The Word from Fr. Pat / La Palabra del Padre Pat / Słowo od Ojca Pat

*Much will be required of the person entrusted with much,
and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.*
Luke 12:48

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The final words of today's Gospel are challenging ones to be sure. We are a people who have been entrusted with much: we live in one of the most affluent counties of the most prosperous nation on earth. And so we have to hear these Gospel words and perhaps experience a moment of pause when we think about what will be required, even demanded of us.

I preach often about the fact that any spiritual gift, any grace, any blessing, is never just given to us for us. We could be like the greedy farmer in last week's Gospel and take all our blessings and stockpile them in barns or warehouses or banks or wherever, and retire early and be comfortable in this life. But if our lives are demanded of us this night, who gets all that stuff? We can't take it with us, can we? Gifts and blessings are meant to be shared, meant to be used to improve the common good, meant to be invested so that we might live in a world of justice, love and peace.

So whatever we have – and I do know that not everyone has a lot and that many of us are hurting financially or in other ways – but whatever we do have has been given to us to share with others. When we have much, much is required. It's not an accident that we have what we have, and our first priority has to be how to use those gifts to do God's will.

There are two ways to disobey this command: squandering what we've been given, and hoarding it. Spending money frivolously, with no thought to those who have little or nothing; using our talents for less than noble purposes, with no thought of building up our community, our parish, our corner of the world; wasting time with no thought to spending time with those who need God's presence – this is all a kind of gluttony, a capital sin that keeps us focused on us, instead of on others or on God.

The antidote to the sin of gluttony is the virtue of asceticism. Asceticism involves fasting and doing without, so that others may have more. Asceticism requires sacrificial giving, charity that puts others first, an attitude that sees oneself as part of the solar system, not as the star around which everyone else revolves.

We must always remember, as the Gospel says in another place, that there is nothing we have that we have not been given. Even that for which we have worked hard, is ours because God has given us the ability to work at it and blessed our efforts. So if we are but stewards of our many blessings, we are required to use those blessings in ways that benefit all those God puts in our path.

God is good, all the time! He has given us much. And of us, he requires much. Blessed are we servants who are vigilant at the Master's arrival.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

Por seguro las palabras finales del Evangelio de hoy son desafiantes. Somos un pueblo al que se nos ha confiado mucho: vivimos en uno de los condados más ricos de la nación más próspera del mundo. Así que al escuchar estas palabras del Evangelio, tal vez experimentamos una pausa cuando pensamos en lo que se requerirá o incluso lo que se nos exigirá a nosotros.

A menudo predico sobre el hecho de que cualquier don espiritual, cualquier gracia, cualquier bendición, nunca se nos es dado solo para nosotros. Podríamos ser como el granjero codicioso del Evangelio de la semana pasada y tomar todas nuestras bendiciones y almacenarlas en graneros, almacenes o bancos o en cualquier otro lugar y jubilarnos pronto y disfrutar de esta vida. Pero si se nos exige entregar nuestra vida esta noche, ¿quién recibirá todas esas cosas? No podremos llevarlas con nosotros, ¿verdad? Los regalos y las bendiciones están destinados a ser compartidos, a ser utilizados para mejorar el bien común, a ser invertidos para que podamos vivir en un mundo de justicia, amor y paz.

Entonces, lo que sea que tengamos, y sé que no todos tienen mucho y que muchos de nosotros estamos sufriendo financieramente o de otras maneras, pero lo que sea que hagamos se nos ha dado para compartir con otros. Cuando tenemos mucho, se requiere mucho. No es un accidente que tengamos lo que tenemos, y nuestra primera prioridad debe ser cómo usar esos dones para hacer la voluntad de Dios.

The Word from Fr. Pat / La Palabra del Padre Pat / Słowo od Ojca Pat

Hay dos formas de desobedecer este encargo: malgastar lo que se nos ha dado y acapararlo. Gastar dinero frívolamente, sin pensar en aquellos que tienen poco o nada; usando nuestros talentos para propósitos no muy honrados, sin pensar en construir nuestra comunidad, nuestra parroquia, nuestro rincón del mundo; Perder el tiempo sin pensar en pasar tiempo con aquellos que necesitan la presencia de Dios: todo esto es una especie de glotonería, un pecado capital que nos mantiene enfocados en nosotros, en lugar de en los demás o en Dios.

El antídoto contra el pecado de la gula es la virtud del ascetismo. El ascetismo implica ayunar y prescindir de algunas cosas, para que otros puedan tener más. El ascetismo requiere entrega sacrificial, caridad que pone a los demás en primer lugar, una actitud que se ve a sí mismo como parte del sistema solar, no como la estrella en torno a la cual giran los demás.

Siempre debemos recordar, como dice el Evangelio en otro lugar, que no hay nada que tengamos que no se nos haya dado. Incluso aquello por lo que hemos trabajado duro es nuestro porque Dios nos ha dado la capacidad de trabajar en ello y ha bendecido nuestros esfuerzos. Entonces, si no somos más que mayordomos de nuestras muchas bendiciones, debemos usar esas bendiciones de manera que beneficien a todos aquellos que Dios pone en nuestro camino.

¡Dios es bueno todo el tiempo! Nos ha dado mucho. Y de nosotros, él requiere mucho. Bienaventurados los sirvientes que estamos vigilantes a la llegada del Maestro.

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Ostatnie słowa dzisiejszej Ewangelii są trudne. Jesteśmy narodem, któremu powierzono wiele rzeczy: żyjemy w jednym z najbogatszych hrabstw najlepiej prosperującego narodu na ziemi. Musimy więc usłyszeć te słowa Ewangelii i być może doświadczyć chwili przerwy, kiedy pomyślimy o tym, co jest wymagane od nas.

Często głoszę homilie o tym, że jakikolwiek dar duchowy, każda łaska, każde błogosławieństwo nigdy nie jest nam dane dla nas samych. Moglibyśmy być jak chciwy jak ten rolnik w zeszlotygodniowej Ewangelii i wziąć wszystkie nasze błogosławieństwa i zgromadzić je w stodołach, magazynach, bankach lub gdziekolwiek, przejść na emeryturę wcześniej i żyć komfortowo. Ale jeśli zażądają od nas życia tej nocy, kto dostanie to wszystko? Nie możemy tego zabrać ze sobą, prawda? Łaski i błogosławieństwa mają być dzielone dla wspólnego dobra, przeznaczone do inwestowania, abyśmy mogli żyć w świecie sprawiedliwości, miłości i pokoju.

Więc cokolwiek mamy - i wiem, że nie każdy ma wiele i że wielu niedomaga finansowo lub w inny sposób - ale wszystko, co robimy, zostało nam dane do dzielenia się z innymi. Kiedy mamy wiele, wiele jest wymagane. To nie przypadek, że mamy to, co mamy, a naszym pierwszym priorytetem musi być to, jak wykorzystać te dary, aby wypełnić wolę Bożą.

Są dwa sposoby na nieposłuszeństwo temu poleceniu: zmarnowanie tego, co otrzymaliśmy i gromadzenie go. Frywolne wydawanie pieniędzy, bez próby pomocy tym, którzy mają niewiele lub nic; wykorzystując nasze talenty do mniej niż szlachetnych celów, nie myśląc o budowaniu naszej wspólnoty, naszej parafii, naszego zakątka świata; marnowanie czasu bez namysłu, - to wszystko jest rodzajem obżarstwa, grzechu głównego, który sprawia, że skupiamy się na nas, a nie na innych lub na Bogu.

Antidotum na grzech obżarstwa jest cnota ascezy. Asceza wiąże się z postem, aby inni mogli mieć więcej. Asceza wymaga ofiarnego dawania, miłości, która stawia innych na pierwszym miejscu, postawy, która postrzega siebie jako część Układu Słonecznego, a nie jako gwiazdę, wokół której obracają się wszyscy inni.

Musimy zawsze pamiętać, co głosi Ewangelia, że wszystko co posiadamy otrzymaliśmy od Pana Boga. Nawet to, nad czym ciężko pracowaliśmy, nie należy do nas ponieważ Bóg dał nam zdolność do pracy i pobłogosławił nasze wysiłki. Jeśli więc jesteśmy tylko szafarzami naszych licznych błogosławieństw, jesteśmy zobowiązani do korzystania z tych błogosławieństw w sposób korzystny dla wszystkich tych, których Bóg stawia na naszej drodze.

Bóg jest zawsze dobry! Dał nam wiele. A od nas wymaga wiele. Błogosławieni słudzy - czujni i gotowi na przyjście Mesjasza.
