewłaściwym kierowaniem funduszy, a w wielu przypadkach brakiem akceptacji wobec innych. Ludzie patrzą i osądzają na Kościół poprzez pryzmat działania jego członków. Zrozumiałe jest, że w wielu przypadkach odchodzą.

Co teraz zrobimy? Nie możemy ich po prostu porzucić; nie śmiemy tego robić. Nie mam dla ciebie łatwej odpowiedzi; Na pewno chciałbym jakoś pomóc. Oto kilka rad, które mogę zaoferować. Po pierwsze, to nie twoja wina. Jeśli zrobiłeś wszystko, co mogłeś, a oni odeszli, zdaj sobie sprawę, że nie masz jedynego wpływu na swoje dziecko i że ma ono własny umysł. W pewnym sensie muszą zaakceptować wiarę na własną rękę. Zrobiłeś wszystko, co mogłeś aby im to dać, teraz muszą na to zareagować po swojemu.

Po drugie, módlcie się. Święta Monika modliła się ze łzami za swego syna Augustyna przez wiele lat. W końcu nie tylko zaakceptował wiarę, ale stał się wielkim świętym, który sprowadził wielu innych z powrotem do wiary. Święta Monika jest dla was wspólnym orędownikiem w waszym smutku.

Po trzecie, trzymaj otwarte drzwi. Zachęcaj, ale nie wymuszaj. Zaproś, ale nie kłóć się. Nie możesz stracić związku z nimi: możliwe że jesteś ich jedynym połączeniem (jakkolwiek słabym) z Jezusem w tej chwili. Coś jest lepsze niż nic.

Wreszcie, zachowaj wiarę w siebie. Rozwijaj się we własnej wierze, abyś mógł być skuteczniejszym świadkiem każdego dnia. Weź udział w studium biblijnym, udaj się na zebranie formacji dorosłych, poświęć się modlitwie wszelkiego rodzaju, docieraj do biednych i potrzebujących. Autentyczna, żywa wiara jest zaraźliwa.

I wiedz, że w tym wszystkim się modłę obydśmy wszyscy pewnego dnia doszli razem do życia wiecznego.
