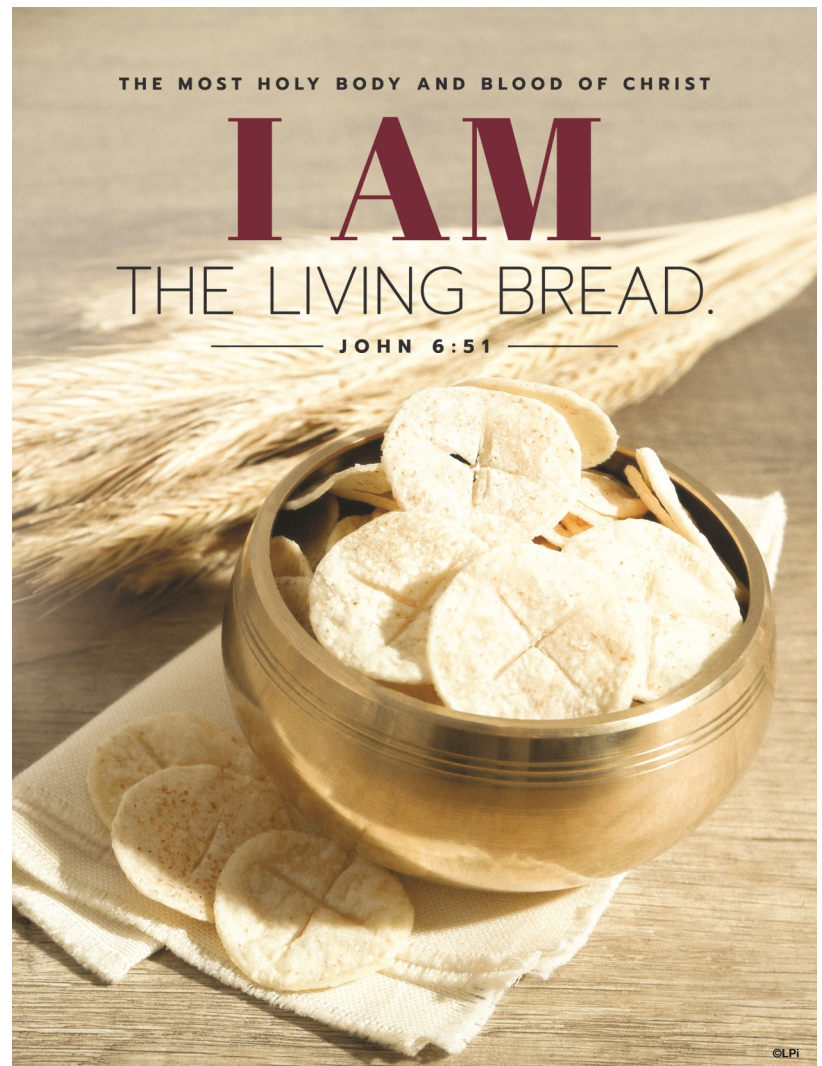

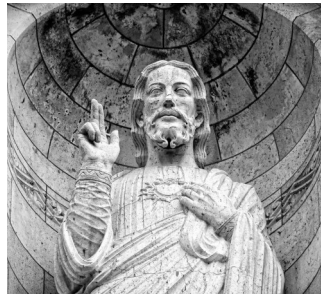

MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Every June, Catholics around the world turn their attention to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. But this is more than just a liturgical tradition or devotional custom—it’s an invitation. It’s an invitation into the very center of God’s love.

The Church dedicates the entire month of June to the Sacred Heart, not simply because of the feast that falls within it, but because this devotion touches the deepest longings of the human soul. It reminds us of a truth that is as eternal as it is personal: that God has a heart—and it burns with love for us.

A Devotion Forged in Fire

The image of the Sacred Heart is no passive symbol. It is aflame. It is pierced. It is crowned with thorns. It is open—wounded, yes, but never closed off.

Why would God permit such imagery to be tied to His Son?

Because He wants us to see love as it truly is: not a fleeting feeling, not a poetic sentiment, but a holy sacrifice. A gift poured out. A burning fire that consumes sin, fear, apathy—and leaves only what is pure.

This is the heart of Christ. And this is the heart that wants ours in return.

The Heartbeat of Salvation

From the pierced side of Christ flowed blood and water—symbols of the sacraments, the Church, the very life of grace. The Fathers of the Church saw in this moment the birth of the Bride of Christ: the Church born from the side of the New Adam, just as Eve was formed from the side of the first.

This is no accident. It is divine intention.

Just as the human heart pumps blood to every part of the body, sustaining and nourishing life, the Sacred Heart sustains the Body of Christ, giving grace to every soul willing to receive it.

A Devotion for These Times

The revelations to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the 17th century were not just for a king. They were for every age—and perhaps especially for our own.

CONSECRATION On **June 11, 2026**, as part of the celebration of the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the *U.S. bishops will consecrate the United States of America to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.* Parishes across the country are being encouraged to join the bishops in celebrating this consecration of our nation to the Sacred Heart, and all parishioners are invited to join the U.S. Church from **June 3-11** in praying a **Novena to the Sacred Heart.** (It’s okay to join anytime, even though it has already started.) In an age of cold hearts, Christ offers a heart that is warm. In a world quick to condemn, He offers mercy. In a time when promises are easily broken, He offers twelve promises sealed in His own blood.

The 12 Promises

In His revelations to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, Jesus made twelve extraordinary promises to all who would venerate His Sacred Heart.

He promised to grant all the graces necessary for one's state in life, to bring peace to families, and to offer consolation in troubles.

He vowed to be a refuge in life and especially at the hour of death, to bless every undertaking, and to let sinners find in His Heart an ocean of mercy.

Tepid souls would become fervent, and the fervent would quickly rise to great perfection.

He promised to bless every place where an image of His Heart is honored, to give priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts, and to write forever in His Heart the names of those who spread this devotion.

His final promise—perhaps the most tender—was that all who receive *Holy Communion on the first Fridays for nine consecutive months will receive the grace of final repentance*, dying in His grace and friendship, with His Sacred Heart as their secure refuge.

These promises are not just historical—they are living gifts from the Heart of Jesus to you and your family today.

How to Live Devotion to the Sacred Heart

This June, consider embracing the devotion more deeply.

You might:

- Begin the First Friday Devotion, receiving Communion on the first Friday of nine consecutive months.
- Spend a weekly Holy Hour, especially on Thursdays, in reparation to His Sacred Heart.
- Enthroned His image in your home, making Christ the King of your household.
- Pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart, a powerful and poetic way to reflect on the attributes of Jesus' love.

Altar Server Information

- 1) You need to have received First Communion to be an altar server.
- 2) Altar servers get a preference as to what Mass they would like to serve.
- 3) You will be part of a team who serves at the Mass you have chosen.
- 4) We will make sure that new altar servers are paired with an MC until they have a handle on it themselves.
- 5) Altar servers serve basically every other week.
- 6) Parents are sent schedules so you will always know when you are serving. The schedules will cover three months' time and switches can be made with other altar servers if there is a date conflict.
- 7) There will be a one-time training scheduled once everyone signs up.

St. Paul Parish will host a Town Hall meeting regarding Sacred Heart Church property in East Berlin.

- **Tuesday, June 23, 2026**
- 7:00 pm
- St. Paul Church Hall (downstairs)

This Town Hall meeting will allow parish leadership to receive input directly from concerned parishioners about the future of the Sacred Heart rectory, parking lot, and church. Discussion will cover the cost of maintaining the property, the possibility of selling the property, either in portion or as a whole, and other considerations.

The Sacred Heart property is currently utilized as the site for the bi-monthly FoodShare distribution. However, in August 2026, the FoodShare distribution will no longer be held at this location. The Sacred Heart Rectory and Church are currently used as meeting spaces for some of our ministries (Scripture Study, Children's Rosary, etc.), and occasional weddings or funerals are held in the church. There are currently no regularly scheduled Masses at Sacred Heart Church.

All parishioners are welcome to attend this meeting.

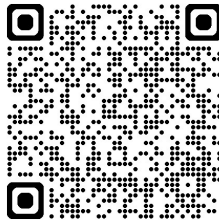

June Prayer Guide from the USCCB

Reflect Abortion is always a tragedy that takes the life of an innocent child and significantly wounds the mother. For decades, surgical procedures accounted for most abortions, but today abortion by pill (also known as “chemical abortion” or, by proponents, “medication abortion”) is the most common form in the U.S. In a “chemical abortion,” a pregnant woman typically takes two pills, mifepristone and misoprostol, a day or two apart, to kill and then expel a developing child from her womb. This form of abortion poses significant risks to the health and safety of women.

Despite these risks, chemical abortion is widespread. Since 2016, the FDA has disregarded women’s health by loosening safety standards, extending the limits of when mifepristone can be used, and decreasing the number of required doctor’s visits. More recently, the FDA has allowed abortion pills to be prescribed in virtual appointments and sold both at neighborhood pharmacies and online, enabling a nationwide mail-order abortion industry. These policies leave women vulnerable to suffering an abortion at home, alone, without any medical supervision. In addition to putting a woman’s health at risk, the actions taken by the FDA also increase the chances that women may be exploited by violent partners and human traffickers undetected.

There are currently three major federal lawsuits, led by states with pro-life laws, challenging the FDA and seeking to restore limitations on mifepristone or undo its availability altogether. On May 14, the Supreme Court allowed the abortion pill to remain available by video appointment and mail-order while at least one of the lawsuits proceeds. While this setback was disappointing, we pray that the states will ultimately prevail in protecting women and preborn children from the dangers of the abortion pill.
