- As the Spirit of God dwells in us we are united to Christ and renewed by his resurrection.

- Jesus offers a prayer of praise to the Father for all that has been accomplished by his gracious will.
- The Lord then invites all who labor and are weary to come to him and rest.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY



July 4th - Feast of St. Pier Giorgio Frassati

St. Pier Giorgio Frassati was born in 1901 in Italy. From the time he was twelve until his death at twenty-four Pier Giorgio received Holy Communion daily. At 17, he joined the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and committed himself to serving the poor. Pier Giorgio said: “Jesus visits me every morning in Holy Communion. I repay him with my poor means, visiting the poor.” When asked how he could stand the bad odors and dirt of the poor, he answered: “Don’t forget that even if the house you visit is very dirty, there you may find Jesus.” The last months of his life were filled with suffering; he contracted poliomyelitis and became paralyzed. When he died hundreds of unknown faces who loved this generous young man came to view his body. He was canonized a saint in September of 2025 by Pope Leo XIV.
