grant that we may always conform our will to yours
and serve your majesty in sincerity of heart...
From the Collect Prayer for today's Mass*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Collect prayer today prays for something that, quite honestly, we may not consider a gift ... although we should. Conforming our will to God's will is a tough one: God's will is totally pure, and to get there, we have to purify our desires, purify our hearts, purify our motives. And even the desire to do that is a stretch for all of us, who, if we are honest, always have our own desires and motives. We always want what is best for us – and God does too. But we might not see eye-to-eye on what is truly best.

Conforming our will to God's requires, first of all, that we know what God's will is. So we have to have the desire, and even the courage, to ask the question. When we do summon up that courage, we then ask the question in prayer. We also have to be prepared to ask the question a second time, and a third time, and a hundredth time, and so on. Perseverance in prayer is particularly important when the task is discerning God's will.

How do you know that you've heard God's will? Generally, the Spirit will stir up something in you that does not go away; a voice that continues to call you to the truth, to a new direction. You should then discuss it with a trusted friend, a confessor or spiritual director, someone who loves you and will be honest with you. If the call that you've received is in concert with the teachings of the Church, and is persistent, and holds up to the conversations you have with those trusted people, then it is probably genuine.

Now the degree of scrutiny that you give these things depends on the importance of the decision. If it's a major life decision, you'll want to spend a great deal of time in discernment. If it's who to vote for, maybe a little less time, but still rather significant. If it's whether to be involved in a ministry or activity, perhaps a bit less, and so on. Prudence is necessary and you always want to err on the side of giving more time to a decision rather than being rash.

But once you know God's will, then you have to conform yourself to it. You have to be ready to accept it and follow where God is leading you. Once you know God's will, rejecting that will is pretty seriously wrong, and probably sinful. That's why conforming our will to God's is such a serious and sometimes scary thing. It's not something to be taken lightly; it's not at all something to be ignored. So here is a prayer from Saint Ignatius of Loyola to guide you in your quest to conform your will to God's:

*Take, Lord, and receive all my liberty,
my memory, my understanding, and my entire will,
All I have and call my own.*

*You have given all to me.
To you, Lord, I return it.*

*Everything is yours;
do with it what you will.
Give me only your love and your grace,
that is enough for me.*

*Dios todopoderoso y viviente
concede que siempre podamos conformar nuestra voluntad a la tuya
y sirva a su majestad con sinceridad de corazón ...
De la oración colectiva para la misa de hoy*

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

La oración colecta del día de hoy ora por algo que, honestamente, no podemos considerar un regalo ... aunque deberíamos. Conformar nuestra voluntad a la voluntad de Dios es difícil: la voluntad de Dios es totalmente pura, y para llegar allí, tenemos que purificar nuestros deseos, purificar nuestros corazones, purificar nuestros motivos. Inclusive el deseo de hacerlo es una exageración para todos nosotros, quienes, si somos honestos, siempre tenemos nuestros propios deseos y motivos. Siempre queremos lo mejor para nosotros, y Dios también lo quiere. Pero es posible que no veamos cara a cara lo que es realmente mejor.

Conformar nuestra voluntad a la de Dios requiere, en primer lugar, que sepamos cuál es la voluntad de Dios. Entonces tenemos que tener el deseo, e incluso el coraje, de hacer la pregunta. Cuando reunimos ese coraje, hacemos la pregunta en oración. También tenemos que estar preparados para hacer la pregunta una segunda vez, y una tercera y una centésima vez, y así sucesivamente. La perseverancia en la oración es particularmente importante cuando la tarea es discernir la voluntad de Dios.

¿Cómo sabe usted que ha escuchado la voluntad de Dios? Generalmente, el Espíritu removerá algo en usted que no desaparece; una voz que continúa llamándole a la verdad, a una nueva dirección. Luego debería discutirlo con un amigo de confianza, un confesor o director espiritual, alguien que lo ame y sea honesto con usted. Si el llamado que recibió coincide con las enseñanzas de la Iglesia, es persistente y se mantiene a la altura de las conversaciones que tiene con esas personas de confianza, entonces es muy probable que sea genuino.

Ahora, el grado de escrutinio que le dé a estas cosas depende de la importancia de la decisión. Si es una decisión importante en su vida, querrá pasar mucho tiempo en discernimiento. Si es por quién votar, quizás un poco menos de tiempo, pero aún bastante significativo. Si se trata de participar en un ministerio o actividad, quizás un poco menos, y así sucesivamente. La prudencia es necesaria; a la hora de tomar una decisión es mejor dedicarle tiempo de más a la oración a ser impulsivo.

Una vez que sepa la voluntad de Dios, entonces tiene que conformarse con ella. Tiene que estar listo para aceptarlo y seguir a donde Dios le está guiando. Una vez que conoce la voluntad de Dios, rechazarla es bastante grave y probablemente pecaminoso. Es por eso que conformar nuestra voluntad a la de Dios es algo tan serio y a veces aterrador. No es algo para tomar a la ligera; no es algo que deba ser ignorado. Aquí le dejo hay una oración de San Ignacio de Loyola para guiarle en su búsqueda de conformar su voluntad a la de Dios:

*Toma, Señor, y recibe toda mi libertad,
mi memoria, mi comprensión y toda mi voluntad
Todo lo que tengo y llamo mío.*

*Me lo has dado todo.
A ti, Señor, te lo devuelvo.*

*Todo es tuyo;
haz con eso lo que quieras.
Dame solo tu amor y tu gracia,
Eso es suficiente para mí.*

*Wszchemogący wiecznie żyjący Boże,
spraw, abyśmy zawsze dostosowali naszą wolę do Twojej
i służył swoim majestatem w szczerości serca...
Z Modlitwy Zbierającej na dzisiejszą Mszę św*

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Modlitwa ta prosi dziś o coś, czego szczerze mówiąc nie możemy uznać za dar... chociaż powinniśmy. Dostosowanie naszej woli do woli Bożej jest trudne: wola Boga jest całkowicie czysta i aby się tam dostać, musimy oczyścić nasze pragnienia, oczyścić nasze serca, oczyścić nasze motywy. I nawet pragnienie, aby to zrobić, jest wyzwaniem dla nas wszystkich, którzy, jeśli się przyznamy, zawsze mają własne pragnienia i motywy. Zawsze chcemy tego, co dla nas najlepsze - i Bóg też. Ale możemy nie widzieć bezpośrednio tego, co jest naprawdę najlepsze.

Dostosowanie naszej woli do woli Boga wymaga przede wszystkim abyśmy wiedzieli jaka jest wola Boża. Musimy więc mieć pragnienie, a nawet odwagę, aby zadać pytanie. Kiedy gromadzimy tę odwagę, zadajemy to pytanie w modlitwie. Musimy także być przygotowani, aby zadać pytanie po raz drugi, trzeci, setny i tak dalej. Wytrwałość w modlitwie jest szczególnie ważna, gdy zadaniem jest rozeznanie woli Bożej.

Skąd wiesz, że słyszałeś Bożą wolę? Ogólnie rzecz biorąc, Duch wzbudzi w tobie coś, co nie zniknie; głos, który wciąż wzywa cię do prawdy, w nowym kierunku. Powinieneś wtedy omówić to z zaufanym przyjacielem, spowiednikiem lub kierownikiem duchowym, kimś, kto cię kocha i będzie z tobą szczery. Jeśli wezwanie, które otrzymałeś, jest zgodne z naukami Kościoła, powraca i dzielisz się nim z zaufanymi ludźmi, prawdopodobnie jest ono prawdziwe.

Teraz stopień sprawdzania zależy od ważności decyzji. Jeśli jest to ważna decyzja życiowa, powinieneś spędzić dużo czasu na rozeznaniu. Jeśli to na kogo głosować, może trochę mniej czasu, ale to też ważne. Jeśli chodzi o to, czy być zaangażowanym w służbę lub działalność, może trochę mniej i tak dalej. Roztropność jest konieczna i zawsze chcesz mieć potwierdzenie, poświęcając więcej czasu na decyzję, nie działając pochopnie.

Ale kiedy poznasz wolę Bożą, musisz się do niej dostosować. Musisz być gotowy, aby to zaakceptować i podążać tam, gdzie prowadzi cię Bóg. Kiedy poznasz wolę Bożą, odrzucenie tej woli jest bardzo złe i prawdopodobnie grzeszne. Dlatego dostosowanie naszej woli do woli Boga jest tak poważną, a czasem przerażającą rzeczą. Nie należy tego lekceważyć; w ogóle nie można tego ignorować. Oto modlitwa Świętego Ignacego Loyoli, która poprowadzi cię w twoim dążeniu do dostosowania swojej woli do woli Boga:

*Weż, Panie, i przyjmij całą moją wolność,
moją pamięć, moje zrozumienie i całą moją wolę,
Wszystko co mam i nazywam swoim.*

*Daleś mi wszystko.
Tobie, Panie, zwracam to.*

*Wszystko jest Twoje;
zrób z tym co chcesz.
Daj mi tylko swoją miłość i łaskę,
to mi wystarczy.*

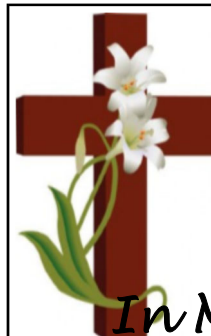

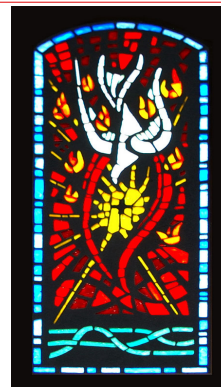

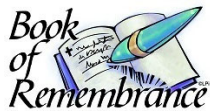
