Saint Monica

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's column, I want to do something a bit different, and that is to focus on one of the Saints of the Church that we will be celebrating this coming week. On Tuesday, we celebrate the feast of Saint Monica, one of my favorite saints. For those of us who pray for something (or, more likely, as Saint Monica did, someone), she is our patron saint.

Although she was a Christian, Monica's parents gave her in marriage to a pagan, Patricius, who lived in her hometown of Tagaste in North Africa. Patricius had some redeeming features, but he had a violent temper and was licentious. Her husband died in 371, one year after his baptism. Did you catch that, after his baptism! Obviously Saint Monica was an example to those close to her.

Monica had at least three children who survived infancy. The oldest, Augustine, is the most famous. At the time of his father's death, Augustine was 17 and a rhetoric student in Carthage. Monica was distressed to learn that her son had accepted the Manichean heresy (which states that all flesh is evil), and was living a rather immoral life. For a while, she refused to let him eat or sleep in her house. Then one night she had a vision that assured her Augustine would return to the faith. From that time on, she stayed close to her son, praying and fasting for him.

When he was 29, Augustine decided to go to Rome to teach rhetoric. Monica was determined to go along. One night he told his mother that he was going to the dock to say goodbye to a friend. Instead, he set sail for Rome. Monica was heartbroken when she learned of Augustine's trick, but she still followed him. She arrived in Rome only to find that he had left for Milan. Although travel was difficult, Monica pursued him to Milan. In Milan, Augustine came under the influence of the bishop, St. Ambrose, who also became Monica's spiritual director. Her many prayers were being answered!

She continued her prayers for Augustine during his years of instruction. At Easter, 387, St. Ambrose baptized Augustine and several of his friends. Soon after, his party left for Africa. Although no one else was aware of it, Monica knew her life was near the end. She told Augustine, "Son, nothing in this world now affords me delight. I do not know what there is now left for me to do or why I am still here, all my hopes in this world being now fulfilled." She became ill shortly after and suffered severely for nine days before her death.

Saint Monica did the things I always tell parents to do for their children who are not living the faith: she prayed for him without ceasing, she stayed close to him, always leaving the door open for relationship and conversion, and she was supportive of every little and big thing that led him to Christ. Conversion of our loved ones is no easy task, but for that task, we have the intercession of Saint Monica to support us!

Santa Monica

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

En la columna de hoy, quiero hacer algo un poco diferente, y es enfocarme en uno de los Santos de la Iglesia que celebraremos la próxima semana. El martes, celebramos la fiesta de Santa Mónica, uno de mis santos favoritos. Para aquellos de nosotros que rezamos por algo (o, más probablemente, como lo hizo Santa Mónica, por alguien), ella es nuestra santa patrona.

Aunque era cristiana, los padres de Mónica la dieron en matrimonio con un pagano, Patricius, que vivía en su ciudad natal de Tagaste, en el norte de África. Patricius tenía algunas cualidades positivas, pero tenía un temperamento violento y era promiscuo. Patricius murió en 371, un año después de su bautismo. ¡Captaron bien eso, un año después de su bautismo! Obviamente, Santa Mónica fue un ejemplo para aquellos cercanos a ella.

Mónica tuvo al menos tres hijos que sobrevivieron a la infancia. El mayor de ellos, Agustín, es el más famoso. En el momento de la muerte de su padre, Agustín tenía 17 años y era un estudiante de retórica en Cartago. Mónica se angustió al saber que su hijo había aceptado la herejía maniquea (que afirma que toda carne es malvada), y estaba viviendo una vida bastante inmoral. Durante un tiempo, ella se negó a dejarlo comer o dormir en su casa. Entonces, una noche tuvo una visión que le aseguró que Agustín volvería a la fe. A partir de ese momento, ella se mantuvo cerca de su hijo, rezando y ayunando por él.

Cuando tenía 29 años, Agustín decidió ir a Roma para enseñar retórica. Mónica estaba decidida a seguirlo y una noche le dijo a su madre que iría al muelle a despedirse de un amigo. En cambio, zarpó hacia Roma. Mónica se sintió desconsolada cuando supo del

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truco de Agustín, pero aún así lo siguió. Ella llegó a Roma solo para descubrir que él se había ido a Milán. Aunque viajar era difícil, Mónica lo siguió hasta Milán. En Milán, Agustín quedó bajo la influencia del obispo, San Ambrosio, quien también se convirtió en el director espiritual de Mónica. ¡Sus muchas oraciones fueron respondidas!

Ella continuó sus oraciones por Agustín durante sus años de instrucción. En la Pascua del año 387, San Ambrosio bautizó a Agustín y a varios de sus amigos. Poco después, se fue a África. Aunque nadie más lo sabía, Mónica sabía que su vida estaba cerca del final. Ella le dijo a Agustín: “Hijo, nada en este mundo ahora me da placer. No sé qué me queda por hacer o por qué sigo aquí, todas mis esperanzas en este mundo se han cumplido ahora”. Se enfermó poco después y sufrió severamente durante nueve días antes de su muerte.

Santa Mónica hizo las cosas que siempre les digo a los padres que hagan por sus hijos que no viven la fe: rezó por el sin cesar, se mantuvo cerca de él, siempre dejando la puerta abierta para la relación y la conversión, y apoyaba cada cosa pequeña o grande que lo acercaba a Cristo. La conversión de nuestros seres queridos no es tarea fácil, pero para esa tarea, tenemos la intercesión de Santa Mónica para apoyarnos.

Święta Monica

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

W dzisiejszym artykule pragnę zrobić coś nieco odmiennego, a mianowicie skupić się na jednej ze Świętych Kościoła, której święto będziemy celebrować w nadchodzącym tygodniu. We wtorek obchodzimy dzień Świętej Moniki, jednej z moich ulubionych świętych. Dla tych z nas, którzy modlą się w szczególnej intencji (lub, bardziej prawdopodobne, jak to robiła Święta Monika, w intencji jakiejś osoby), jest ona naszą patronką.

Chociaż była chrześcijanką, rodzice Moniki wydali ją za mąż za poganina Patriciusa, który mieszkał w jej rodzinnym mieście Tagaste w Afryce Północnej. Patricius miał pewne cechy odkupienia, ale miał gwałtowny temperament i był rozpustny. Jej mąż zmarł w 371 roku, rok po swoim chrzcie. Czy zauważyłeś że był ochrzczony! Oczywiście święta Monika była ogromnym przykładem dla swoich bliskich.

Monika miała co najmniej troje dzieci, które przeżyły niemowlęstwo. Najstarszy, Augustyn, jest najbardziej znany. W chwili śmierci ojca Augustyn miał 17 lat i był studentem retoryki w Kartaginie. Monika bardzo się przejęła gdy jej syn zaakceptował herezję manichejską (która głosi, że wszystko co dotyczy ciała jest złe). Żył raczej niemoralnie. Przez jakiś czas nie pozwalała mu jeść ani spać w jej domu. Pewnej nocy miała wizję, która zapewniła ją, że Augustyn powróci do wiary. Odtąd pozostała blisko syna, modląc się i poszcząc za niego.

Kiedy miał 29 lat, Augustyn postanowił udać się do Rzymu, aby wyklądać retorykę. Monika postanowiła pojechać z nim. Wieczorem powiedział swojej matce, że idzie do doku, aby pożegnać się z przyjacielem. Zamiast tego popłynął do Rzymu. Monika była załamana, gdy dowiedziała się o kłamstwie Augustyna, ale i tak za nim podążyła. Przybyła do Rzymu tylko po to, by dowiedzieć się na miejscu, że wyjechał do Mediolanu. Chociaż podróż była trudna i męcząca, Monika nie rezygnowała i pojechała za nim do Mediolanu. W Mediolanie Augustyn znalazł się pod wpływem biskupa, św. Ambrożego, który również został kierownikiem duchowym Moniki. To była odpowiedź na jej wieloletnią modlitwę!

Kontynuowała swoje modlitwy za Augustyna podczas jego lat nauki. W Wielkanoc 387 r. Św. Ambroży ochrzcił Augustyna i kilku jego przyjaciół. Niedługo potem jego grupa wyjechała do Afryki. Chociaż nikt inny nie był tego świadomy, Monika wiedziała, że jej życie dobiega końca. Powiedziała Augustynowi: „Synu, nic na tym świecie nie daje mi już rozkoszy. Nie wiem, co mi teraz zostało do zrobienia ani dlaczego wciąż tu jestem, gdyż wszystkie moje nadzieje na tym świecie zostały spełnione. Wkrótce potem zachorowała i cierpiała przez dziewięć dni aż zmarła.

Święta Monika dokonała to, co zawsze każę rodzicom robić dla swoich dzieci, które nie żyją w wierze: bezustannie modliła się za niego, była blisko niego, zawsze pozostawiając otwarte drzwi do relacji i nawrócenia, i wspierała wszystkie małe i wielkie wysiłki Augustyna, doprowadzając go do Chrystusa. Nawrócenie naszych bliskich nie jest łatwym zadaniem, ale do tego zadania mamy wstawiennictwo Świętej Moniki, która nas wspiera!
