WEEKLY MEDITATION

Here are some of the central themes in the Mass readings for the 22nd Sunday of the Year.

1st Reading – Jeremiah 20:7-9

- Jeremiah is duped by the Lord, who overwhelms the prophet with a message for the people which often causes him derision and reproach.
- Even though Jeremiah attempts to avoid his calling, God's word is burning within him, and he must cry out.

Psalms – 63:2-6,8-9

- "My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God."
- Our soul sees God's goodness, and we long to give praise and blessing to the Lord who upholds us.

2nd Reading – Romans 12:1-2

- Paul urges us to offer our bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God.
- Rather than conform to this age, we are called to be transformed by the renewal of our mind to the will of God.

Gospel – Matthew 16:21-27

- Jesus speaks about his coming Passion, and then he rebukes Peter for attempting to avoid it.
- The Lord then teaches that anyone who wishes to come after him must take up his cross and follow.

Question for Children: Jesus tells us that we each called to follow him. What is hard for you to do to follow Jesus?

Question for Youth: In order to follow Jesus, we have to do hard things, to carry our own crosses. What is a cross that you are carrying right now? In what ways can you ask Jesus to help you with your cross?

Question for Adults: Jesus gives us the core truth to life and eternal happiness — the cross. Name the cross that you carry. How is it bringing you closer to God?

THE HOME VISIT



The call to servanthood for the members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is the call to the homes of the poor. As God put on the cloak of humanity, coming to our home on earth in order to accompany and serve us, so St. Vincent implored the Daughters of Charity to seek out poor persons in their homes, which until now has never been done. [CCD IX:467] Two hundred years later, Blessed Frédéric would echo this same commitment to servanthood, igniting the Society's founding, and citing Christ's example as he declared, "let us go to the poor!"

Today, our local Society averages over 200 home visits a year and over 600 visits with people in other locations - many at our free store for goods, and many with those who are without a permanent home.

Scholarship Highlights:

~ **Financial Support:** Annual scholarships of \$900 for youth and \$500 for adults are available. Scholarships will cover the cost of private lessons for both youth and adults. For youth, it will also cover the cost of items related to lessons such as organ shoes and music.

~ **Mentorship:** Lessons and guidance are provided by experienced local organists.

~ **Eligibility:** Open to serious and enthusiastic students from northeastern Minnesota or northwestern Wisconsin. Applicants must have studied the piano or organ for a minimum of three years.

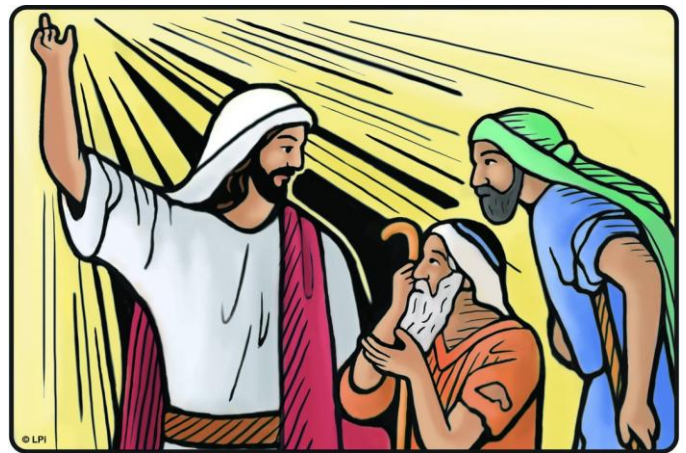

Becoming Catholic

The excitement continues. More and more adults are seeking information about the Holy Catholic Church – and those who are Catholic are seeking to complete their sacraments. The energy and spirit are very real.



The process of bringing adults into full communion with the Catholic Church is called the *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults*. Locally, OCIA is available to those who have a desire to learn about Catholicism. This process serves everyone - those with no faith-based experience to those fully Catholic desiring to learn more about the basics of their faith.

There are varying ways to participate in OCIA. First, there are weekly classes on Thursday evenings. Gathered together are individuals with a wide range of faith-based experiences. The sessions are led by a team of experienced Catholics. Each session examines scripture, portions of the Catechism, and topics designed to help navigate ordinary Catholic experiences.

Second, recognizing that life does not always allow for a weekly on-site commitment, arrangements can be made for individuals to independently study the materials with monthly visits with an OCIA team member.

Participation in OCIA is beneficial for people in many situations:

- Those with no faith-based experience.
- Those from other denominations who feel that they are being called discern entry into the Catholic Church.
- Baptized Catholics who would like to complete their Sacraments of Initiation.
- Non-Catholics who are married to a Catholic and would like to learn more about their spouses' faith.
- Fully initiated Catholics who feel that their understanding of the basics of the Catholic Church is dated and/or incomplete.

Adult Formation Programming

... Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always to be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope. (1 Peter 3:15)

Some of us are very familiar with the phrase, “To Know, Love and Serve Him” – words from The Baltimore Catechism in response to the question, “Why did God make you? Even though this question and response has been part of Catholic culture for 140 years – and things have changed so much -- it is still very relevant today.

How DO we know, love and serve God in this complicated world of ours? It’s not always easy. The Superior Catholics cluster of parishes has two learning opportunities for you.

The first is **The Search**, a dynamic, thought-provoking series of videos that asks What is this journey in between the event we call 'birth' and the one we call 'death'? Is the journey taking you somewhere, or are you leading yourself to some kind of destination – a destination that could extend beyond your last breath? What do you want from your life during the in between? The questions are there. And, the answers are too.

The second addresses how we live out the directive, “Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations.”

Evangelization and The Acts of the Apostles looks at what the apostles did, in the wake of the Resurrection, to do as they were commanded to establish the Church and make disciples across the known world. Using the Lectio Divina approach of reading, reflecting, responding, and contemplating, this series provides opportunities for discussion and questions.
