Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The readings the last several weeks have been encouraging us to get it right, when it comes to our relationship with the Lord. A couple of weeks ago, Martha was reminded that contemplation in the Lord's presence, which her sister Mary embraced, was "the better part." Last week, the readings taught us to get our relationship with God in order as a precursor to prayer. Indeed the prayer Jesus taught in the Gospel reading began with a relationship: "Father..." This week, Jesus asks us to disentangle ourselves enough from this world so that we can grab hold of relationship with God.

We have to attend to first things first, and get it right. If those messages these summer days tell us anything, it's that a proper relationship with God is foundational to life, and needs to be the center of everything that we do. If we are not in proper relationship with God, we can't pray, we can't work, we can't build up a proper eternity.

And let's be clear about one thing: our eternity, however we enter into it, is going to last a very long time. Forever, in fact! Clearly then, we need to be certain that we cling to the path in life that will lead us to the greatest reward, the path that will lead us to God whose promises are never broken, whose mercies are never exhausted, whose gifts are never paltry.

That's why the Liturgy spends so much time in Ordinary Time giving us tools to live our discipleship, to grow in our relationship with God. God has made us for himself, and we have to cling to him if we want life in all its fullness. God desires that we have reasonable happiness in this life, but longs deeply that we have eternal happiness with him forever in heaven. However many days we get on this earth to enjoy what life brings us, they will pale in number to the days of eternity, and we have to desire that they are even greater in enjoyment than anything we can imagine. That's what God wants for us.

So think of it as you would think about saving for retirement. Possessions seem nice in this life, but as the saying goes, you can't take it with you. What you can take with you is that relationship with God that you've worked at each day, fortified by the dividends of a life of prayer, and matched by God's mercies, which are never exhausted. The return on that investment will be *truly* great; the yield will be everlasting happiness.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

Las lecturas de las últimas semanas nos han animado a hacer las cosas bien en referencia a nuestra relación con el Señor. Hace un par de semanas, a Martha se le recordó que la contemplación ante la presencia del Señor, que su hermana María había adoptado, era "la mejor parte". La semana pasada, las lecturas nos enseñaron a establecer nuestra relación con Dios como un precursor a la oración. De hecho, la oración que Jesús enseñó en la lectura del Evangelio comenzó con una relación: "Padre ..." Esta semana, Jesús nos pide que nos separemos lo suficiente de este mundo para que podamos mantener una relación con Dios.

Tenemos que atender primero lo primero y hacerlo bien. Si los mensajes de estos días de verano nos dicen algo, es que una relación adecuada con Dios es fundamental para la vida y debe ser el centro de todo lo que hacemos. Si no estamos en una relación adecuada con Dios, no podemos orar, no podemos trabajar, no podemos construir una eternidad apropiada.

Y seamos claros sobre una cosa: nuestra eternidad, cualquiera que sea la manera en que entremos en ella, va a durar

mucho tiempo. ¡Para siempre, de hecho! Claramente, necesitamos estar seguros de que nos aferremos al camino en la vida que nos llevará a la mayor recompensa, el camino que nos llevará a Dios cuyas promesas nunca se rompen, cuyas misericordias nunca se agotan, cuyos dones nunca son insignificantes.

Es por eso que la Liturgia pasa tanto tiempo en el Tiempo Ordinario dándonos herramientas para vivir nuestro discipulado, para crecer en nuestra relación con Dios. Dios nos ha hecho para sí mismo, y debemos aferrarnos a él si queremos la vida en toda su plenitud. Dios desea que tengamos una felicidad razonable en esta vida, pero anhela profundamente que tengamos la felicidad eterna con él para siempre en el cielo. Por muchos días que lleguemos a tener en este mundo para disfrutar de lo que la vida nos brinda, palidecerán en número a los días de la eternidad, y debemos desear que sean tan placenteros como lo podamos imaginar. Eso es lo que Dios quiere para nosotros.

Así que piensen en ello como pensarían en ahorrar para la jubilación. Las posesiones parecen agradables en esta vida, pero como dice el dicho, no podrán llevarlas con ustedes. Lo que pueden llevar con ustedes es la relación con Dios con la que han trabajado cada día, fortalecida por los beneficios de una vida de oración y combinada con las misericordias de Dios, que nunca se agotan. El retorno de esa inversión será verdaderamente grande; El rendimiento será la felicidad eterna.

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Czytania z ostatnich kilku tygodni zachęcają nas, byśmy mieli prawdziwą i odpowiednią relację z Panem. Kilka tygodni temu Marta przypomniała sobie, że kontemplacja w obecności Pana, którą objęła jej siostra Maria, była „lepszą częścią”. W zeszłym tygodniu czytania uczyły nas, aby nasza relacja z Bogiem była prekursorem modlitwy. Istotnie, modlitwa, której Jezus nauczał w czytaniu Ewangelii, zaczęła się od: „Ojcze...” W tym tygodniu Jezus prosi nas, abyśmy wystarczająco oddalili się od tego świata, abyśmy mogli chwycić się relacji z Bogiem.

Najpierw musimy zająć się podstawowymi sprawami i zrobić to dobrze. Jeśli te wiadomości w te letnie dni mówią nam cokolwiek, to właśnie to, że właściwa relacja z Bogiem jest podstawą życia i musi być w centrum wszystkiego, co robimy. Jeśli nie jesteśmy w odpowiednim związku z Bogiem, nie możemy się modlić, nie możemy pracować, nie możemy zbudować właściwej wieczności.

I wyjaśnijmy sobie jedną rzecz: nasza wieczność, jakkolwiek w nią wejdziemy, będzie trwać bardzo długo. Na zawsze! Jest więc jasne, że musimy być pewni, że trzymamy się ścieżki życia, która doprowadzi nas do największej nagrody, ścieżki, która doprowadzi nas do Boga, którego obietnice nigdy nie zostaną złamane, którego miłosierdzie nigdy nie jest wyczerpane, a jego dary nigdy nie są marne.

Dlatego Liturgia spędza tyle czasu w Okresie Zwykłym, dając nam narzędzia, by żyć naszym uczniostwem, wzrastać w relacji z Bogiem. Bóg stworzył nas dla siebie i musimy się go trzymać, jeśli chcemy życia w całej jego pełni. Bóg pragnie, abyśmy mieli rozsądne szczęście w tym życiu, ale pragniemy głęboko, abyśmy mieli wieczne szczęście z Nim na zawsze w niebie. Niezależnie od tego, ile dni spędzimy na tej ziemi, wszystkie zbędne w liczbie i jakości dni wieczności. Tego właśnie chce od nas Bóg.

Więc pomyśl o tym kiedy myślisz o oszczędzaniu na emeryturę. W tym życiu dobra wydają się miłe, ale jak mówi powiedzenie, nie możesz tego zabrać ze sobą. To, co możesz zabrać ze sobą, to relacja z Bogiem, na którą pracowałeś każdego dnia, wzmocniona dywidendami życia modlitewnego i darami Miłosierdzia Bożego, które nigdy się nie wyczerpują. Zwrot z tej inwestycji będzie naprawdę wielki; plon będzie wiecznym szczęściem.
