WEEKLY MEDITATION

Here are some of the themes that we find in the Mass readings for the 24th Sunday of the Year.

1st Reading - Sirach 27:30-28:9

- While wrath and anger are hateful things, the sinner hugs them tight.
- If a person expects mercy and pardon for sins, enmity must be set aside.

Psalm - 103:1-4,9-12

- "The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger, and rich in compassion."
- God pardons, heals, and redeems us out of kindness.

2nd Reading - Romans 14:7-9

- None of us lives or dies for oneself, but for the Lord.
- Christ has died and rose that he might be Lord of the dead and the living.

Gospel - Matthew 18:21-35

- When asked by Peter how often must he forgive his brother, Jesus offers a parable about a servant who failed to forgive someone in a small way after he had experienced great forgiveness from his master.
- The Lord then applies the parable to us all: we must forgive one another if we expect to be forgiven by God.

Question for Children: Jesus says we should forgive from our heart. When did you ask forgiveness of someone you hurt? How did you feel?

Question for Youth: Jesus challenges us to forgive. Who needs your forgiveness? From whom do you need to ask forgiveness?

Question for Adults: Jesus tells us to forgive seventy times seven, which means always and forever. Name a time this past week when you forgave someone. Name, too, a time when you accepted another person's forgiveness.

Becoming Catholic

The excitement continues. More and more adults are seeking information about the Holy Catholic Church – and those who are Catholic are seeking to complete their sacraments. The energy and spirit are very real.



The process of bringing adults into full communion with the Catholic Church is called the *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults*. Locally, OCIA is available to those who have a desire to learn about Catholicism. This process serves everyone - those with no faith-based experience to those fully Catholic desiring to learn more about the basics of their faith.

There are varying ways to participate in OCIA. First, there are weekly classes on Thursday evenings. Gathered together are individuals with a wide range of faith-based experiences. The sessions are led by a team of experienced Catholics. Each session examines scripture, portions of the Catechism, and topics designed to help navigate ordinary Catholic experiences.

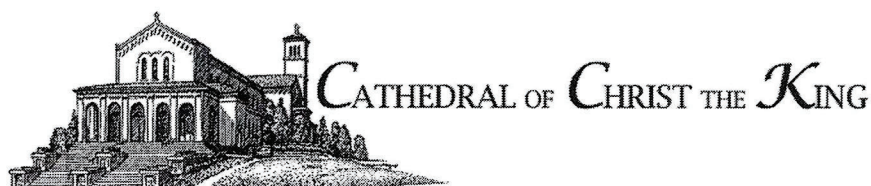
Second, recognizing that life does not always allow for a weekly on-site commitment, arrangements can be made for individuals to independently study the materials with monthly visits with an OCIA team member.

Participation in OCIA is beneficial for people in many situations:

- Those with no faith-based experience.
- Those from other denominations who feel that they are being called discern entry into the Catholic Church.
- Baptized Catholics who would like to complete their Sacraments of Initiation.
- Non-Catholics who are married to a Catholic and would like to learn more about their spouses' faith.
- Fully initiated Catholics who feel that their understanding of the basics of the Catholic Church is dated and/or incomplete.

Pray with this passage from the letter to the Philippians this month. Use the questions below to guide your reflection.

Brothers and sisters: If there is any encouragement in Christ, any solace in love, any participation in the Spirit, any compassion and mercy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, with the same love, united in heart, thinking one thing. Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also everyone for those of others. (Philippians 2:1-5)

What strikes you in this passage?

What is most challenging?

What is described that you feel is a strength for you?

How does this passage describe what Jesus did and what Christ calls you to do?

Called to Jesus' heart of love



**For my thoughts are
not your thoughts,
nor are your ways my ways,
says the Lord.**

Who do you aspire to be?

Who do you admire? What is your goal in life? If we are honest with ourselves, most of us can admit that we look up to those who are successful in the eyes of others. The powerful, prosperous, sought-after. The voice of the world tells us our goal should be to be more like them. Even those of us who in our hearts do not seek worldly success may dream of financial security or a life of ease. Consciously or not, we spend much of our lives looking for a way to be admired and secure. Jesus shows us a different way.

Jesus' way is a heart of love. From this immense love of God flows compassion, mercy, forgiveness, humility. Jesus lived as one among us, showing us how to follow his way. He sought out the poor and lonely, attended to the sick and vulnerable, forgave sinners, and responded to suffering with compassion. Jesus literally put his life on the line for the sake of others. In Christ, power is found in love. In Jesus' way, the most prosperous among us are the ones who value the last and the least. To follow Jesus is to find security not in worldly possessions but in the very heart of God.

Is it any wonder that Jesus so confounded the people of his time, or that the gospel continues to challenge people today? How will you be filled with and follow Jesus' heart of love?

BRING FAITH TO LIFE

Sometimes it is difficult to think about God's will. Our fierce human independence balks at the idea of someone else's will being important, even if it is *God* whose will we are considering. Yet each of us has moments in which we sense what we are called to do: dreams of making a contribution in the life of another; a simple act of kindness that could make a real difference; a sense of purpose or fruitfulness in which we may

find meaning in life; a desire to show compassion, share mercy, forgive another, or give of ourselves in a new and substantial way.

St. John XXIII understood these interior promptings that are glimmers of the will of God: "Consult not your fears but your hopes and your dreams. Think not about your frustrations, but about your unfulfilled potential. Concern yourself not with what you tried and failed in, but with what it is still possible for you to do."



For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord.
As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways
and my thoughts above your thoughts.

LIVE FOR THE LORD

Throughout the autumn, we focus on the **demands of discipleship** - what it means to commit ourselves to Christ with our mind, body, and spirit.

Baptized into Christ's life, we are called to live for the Lord, in all of the circumstances of daily life.



What does it mean to live for the Lord? Our Sunday readings this month give us insight into all we are called to be and to do, **to make Christ's mission our mission**, to make the Lord's presence more abundantly known in the world:

Love: The commandments...are summed up in this saying, namely, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself. (9/6)

Be Good: Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard other as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others. (9/27)

Forgive: "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times." (9/13)

Sacrifice: I urge you, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. (9/3)

Be Generous: Are you envious because I am generous? (9/20)

Be Merciful: The Lord is kind and merciful. (9/13)

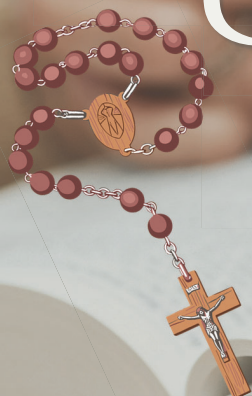

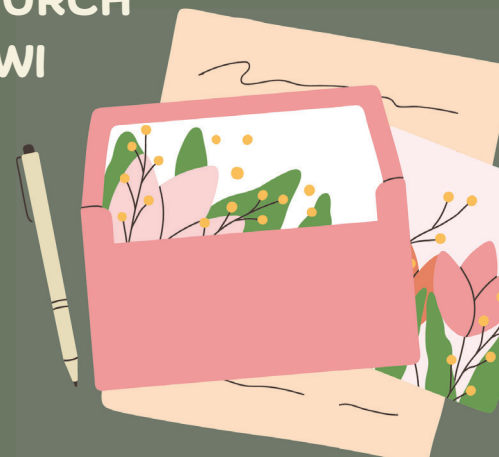
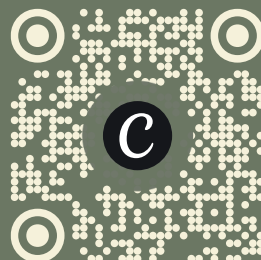

... Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always to be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope. (1 Peter 3:15)

Some of us are very familiar with the phrase, “To Know, Love and Serve Him” – words from The Baltimore Catechism in response to the question, “Why did God make you? Even though this question and response has been part of Catholic culture for 140 years – and things have changed so much -- it is still very relevant today.

How DO we know, love and serve God in this complicated world of ours? It’s not always easy. The Superior Catholics cluster of parishes has two learning opportunities for you.

The process of bringing adults into full communion with the Catholic Church is called the *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults*. Locally, OCIA is available to those who have a desire to learn about Catholicism. This process serves everyone - those with no faith-based experience to those fully Catholic desiring to learn more about the basics of their faith.

There are varying ways to participate in OCIA. First, there are weekly classes on Thursday evenings. Gathered together are individuals with a wide range of faith-based experiences. The sessions are led by a team of experienced Catholics. Each session examines scripture, portions of the Catechism, and topics designed to help navigate ordinary Catholic experiences.

Second, recognizing that life does not always allow for a weekly on-site commitment, arrangements can be made for individuals to independently study the materials with monthly visits with an OCIA team member.

Participation in OCIA is beneficial for people in many situations:

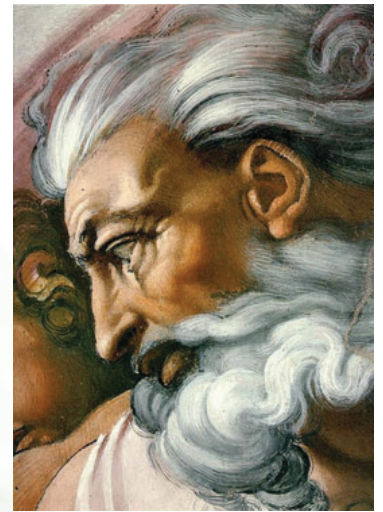
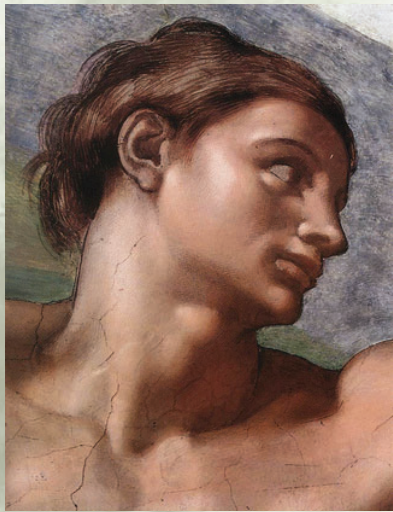
- Those with no faith-based experience.

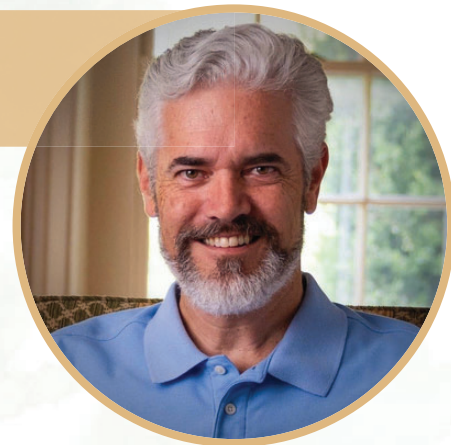

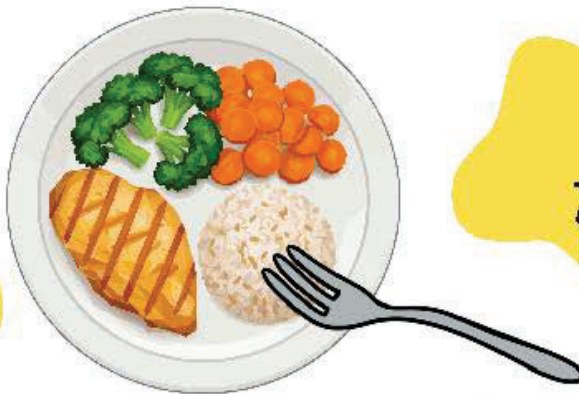

Anna Betancourt is a professional singer, songwriter, music director and workshop presenter. Based in Fort Worth, Texas, she previously worked in various bilingual communities as music director, choral director and cantor in the parishes of Southern

California. She has more than 35 years of experience working with various choirs including youth, children's, adult, contemporary, traditional choirs and handbells choirs.

Anna graduated from Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles, where she studied voice and music theory, and where she also worked as assistant director of liturgy and music. At the archdiocesan level, she has served as a music committee member, deanery representative and a member of the Los Angeles Religious Education Congress Liturgy Committee.

Anna's voice can be heard on more than 50 recordings, including some by Jaime Cortez, Bob Hurd and Eleazar Cortés. Her first solo collection, *Te Doy Gracias*, features 12 popular contemporary Spanish and bilingual songs. Her collection *Tomaré Mi Cruz* presents inspiring songs for liturgy, worship groups or retreats. Her music is also featured in OCP's *Novena a la Virgen de Guadalupe/Novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe* collection.

Anna has been a speaker and presenter at various conferences and workshops on music and liturgy. She is the former Spanish choir director at Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels in Los Angeles and Christ Cathedral in Orange County, California. She currently ministers with her husband, Deacon Mike Betancourt, at St. Mark Catholic Church in Argyle, Texas.



Dr. Glenn Byer was born and raised on a farm near Edmonton, Alberta, Canada. He has written widely on the liturgy, including an ongoing series of articles in *Today's Liturgy* on the link between the Catechism of the Catholic Church and

liturgical ministry and books on pastoral liturgical topics. He speaks widely on how to get more out of the liturgy.

His work in liturgy led to a post as professor of liturgy at Kenrick School of Theology in St. Louis, Missouri. He taught three years for the Paul VI Catechetical Institute, also in St. Louis. Glenn has served on the liturgy commissions of three archdioceses, Edmonton, Baltimore and St. Louis. He received a master's in liturgy from the University of Notre Dame in 1987 and a sacred liturgy doctorate (SLD) from Sant' Anselmo in Rome in 1994. Glenn currently works as OCP's worship publications manager.

He was recently awarded honorable mention for his book, [Unlocking the Feasts and Seasons of the Liturgical Year](#) and, in 2018, won first place for his book, [26 Ordinary Ways to Live the Liturgy](#), in the CPA (Catholic Press Association) Book Awards. Glenn is the co-author with Mary Jo Tully and Paulette McCoy of [The Catholic Catechist's Companion](#), with Msgr. William Belford and Michael R. Prendergast of [Parish Liturgy Basics](#) and with Michael R. Prendergast of [Hospitality Basics](#). In 2022, Glenn was elected to the executive of the North American Academy of Liturgy.
